he was headed toward The Main

that was the last I saw of him.

3. I then continued to walk  
down The Walkway toward  
Wilshire Blvd. and from somewhere  
near mid-point would say there  
were probably five other people in  
the walkway other than myself,  
all of whom were approaching me  
and heading in the opposite direction  
toward The Ambassador Hotel Building.  
I had not walked very far after I  
stopped briefly to look back at the  
"fumbling - jittered" man when I  
looked ahead of me and observed  
a very short dark young woman

walking rapidly up the walkway toward the Hotel. In fact one could say her manner of walking was determined, and I prepared to give the young lady all the room she needed. The walkway was almost clear, but I, deciding to be a gentleman, moved to the extreme right (my right) or East side and left the entire walk completely open for the young woman. But not too far from the walkway's mid-point toward Wilshire, the young woman for some reason decided to walk in my path and positively would have had collided into me had I not literally jumped out of her way toward the open walkway at the last instant when she

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was just about two feet from me. I could get nowhere by looking at her face and those eyes which were cold and mean, so I looked down at her feet to see which way she would move. I noticed that her shoes were either black or very dark blue, seemed dull in luster but not worn, appeared to be a soft leather-type and looked comfortable, and if they had heels, the heels were low. Positively recall seeing stitching on the shoes, especially some vertical stitching. As she "stormed" past me, she tended to step off the extreme edge of the walk and scuffed her left foot in the dirt at that point. Other than her bad manners and rudeness, she

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was well groomed, clean and not dressed badly at all.

I noticed That I forced over the young woman when she nearly collided with me. Since my height is 5'10  $\frac{1}{2}$ " and is somewhere around 5'11" with shoes, I would judge That she was approximately 5' tall and no taller than 5'3". Just before I moved out of her way, I noticed that her hair was dark and straight and seemed to be in a roll at her neck. Her hair was groomed much as hair which is worn down on the <sup>shoulders</sup> ~~shoulders~~. But in the case of the young woman her hair just was not that long.

As she approached me in the walkway I glanced at her eyes in order to

determine if she ~~had~~ saw me  
and noted that they were "hard"  
and literally "told" me to "get  
out of the way or be run over".

I also noticed that her nose  
seemed deformed. It appeared very  
narrow, cylindrical on her right  
side, twisted in an odd way and  
had a small bump in the middle  
usually attributed to Semitic  
people. She definitely was not  
Caucasian nor was she Jewish —  
that was obvious. Since I do not  
know what all Arabs generally look  
like, it would be difficult for  
~~me~~ to say flatly that this  
individual was an Arab although  
I am inclined to think  
that such is the case.

generally speaking; The young  
woman's face was not (pretty) or

beautiful and her figure was trim. The face did not seem to be balanced and the nose other than its distortion, seemed on the small side. She probably was in her early twenties, and I doubt that she weighed one hundred pounds; it would be more like a weight somewhere in the nineties. In some ways she tends to remind one of a little girl, an undisciplined, rude little girl at that.

The young woman was wearing a light colored dress and at least part of her arms were exposed. It is difficult to say whether or not the dress had the polka dots on it because I observed the young woman in the covered

walkway late in the afternoon and would not have recalled her at all if she had not been very unladylike and rude. And if the tragic events that followed later on with reference to the polka dot lady had not occurred, I would have completely forgotten that I had seen her at all. And in view of the fact that the light where I had seen the young woman described here was in the shadows, and I hardly ever pay any attention to the type and style of clothing that anybody wears, I am inclined to think that the woman I saw was the "polka-dot" lady in view of the other things I do recall.

I tend to recall her in relation to the "amblyop-eyed" man

I saw in the hallway first and have wondered if my stopping to look back at him triggered her kindness.

And then the "ambling-jaited" <sup>man</sup> ~~man~~ didn't mean anything in this until I mentioned the individual to my friend Gene Hagberg of 1147 Lillian Way, Hollywood California 90038, and he seemed to think there is a possibility that the man I <sup>saw</sup> is the same individual he noted in a report to your Office which he had referred to you (Officer T. J. Miller) earlier. Mr. Hagberg said the man <sup>man</sup> he had in mind was swarthy and waddled when he walked but otherwise his description and what I saw coincides. And as far as the man's way of walking is concerned, what I have called an "ambling-jait" could undoubtedly be called a waddle by someone else.

If one would wish to check my

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accuracy in making observations - at least in part - one might refer to L.A.P.D. Accident Report, DR #66-315641 by Officer M. A. De La Housaye and dated on 4-18-66. I had observed an accident in which I was very nearly involved on the Santa Monica Freeway on Saturday, April 2, 1966 and reported it to the first Officer I could find. Subsequently Officer De La Housaye contacted me, and I gave him the information over the telephone. The only information I forgot but recalled when Officer De La Housaye told me was the fact that a particular individual I had observed had a small beard. This was not the accident I referred to when getting my bearings as to the location of the Los Angeles Police Department Building in my telephone conversation with Officer T. J. Miller at 4:45 P.M., Monday, July 1, 1968; that was DR #66-330280, dated 6-28-66.

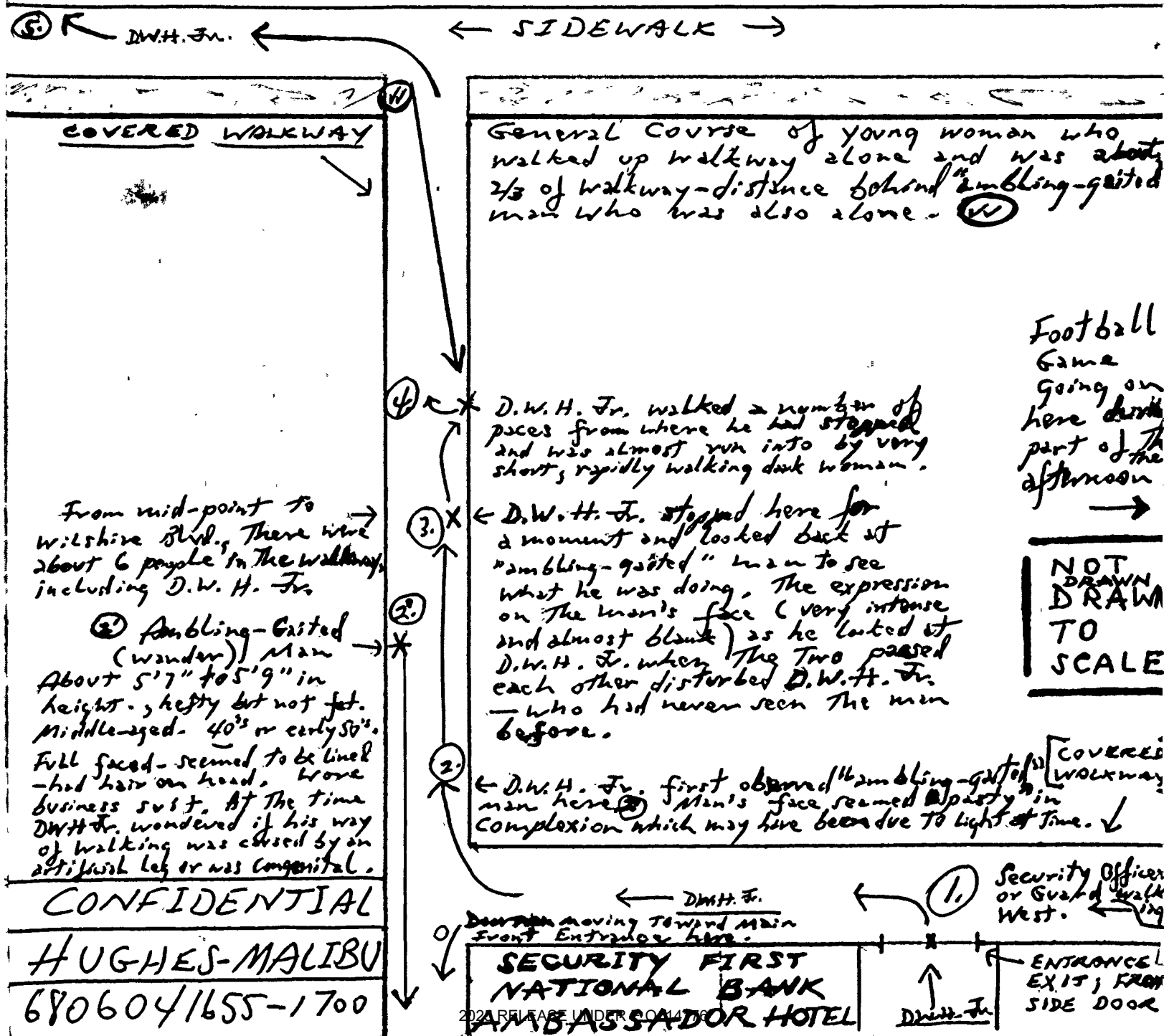
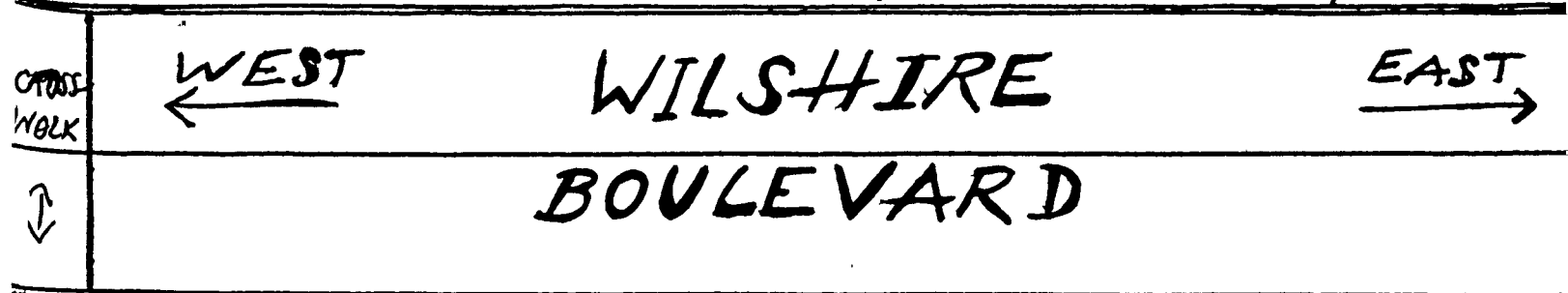

The writer received telephonic information from SA THOMAS PARRISH, Chicago Heights R.A. indicating he had received a telephone call from WILLIAM SHAW, former SA, and presently Director of Security, Argonne Laboratory regarding captioned matter.

SHAW advised on this date that information was received by his office from ART LINDENBAUM and Dr. (FNU) FEINSTEIN, both employed at Argonne Lab., Biological and Medical Research Unit approximately one year ago regarding an individual, also employed at Argonne, Biological and Medical Research Unit by the name of ARBAS JIBIL. JIBIL worked with above mentioned employees, approximately one year ago is a Jordanian and indicated to them that he was a member of a secret organization whose purpose was assassination or "doing away with" political figures and members of the church (?).

LINDENBAUM advised SHAW that JIBIL was ~~employed by~~ working for an unknown physician, under a grant, at Northwestern University during the fall of 1967. JIBIL supposedly was looking for another position during that time.

LINDENBAUM does not want to be contacted at his home, but can be contacted at Argonne Laboratory or tel. # 815 838-5171 on 6/6/68. FEINSTEIN can be reached at his home, tel. 968-2837, and to the best of SHAW's knowledge, resides in Downers Grove, Ill. He can also be contacted at Argonne Laboratory.

SHAW advised that records of JIBIL are available at his office and are available for review.

Dear Agent Warren:

In order to expedite matters and eliminate some duplication here in so far as my letter writing is concerned, I have reproduced a copy of the letter I wrote to Officer Miller of the Los Angeles Police Department on August 18, 1968, including copies of the letter's enclosures which you do not have, and am sending the material to you for your files under cover of this letter.

The enclosed copy of the article appearing in the July 1, 1968 issue of the Los Angeles Herald-Examiner, "A Question Of Cash", about the Southern California Evangelist (Minister), the suspect in the Senator Robert F. Kennedy assassination case and another young man raised some questions in my mind in regard to the old automobile, and its occupants, I had seen coasting down Kenmore Avenue last June fourth; and I stated them in the letter to Officer Miller. It also would be interesting to find out if the man, described by the Minister as "an older man who looked like the same nationality", walked with an "ambling gait" or "waddled" when he walked.

When I spoke to Officer Miller three weeks ago, I told him about an odd letter (message) that came in the mail recently. I had wanted to read it to him over the telephone and get his opinion then, but he was busy at the time and he asked me to send a copy to him along with the other material. I got involved in a lengthy description of the puzzling item in my letter to Officer Miller and would be repetitious to go through that part of the description again here, so please refer to the letter for this information too. I read the message to Dr. Fort and he thought you might be interested in its contents. I also asked Gene Hagberg his opinion about the message, and he seemed to think I had gotten on some screwball mailing list. Knowing that I had belonged to N.I.C.A.P. (National Investigations Committee On Aerial Phenomena which has its National Headquarters at 1536 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.), he made the suggestion that perhaps some over-zealous "philosophers", who have been attracted to its ranks, might have secured some mailing lists for their own use. Whatever the case though, I certainly do not blame N.I.C.A.P. in this instance, for it is a reputable organization. Mr. Hagberg also seemed to think that a follow-up letter, telling how avoid "DOOM!" along with a pitch for money, might arrive in the mail before too long. To date this has not happened. However he did not rule out the possibility that it could have come from a Red source, and considering the general tone of the message, I would not overlook that possibility either. And finally, when I saw that 1983 date on the fifth and sixth lines from the top of the page, I thought "shades of George Orwell" because it reminded me of his novel "Nineteen Eighty Four". Perhaps there is an implication here somewhere. Upon

glancing through the book at the Santa Monica Public Library yesterday, it appears to me that whatever the author of the message wished to convey it could well be keyed to the Novel in some way; for I noted some similarities between the message and certain passages in the book. The thought has also entered my mind in all this that maybe this is somebody's idea of a joke, perhaps someone is having some fun. But whatever the reason, I don't like messages of this sort, signed or unsigned.

I did not send Officer Miller the Peace Action Council flyer because there was no reason to do so but have included a copy in this letter for whatever it might be worth to you. Someone (a neighbor?) attached the original of the enclosed copy to the outside of the mailbox at our Malibu residence, probably during the evening of July 9, 1968. I got home at about 11:00 P.M. on the ninth and saw something on the mailbox then but didn't bother to investigate to find out what it was at the time. It was discovered to be the P.A.C. trash when we got the mail the next day.

Dear Officer Miller:

Here is the information I spoke about in our telephone conversation last Wednesday afternoon. You may keep all of the enclosures.

I corrected some of the sentences on pages 20, 27 and 28 of the July 2, 1968 Report I gave to you on July 3rd.; now these pages are easier to understand. I would appreciate it if you would incorporate the corrections into the Report. I wanted to get the information to you as quickly as possible last July and therefore just didn't bother to rewrite some of the awkward sentences at the time. The grammatical corrections did not change the facts; they are the same. And I have been able to get a reasonably good copy of the June 12, 1968 Issa letter which also is enclosed with the other material.

The enclosed article about the Southern California Evangelist that appeared in the Los Angeles Herald Examiner on July 1, 1968 raised my curiosity in regard to the incident concerning the automobile I observed being pushed North down Kennmore Avenue during the afternoon of June 4, 1968 ( See pages numbered 680702002 through 680702009 and 6806041500-1515 of the Report ). Although the description of the particular two young men in the article is very general, I have wondered if perhaps they were hitchhiking on June 3rd. due to a disabled automobile and also if the two young men picked up by the Minister were the same two I had seen with the old apparently disabled car the next day. I have underlined in red the information which might be pertinent here. The young man I saw seated in the pushed and coasting vehicle, although not in the best of light, looked very much like the newspaper photographs taken of the suspect shortly after the fatal shooting at the Ambassador Hotel on June 5th. And the impression I got of the young man I saw pushing the automobile tends to coincide with the Minister's observations.

I have tried to think of the make of the automobile I saw being pushed down Kennmore Avenue but can't pinpoint any particular name. Due to the poor condition of the car, probably because of age and use, I could only guess at its name. One characteristic I noted though was that it had that "boxy" (boxlike) look and seemed to be a standard size vehicle. I would venture to say that out of several possibilities it probably was a Chrysler Corporation automobile, an American Motors Corporation car ( an Ambassador model? ) or a Checker Motor Company vehicle ( such cars as used by the Checker Cab Company ) but the later would probably be too large an automobile in comparison to the one I saw on June 4th. I have a rather vague question in all this too; and that is, if the passengers of the automobile I

new coasting down Kenmore Avenue were in fact involved in the crime at the Hotel, would it be possible that the license plates, assigned to the apparently disabled vehicle, might have some association with or relationship to those license plates assigned to the suspect's car? It is somewhat of a far-out question but at least there are some known quantities here which might help zero in on the target and determine whether or not the automobile and the young men I had seen belong in the case.

And finally you will find a copy of the little bit of nonsense I mentioned that I had received in the mail on the 26th. or 27th. of July, probably on Saturday, July 27, 1968 along with the other enclosures. It is interesting and just seems to be some odd-ball mailing typical of these times. I am curious what you might think of the message ( esoteric? ) which was not signed and was mailed in an envelope without a return address. I don't associate this message with the subject-matter of my July 2, 1968 Report to your Office but do question its source and purpose anyway.

It appears as though the sender used an 8 $\frac{1}{2}$  x 11 inch sheet of writing paper in this little endeavor and apparently ripped it into thirds, for the message I received fits onto such a sheet of paper exactly three times. And the paper is rough along its length as though it was ripped along a straightedge. So perhaps the unsigned message printed in red was reproduced more than once and mailed to others. It appears to have been printed with a hand stamp and some of the letters seemed to have been used on a black ink pad at one time because a darker color has tended to bleed through at parts of the message giving an uneven red coloration to the total printed matter.

A copy of the envelope in which I received the "letter" is at the side of the message. I have never seen an envelope made in this fashion before; it is folded so that there is an appendage about two inches long on the inside at either end, and the flap sealing the envelope drops down evenly to about 40% of the vertical distance from the top and runs parallel to the top completely across its back or reverse side. Judging by its construction, it could have been made by hand from a single sheet of paper.

You will note that the exclamation point after the word "DOOM!", concluding the sentence at the third line from the bottom, is printed upside down. As far as I know the inverted exclamation point is placed at the beginning of an exclamatory sentence in Spanish and then the usual exclamation point is placed at the end of the sentence as in English. The interesting thing about this point is that it suggests the printer of the message might well have some knowledge of Spanish. Other than this observation concerning the message itself and the possibility it could be a veiled threat or the work of a crackpot or crackpot organization, your ideas as to its source and purpose --- beyond some thoughts I would state here --- are as good as mine.

What I have in mind is that, to the best of my knowledge, those people who are deeply enmeshed in the Communist conspiracy and are the front runners --- the "avant - garde" as I understand they prefer to call themselves --- use language in a different way ( esoteric ) in many instances, much as in the enclosed message, in order to conceal what they mean from just about everyone except their comrades in crime(s), and I would not overlook the possibility that they might

use this kind of language in an attempt to intimidate their enemies too.

I still recall enough of the features, including the general appearance, of the young woman I saw in the covered walkway at the Ambassador Hotel and believe this knowledge could be of value in helping a Police Artist develop any composite drawings of the young woman that might be ordered by the Police Department.

# Minister Tells Sirhan Plan to Buy His Horse

By JAMES D. WHITE

Associated Press Writer

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A Southern California evangelist says he almost sold a horse to the man accused of assassinating Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, and now is hiding out in fear of his life.

The Los Angeles police, who he says have his story, decline comment.

The Orange County Baptist minister, who does not want his name used and who will be called Jones, was interviewed at a hideout less than 100 miles from San Francisco.

Present were two of his long-time friends, Oakland private detective Ben Hardister and San Francisco criminal attorney George T. Davis. Both say they advised Jones to stay out of sight and are seeking protection for him and his family. He says he has had two threatening telephone calls.

Here is the gist of his long story:

He picked up two hitchhikers in Los Angeles on Monday, June 3, the day before the California Democratic primary which Kennedy won.

Jones says one of the youths

was Sirhan Beshara Sirhan, the Jordanian accused of killing Kennedy. The other was taller, but seemed to Jones to be the same nationality.

Since Jones is a horseman by avocation and buys and sells horses and Shetland ponies, they talked of horses.

Sirhan wanted to buy a pony to exercise race horses so he could get a job at a race track. Jones had one that suited, but Sirhan said he would not have the price, \$300, until late that night.

Sirhan asked to be let off near the Ambassador Hotel as a friend in the kitchen. That night, Sirhan produced a \$100 bill, but said he wouldn't have the rest until 8 a.m. Tuesday.

At that time, Sirhan did not show up. Instead there was an older man who looked like the same nationality and said, "Joe couldn't make it." He said Sirhan really wanted the horse and could pay for it Tuesday night at 11 p.m. if Jones would deliver it at the same spot near the Ambassador Hotel where Jones had let him out.

The Ambassador is where Kennedy was shot.

Jones said he was preaching out of town and couldn't make it. He gave the older man, whom he described as about 35 and expensively dressed, his business card with his unlisted telephone number.

On Wednesday, Jones did not hear that Kennedy had been shot until he was having lunch with friends. A picture of the still-unidentified suspect was flashed on a television show, and Jones said he recognized the youth who had wanted to buy the horse.

The next day, Thursday, he got the first threatening telephone call, he said. An unaccented voice he could not recall having heard before told him: "Keep your mouth shut about this horse deal if you know what's good for you."

Three days later the voice in another call reminded him he had been warned once before and repeated the profane threat to keep his mouth shut. He told police about the calls, and a picked Sirhan's picture out of 30 they showed him.

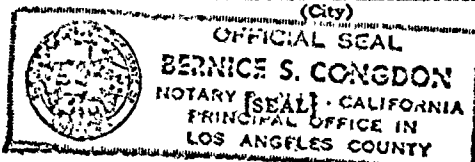
