SHERIFF RELEASES PHOTO OF SIRHAN JAIL CELL

In response to many requests for pictures of the custodial facilities in which Sirhan B. Sirhan, the accused assassin of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, is being detained, Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess today released a photograph of the Sirhan security facilities.

The left half of the photograph, under the numeral 2, depicts Sirhan's general living quarters. This portion of his "cell within a cell" is furnished with a permanent steel cot with mattress, porcelain wash basin and a polished metal mirror. To the right, beneath the number 1, is the portion of Sirhan's jail quarters which contain his necessary sanitary facilities. In the foreground, immediately behind the security bars is a corridor in which Sirhan is permitted to exercise daily. Both ends of this corridor are enclosed.

In commenting on the photograph, Pitchess stated: "The facilities in which Sirhan B. Sirhan is housed are typical of those facilities which are, or have been provided for any other inmate who constitutes an extreme security hazard."

INFORMATION: (WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY & HOW)

Witness is the job dispatcher for the Southern Calif. Waiters Alliance, Local 17, AFL-CIO. His job is to place union members where openings for waiters exist. Sometime during the later part of May witness recalled a man, who he described as a male Arab, 23/30, years of age, 5-5, slim medium build, dark hair, coming to his office and applying for a job.

He stated he recalled the individual specifically, in that the individual requested a job at the Ambassador Hotel. This individual's attitude, according to witness, was quite antagonistic, however, the person used no profanity. The individual requesting the job displayed an Israeli passport for identification. The applicant indicated he had been in this country for either one month or one year, witness did not recall which. He indicated he had been a waiter in Israel. The interview lasted between 7 and 10 minutes and took place about 1:00 a.m. The applicant stood during the entire interview. Witness indicated that no application was completed because the applicant did not belong to the union. Witness recalled that the applicant stated he had applied at the Ambassador Hotel for work and that someone at the hotel had referred him to the union.

Witness reported that this is not the hiring procedure. He elaborated on this remark by stating that a person comes to the union after he has obtained employment. This procedure is the one followed for people that do not belong to the union and obtained employment at a union business.

On the night prior to the shooting, 6-4-68, witness was watching TV and sometime around 11:00 p.m., he twice saw the suspect "ducking down" as he walked past TV cameras. Witness remembered commenting to his wife, "That's the guy that gave me the bad time when I didn't give him the job." Witness was not sure of the channel he was viewing but thought it was possibly 2 or 4.

Witness stated that sometime before Kennedy died and while Kennedy was still at Good Samaritan Hospital that he, witness contacted the FBI to report the above information. When he contacted the FBI he was given a telephone number and told to ask for a Mr. Thatcher. He called the number, which turned out to be Good Samaritan Hospital and did speak

with a Mr. Thatcher who identified himself as an FBI agent. The above information was related to Thatcher and nothing more came of it, according to witness. Between the 23rd and 27th, of September witness was interviewed by an unknown agent from the FBI. This agent showed witness a series of mug shots and witness recalled picking the photo of Sirhan B. Sirhan and stating that this was the same person he saw on TV and who applied for a job at the Ambassador.

Officers contacted agent La Jeunesse (Roger), Los Angeles Office of the FBI, and were informed by him that he knew nothing about an agent Thatcher. He was aware that the witness had been interviewed by a local FBI agent during the month of September.

In interviewing witness he stated that he could recall the suspect's voice and there was no accent.

The lack of accent does not appear reasonable in view of his statement that he has recently arrived in this country from Israel.

Witness stated that he did not encourage or request job applicants to complete an information card unless they were members of the union. Consequently no interview card was completed by the suspect.

The statements made by witness; to wit the suspect's displaying an Israeli passport for identification and secondly the suspect's statement that he had been in this country "for either a month or a year", are hard to resolve. Investigators have a copy of Sirhan B. Sirhan's passport. Sirhan is included on his mother's Jordanian passport #14026. To Investigators knowledge, Sirhan does not and did not possess an Israeli passport. The second discrepancy concerning the witness's statement regarding length of time that his "applicant" had been in the country in no way compares with the fact of Sirhan's time in this country. Sirhan entered the United States January 12, 1957 and there is no known evidence that he has left this country for any period of time since that date. For these reasons, Investigators cannot give credence to witness's statements.

On 9/26/68, Detective Sergeant MIKE NIELSEN, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), S.U.S. Unit, advised SA R. J. LA JEUNESSE that the above individuals are not listed in the files of the LAPD. According to NIELSEN this would indicate they were not interviewed by LAPD personnel.

In addition NIELSEN stated that the various members of the LAPD who will be called to testify are listed as follows:

Sergeant ALBERT J. LA VAREE, LAPD Scientific Investigation Division (SID), who is a police surveyor.

Lieutenant A. HOGUE, Rampart Patrol Division, responded to the shooting of Senator KENNEDY and took command during the early stages of the investigation at Good Samaritan Hospital.

Sergeant D. VARNEY, LAPD, S.U.S. Unit, conducted numerous interviews and investigations.

Lieutenant M. P. KING, LAPD, B.A.D., was present at SIRHAN's residence during search of the house; also recovered bullet at hospital removed from head wound of ELIZABETH EVANS.

Lieutenant A. HEGGE, Rampart Division Detectives, G-145 participated in various investigations in the early stages of this investigation.

C related she worked on the late Sen. KENNEDYS' campaign and worked out of the campaign headquarters on Wilshire Blvd. She said was in attendance at the Ambassador Hotel, the night of the KENNEDY shooting, but was not in the area of the actual shooting, but rather downstairs in the ballroom awaiting the Senators arrival there.

C said she understands the FBI had been attempting to identify the Jordanian who was standing on the podium taking pictures of him, just prior to his leaving for the kitchen area. C said she saw and recognized pictures of this man in the newspapers. He was the one standing there with all the cameras around his neck. C said she had met this man at an earlier campaign party, and he had introduced himself to her as ALI AHMAD. He mentioned he worked at Micro-dot, in South Pasadena.

C said she was relating the above for whatever it may be worth and if she needed to be re-contacted she could be reached at the above address. She was advised her call would be made a matter of record.

An FBI memorandum dated August 6, 1968 at Detroit, Michigan identified Abdeen Jabara, 1217 First National Building, Detroit as the attorney for captioned committee.

The current Detroit telephone directory lists Abdeen M. Jabara, Attorney, 1217 First National Building, telephone number 961-0430.

On September 4, 1968, Sergeant Stanley Kowalski, Intelligence Bureau, Detroit Police Department, advised that his records disclosed that Abdeen M. Jabara, born September 14, 1940, resides at 7433 East Jefferson and is engaged as an attorney at 1217 First National Building, Detroit. He is originally from Mancelona, Michigan and he is described as five feet eleven inches in height, 170 pounds, black hair, brown eyes. Kowalski stated he had no information to indicate that Jabara has been active in soliciting funds for captioned organization or for any other cause.

On September 5, 1968, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he had ascertained the following information concerning Jabara:

On September 16, 1968, a second confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he was introduced to Abdeen Jabara about a year ago and at that time Jabara told him that he was beginning to practice law in Detroit. Following this introduction to Jabara and shortly following the Israeli-Egyptian confrontation, this source received a letter from Jabara soliciting funds for the Ad Hoc Committee for Arab Relief. This source stated that he had no information to indicate that Jabara had been active in collecting funds for captioned committee or for other causes. This source also stated that he had no information concerning Jabara's family or his background other than the fact that Jabara was formerly a law clerk for Ernest Goodman, the attorney who had represented Communist Party officials in the past.

On September 20, 1968, a third source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Abdeen Jabara, born [REDACTED], [REDACTED], entered Wayne State University Law School in September, 1962 and obtained a Doctor of Laws Degree in June, 1965. He previously received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Michigan in June, 1962. This source stated that in April, 1967 Jabara registered as a post degree student at Wayne State University to take a course in French, but dropped out. At that time he resided at 7433 East Jefferson, Detroit, Michigan.

On September 4, 1968, Katherine Tracy, Supervisor, Merchants Credit Bureau, advised that her records disclosed that Abdeen M. Jabara, residing 7433 East Jefferson, Detroit, is employed as an attorney at 1217 First National Building. He formerly resided at 44560 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth, Michigan and he has Social Security Number [REDACTED]. Her records contained no derogatory data concerning Jabara.

On September 4, 1968, Dorothy Wall, Identification Bureau, Wayne County Sheriff's Office, and on September 5, 1968, Harold Guntzler, Bureau of Criminal Identification, Detroit Police Department, advised that records of their departments contained no information identifiable with Jabara.

On September 3, 1968, Yvonne Dean, Traffic Court Records, advised that her records disclosed that Abdeen M. Jabara, born [REDACTED], [REDACTED], 185 pounds, five feet eleven inches tall, had received 34 traffic citations during the period September 12, 1963 to February 7, 1967. Addresses for this individual are shown as 11655 Brownell, Plymouth, Michigan; 302 Maple, Mancelona; 44560 Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth, Michigan; 219 East Buena Vista, Highland Park, Michigan; 7433 East Jefferson, Detroit, Michigan.

Concerning the above-mentioned Ernest Goodman, on September 19, 1954, a fourth confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Ernest Goodman has been present at Communist Party activity meetings where at no one except a Communist would be admitted. This source further stated that "I cannot say that I know him (Goodman) to be a member and as a matter of fact he probably has never been an actual member of the Communist Party. I have no doubt Goodman is completely dedicated in principle to the ideals of the Communist Party and he is a sympathizer with the Soviet Government in Russia."

On 6/11/68, ANWAR MUSA SAYEGH, student at Pasadena City College, named two acquaintances of SIRHAN SIRHAN as IVAN (LNU) and JOE (LNU). IVAN (LNU) was identified as IVAN GARCIA, and has been interviewed. GARCIA, who stated he was a foreign national, refused to identify JOE (LNU), although a lengthy interrogation was conducted. He stated he felt it was an invasion of JOE's privacy, but agreed to tell JOE the FBI wanted to talk to him.

SA PAUL LINDSAY, Immigration and Naturalization Service, was advised of GARCIA's refusal. On 7/8/68, LINDSAY advised the writer that GARCIA had been admitted for permanent residence, and due to this classification, the INS did not believe they could effectively suggest or infer to GARCIA that his refusal might have a bearing on his citizenship in the future. LINDSAY said their records reflected GARCIA had been divorced by his wife for adultery, and was apparently paying child support for an illegitimate child. GARCIA's mother, ERNESTINA VALLADARES GARCIA, Alien # [REDACTED], is employed as a senior accountant for the Los Angeles Drug Company, 5001 Earle Street, Rosemead, California. IVAN de la CRUZ GARCIA holds Alien # [REDACTED], and his brother, SERGIO GARCIA, presently in the U.S. Air Force, holds Alien # [REDACTED].

On 7/28/68 Mr. ED GUTHMAN was contacted by the writer and advised that he had had no "crew" at the Ambassador the night of the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. Mr. GUTHMAN stated that he happened to be at the Ambassador Hotel the night of the assassination having dropped by, by himself, to congratulate the Senator on his California victory.

Mr. GUTHMAN advised he had not observed SIRHAN SIRHAN, observed no suspicious activity prior to the assassination and had no information which would be pertinent to the incident.

Mr. GUTHMAN advised that he knows of no PAUL FLEMMING associated with "Newsweek", magazine in Los Angeles, but stated this person possibly could be one CARL FLEMING, who has been a political reporter for "Newsweek".

Mr. GUTHMAN stated that he has no knowledge of the identity of correspondents associated with the "Los Angeles Examiner" who might have been at the Ambassador Hotel the night of the assassination.

On 10/4/68, SIRHAN B. SIRHAN appeared in Los Angeles County Superior Court before Judge RICHARD B. SCHAUER. SIRHAN was accompanied and represented by his attorney, RUSSELL PARSON. The people were represented by Chief Deputy District Attorney for Los Angeles County LYNN COMPTON and Deputy District Attorneys JOHN HOWARD and DAVID FITTS.

At the hearing, Judge SCHAUER formally appointed Judge HERBERT V. WALKER to be the presiding judge at the trial of SIRHAN which will take place in Department 107.

Judge SCHAUER advised that two motions are presently pending before the court; one a motion to suppress evidence obtained during the investigation and the second a motion for discovery, both of which were filed by PARSON in behalf of SIRHAN. These motions will be considered by the court at the next appearance for SIRHAN which has been scheduled for 9:00 A.M., 10/14/68.

The previously scheduled trial date of 11/1/68 is still in effect; however, PARSON suggested that a later trial date be considered by the court. He gave as his reasons: (1) The U. S. Supreme Court in previous decisions has suggested that, in some cases, a sequestered jury might have been considered; (2) The month of December 1968 encompasses the Christmas holidays with all of its activities and includes the New Years holidays.

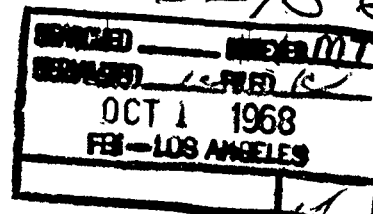

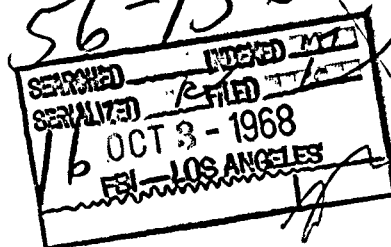
