With respect to the requests, Mr. HOLCOMB called Mr. WILLIAM WHITESETT, Senior Attorney in CBS Legal Department, CBS TV City, 7800 Eeverly Boulevard, Los Angeles, who requested SA WARREN be placed on the phone and in a three-way conversation Mr. WHITTSETT explained captioned policy which he said became effective following a top level CBS Executive Conference at CBS headquarters in New York City and was currently being applied to all CBS personnel. In effect it requires a subpoena be served by a government investigator to interview CBS personnel. Mr. WHITTSETT said he would be willing to appeal to CBS New York headquarters to rescind the policy on behalf of the FBI upon request of the FBI in the KENSALT inquiry. However, he voiced the opinion such an appeal might more effectively be made on a request by the FBI headquarters direct to CBS headquarters, New York City. He instructed Mr. HOLCOMB to make a copy of the CBS memo outlining the new policy available to SA WARREN for review but not furnish him a copy. In substance, contents of the memo were:

The memo dated 9/19/68 was from Mr. WOOD (ROBERT D. WOOD, President, Columbia Television Stations) (CTS) to Mr. BEINDORF (RAY L. BEINDORF, Vice President and General Manager, KNXT-Channel 2, Los Angeles), et al (other CBS-TV department heads on West Coast).

It mentioned CBS "experiencing many requests for news personnel to be sources of information as well as witnesses in civil and certain investigatory proceedings. You may consider the following an interim policy and how to fill such requests."

"CND (Columbia Network Division) -a number of requests have been received from government investigators to furnish names, and correspondence of news involved in coverage of events being investigated, e.g. recent violence in Chicago." In addition approval has been made directly to CND employees by government investigators, these pending and requiring urgent action. CND requested guidance as to how to handle these requests for names etc and how employees should be advised to respond directly to approaches by government investigators."

"Criteria:

- "A. Nature of Inquiry."
- "B. Whether, what is requested is essential to the establishment of facts pertinent to the inquiry."
- "C. Whether compliance would in any way impair our ability to obtain such news stories in the future."

"If a determination is made to comply with a request, the investigator will be asked to obtain and serve a subpoena."

The CBS personnel in all departments in the Los Angeles area have been most cooperative with the Los Angeles FBI Office during past investigation conducted at CBS and a cordial relationship currently exists.

RECOMMENDATION

The above is for the Bureau's information and appropriate action at CBS headquarters in New York to attempt to gain a recension of the CBS policy with respect to FBI interview of CBS personnel, advising the field offices accordingly.

On 10/4/68, DEAN was interviewed by SA NORMAN P. LE CLAIR at the Sacramento City Jail. DEAN identified the postcard as his handwriting, but had no recollection of sending it or of advising any police officers in Sacramento that he knew anything about any planned killing. He stated he knew nothing at all about the killing of Senator KENNEDY and that the postcard had nothing to do with the Senator's murder. He had no idea why he wrote the postcard, but noted he always writes to friendly PDs where he has previously been incarcerated.






