Legal owner is "Republic National Bank of California, 6320 San Vicento Blvd., LA L/O".

Unsub has been identified as having recently frequented Playfair Racecourse in Spokane, and there he cashed a \$50 counter check drawn on the Spokane account he opened. 

Mr. Deriek Chase, Radio Station CFRA, Ottawa, Canada, on 10/14/68 advised that the captioned individual, a retired United States Post Office employee, has alleged that she has been denied proper hospital treatment while in Canada because of undue influence and pressure from American authorities.

According to Mr. Chase, Mrs. Fogel states that although she has been admitted to Canadian hospitals for medical treatment which she desperately needs she is very soon forced from those hospitals because of United States pressure possibly from the FBI, CIA or other such agency. Mrs. Fogel apparently claims she has vital information concerning certain investigations of criminal activity in the United States including the case of Sirhan Sirhan, the alleged murderer of Robert F. Kennedy, and that she is being denied proper treatment in order to keep her quiet concerning such matters.

Mr. Chase was advised that certainly the FBI was not involved in any investigative activity in Canada and would certainly not deprive a person from proper hospital care He stated that he fully understood that this would be true. Bureau files show that Mrs. Fogel is an obvious mental case, a self-admitted homosexual, has claimed to have applied for and been refused political asylum in Israel, Canada, and Australia and has made numerous unfounded allegations against various Government agencies and individuals. On 10/14/68, Lt. JOSEPH BARRY, Pawtucket, R.I. P.D. advised confidentially that NORMAN JACQUES, Rhode Island State Senator for Pawtucket, R.I. has been active in politics during the past few years. He stated that he unsuccessfully ran for a congressional seat and has bucked the Democratic Party in Pawtucket, Rhode Island. He stated that JACQUES has been suspected of being infolved illicit activities with regards to young children. He stated that JACQUES does not have a job but seems to gain his living by association with "odd balls".

Lieutenant BARRY stated that JACQUES in his opinion is a publicity hound who would do anything to get his name in the newspapers and in front of the public eye.

HARRY MC KANNA, News Director, WEAN Radio Station, Providence, Rhode Island, advised on 10/16/68, that JOHN V. KENNY, a senior at Providence College was working for his station on a part time basis and was an eye witness to the shooting of Senator KENNEDY in Los Angeles, California. Mr. MC KENNA advised that KENNY took photographs at the scene but the photographs were poor quality.

Mr. MC KENNA related that KENNY gave an interview with him for radio which was taped several days at the

shooting.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

On August 21, 1968, a confidential source abroad advised that he had verified that ANTONIO ALBIZO ORTIZ is known at Avenida Emilio Carranza 87, Mexico 13, DF. said he learned from individuals at this address that ALBIZO is a Mexican of humble origin and, apparently, limited talents who is the leader of the members of the Federacion de Organizaciones Populares (FOP) in the 16th Electoral District. In this work, he deals with those who need some social service and participation in conferences which are given to aid the members regarding problems of their work, health, education, and welfare. The source learned that meetings of this type are held twice a week at this address. The source was not able to determine the exact residence of ANTONIO ALBIZO ORTIZ, and the persons interviewed stated that they had not noticed anything obviously lacking in his mental faculties.

On September 27, 1968, a second confidential source abroad advised that he had speken with more than twenty individuals concerning ANTONIO ALBIZO ORTIZ and had learned that he is also known as ANTONIO ARBIZU ORTIZ. He is single and those interviewed agreed that he is about thirty-two years old but has some gray hair.


The second source found the offices of the FOP of the Federal District at Lucerna 55, Colonia Juarez, Mexico, DF. Another organization at this same address is La Confederacion Nacional de Organizaciones Populares (CNOP) which operates on a nationwide basis. The head of CNOP, Lic. JIMENEZ DEL PRADO, stated that he did not know ANTONIO ALBIZO.

The top official of FOP, Prof. CARLOS ALEMAN, stated that he did not know ALBIZO.

More than twelve employees were questioned in the FOP office and, finally, one of them said that he did know ALBIZO but that ALBIZO was not one of the office personnel and not a regular employee but was one of the many thousands who work at infrequent intervals for this organization.

The second source conducted inquiry in the neighborhood of Avenida Emilio Carranza 87. Mexico 13. DF, and determined that ALBIZO works two days each week for a Mr. SANCHEZ who maintains an office at this address and lives at Emilio Carranza 91. The source stated that SANCHEZ is in the business of handling land sales and that the office is very unkempt. It has a crude, unpainted, wooden table for a desk and benches of unpainted wood where working people wait while trying to buy land.

Both SANCHEZ and his daughter stated that they did not know the address of ALBIZO and described him as a Bohemian who has no fixed residence and stays part of the time in the thome of one friend and other times with other friends. They said he is a personable young man who is trustworthy and a good worker but that he has ideas which are somewhat strange. They said he has the habit of always telling things which originate in his own fantasy and they consider him a little unbalanced mentally but not to the extent that he would be harmful to others. They said it is exactly because of the fantastic tales which he relates and invents that he is useful to SANCHEZ in the business because he can easily convince people of limited education that they ought to try to buy lands which are actually not completely free of other claims. The source pointed out that the newspapers are full of stories of people who have been victimized by buying lands fraudulently offered for sale

and that these sales are not handled in an official manner before a notary public but only carried out by private agreements.

The second source spoke with workers in a shoe repair shop which is next door to Emilio Carranza 91, and these people also stated that AIBIZO is a very likable person but "half crazy," although he represents no danger to others. The source stated that each and every person who knows ALBIZO in this neighborhood spoke about him in the same manner.

The records of the Judicial Police for the Federal District and Territories, Mexico City, contained the following information:

ANTONIO ALBIZO ORTIZ, Avenida Rio Churubusco 19, San Andres Tetepilco, Mexico, DF, was arrested on February 27, 1960, for malicious damage and was assigned to the 12th Ministerio Publico under Act 39305/60. The only descriptive information in the record indicated he was a Mexican residing at the above address. On March 1, 1960, ALBIZO was referred to the Judge of the 14th Instance, 5th Section, and was released subject to further proceedings. No indication of further action appeared in the file.

On August 30, 1968, a check of the records of the Identification Section of the Metropolitan Police, Mexico City, revealed the following information:

ANTONIO ALBIZO ORTIZ, Avenida Churubusco 19-13, Colonia San Andres Tetepilco, Mexico, DF, was fingerprinted on September 8, 1958, in connection with a license to work for the Mexican Streetcar Service. At that time ALBIZO was twenty-five years old, single, a janitor. He was born in the state of Jalisco, Mexico, no birth date set forth.

Re investigation concerning JOHN WRIGHT, where name appears on serials 56-156- X4 pages 1010 through 1015, and whose name also appears on serials 56-156-716, 1035, 1343, 1376, 1456 and 1791. The following is a summary of the above serials.

Miss CAROLINE MARY PET INATO appeared at the Ambassador Hotel on 6/10/68, and related a story told to her by JOHN WRIGHT, in which WRIGHT stated that he was a witness to the shooting of Senator KENNEDY, and that STRHAN STRHAN did not pull the trigger. PELLINATO also stated that WRIGHT told her that he was working as a kitchen referrer in the hotel at the time of the shooting. She said he gave his full name as JOHN DAVIS WRIGHT, his date of birth as 7/30/30, and place of birth as Stillwater, Oklahoma, and that he was a Negro male. She advised that he had lived at the Milner Hotel in Los Angeles, but that he told her he was leaving Los Angeles on 6/10/68, for Pensacola, Florida. She said he was about 5 feet, 6 inches tall. He told her that he had related his story to the police.

On 6/13/68, a review of the personnel files at the Ambassador Hotel reflected that no JOHN WRIGHT had worked at the hotel for at least the past 7 years. A JACK WRIGHT worked at the hotel in 1962 and has not worked there since. He gave his address as 715 South Hope Street, Los Angeles. He was a male born on 7/10/20, and he said the person to notify in case of emergency was Mrs. K. WATTS, c/o Post Office Box 184, Mc Veish, Kentucky.

Knowlegedable employees at the Ambassador Hotel advised that there was no such position as a kitchen reporter, and that no JOHN WRIGHT had been employed in the kitchen in the recent past.

The Los Angeles Police Department advised that they had interviewed no JOHN WRIGHT in connection with this case.

On 6/24/68, WINERED HOLDER, desk clerk at the Hope Hotel, 735 South Hope Street, Los Angeles, advised that WRIGHT had related basically the same story to him as he had to Miss PETTINATO. WRIGHT stayed at the Hope Hotel during November and December of 1967. WRIGHT's registration card gave his name as JOHN DAVID WRIGHT and his former address at 715 South Hope Street. Los Angeles.

On 6/24/68 ROLAND TARDIFF, YMCA Manager, 715 South Hope, advised that a JOHN WRIGHT had resided there in September of 1967. His date of birth was 3/11/32, and his address was 631 Freeman, Kansas City, Kansas. His employer was General Motors, and his relative was LAURA WRIGHT, 631 Freeman, Kansas City.

On 6/24/68, R. L. NICKINS, Milner Highland Hotel Manager, 8135 South Flower, Los Angeles, advised that JOHN D. WRIGHT stayed at his hotel from 12/29/67, to 6/10/68. WRIGHT never mentioned the shooting of Senator KENNEDY to him. When WRIGHT left he said he was going to Pensacola, Florida. WRIGHT listed his former address as 735 Hope Street.

The Kansas City Division advised that JOHN and LAURA WRIGHT had lived at 631 Freeman in Kansas City in 1954, for about 6 months and then had moved leaving no forwarding address. Record checks in Kansas City on JOHN WRIGHT were negative. General Motors in Kansas City had no record on WIRGHT.

The Louisville Division advised that Mrs. KATIE WATTS of Mc Veigh, Kentuckt, was mentally unstable and not available for interview. A niece of JOHN WRIGHT stated no one had heard of him in over 10 years. Recordschecks on JOHN WRIGHT in the Mc Veigh area were negative.

As of 9/19/68, the files of the Los Angeles Police Department, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office, and Retail Merchants Credit Association contained no information identifiable with JOHN WRIGHT. An FD-9 has been submitted on WEGGHT.

Recommend that investigation to locate WRIGHT be terminated inasmuch as none of his story can be corroborated and since all logical investigation to determine his whereabouts has been conducted.



On 10/21/68, Special Agent in Charge ROBERT GRUBE, U. S.
