## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date 10/11/68

MELVIN V. FERGUSON was interviewed at his residence, 2410 Mountain View Street. He advised that he is also known as BUD.

FERGUSON purchased a 1968 Pontiac Bonneville two-door hardtop during the first part of 1968. He pointed out this vehicle parked on the driveway of his residence. The vehicle is white over turquoise and bears California license WHU 991.

Mr. FERGUSON stated that this vehicle has never been in the city of San Francisco and that he has never allowed anyone to borrow the car, even for a short period of time. Mr. FERGUSON stated that his wife has driven the car on short local trips such as to the grocery store, but that she has never driven the car out of the city of Concord.

FERGUSON stated that he is a heavy equipment operator and that during the past summer he worked for Piombo Construction Company of San Carlos, California. His job was driving a large "cat" in a dirt moving job on a golf course by two small lakes west of San Mateo College. His job foreman was RED HARRIS.

When asked of his whereabouts on June 29, 1968, FERGUSON advised that on June 17, 1968, while working on a car in a parking space located at 1115 Virginia Court, Concord, where he formerly resided, the car fell from a bumper jack and crushed his chest. FERGUSON was off work from that date until July 15, 1968, under the care of Dr. MARTINO and Dr. ELDREDGE, both of Concord. He said that he was not allowed to drive a car during this time and, in fact, was not capable of operating a car due to extensive damage to his right shoulder, rib cage, and lung as a result of the accident.

FERGUSON stated that the name of JERRY OWEN is not familiar to him and that he does not know a Mr. HARDESTER. He has never intentionally tried to run any person off of any road and that he has not been involved in any "near accidents" recently in which anyone might gain the impression that he was trying to "run them off the road". SUBJECT: KENSALT

On 10/22/68, SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN appeared in Department 107 of the Los Angeles County Superior Court before Superior Court Judge HERBERT V. WALKER. SIRHAN was represented by his attorney, RUSSELL PARSONS. The prosecution was represented by Chief Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorney LYNN COMPTON and Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorneys JOHN HOWARD and DAVID FITTS. The purpose of that appearance was for the court to rule on evidence obtained at the SIRHAN residence in Pasadena, California, following the assassination of the late ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

Sergeants ~~WILLIAM BRANDT~~ and ~~DANTE A. LODOLLO~~ of the Los Angeles Police Department testified as prosecution witnesses relative to the search of the SIRHAN residence. During their testimony they testified that a search of the residence was permitted by SIRHAN's brother, ADELL SIRHAN. During the proceedings it was brought out that the residence is actually being purchased by SIRHAN's mother, MARY SIRHAN.

~~ADELL SIRHAN~~ and ~~MARY SIRHAN~~ testified as defense witnesses before the court as did another brother, ~~MUNIR SIRHAN~~. MARY SIRHAN testified that the residence at ~~896~~ East Howard Street is her home and that she has a deed in her name showing ownership. She further testified that in June 1968 the residence was occupied by herself and her three sons, ADELL, MUNIR, and SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. She testified that at the time the search of her residence was conducted she was at work at the Westminster Nursing School in Pasadena. She further testified that she was not aware that a search of her residence had taken place; that she had never given permission to any one to search her

residence and was never asked for permission to have her residence searched.

On completion of the hearing Judge WALKER denied the motion of the Defense Council for the suppression of the evidence obtained in the search.

Enclosed herewith are six negatives obtained from JOHN V. KENNY, a Providence College student, who was in the Embassy Room of the Ambassador Hotel at Los Angeles, California, and who was in his own words approximately twenty-five feet from the location where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was shot on 6/4/68.

Mr. KENNY advised that he had in his possession a camera which he held over his head and continued to snap pictures of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY as he passed through the kitchen corridor immediately prior to the shooting.

Mr. KENNY stated that the pictures taken in the corridor apparently were not clear enough to be developed, but he did have them in his possession when interviewed on October 17, 1968.

Mr. KENNY stated that he believed that the negatives number 18A through 20A were the shots taken by him immediately prior to the shooting of Senator KENNEDY.

JOHN V. KENNY, a Political Science Major, and presently residing at 249 Rankin Avenue, Providence, Rhode Island, while he is attending Providence College, in Providence, Rhode Island, advised that on June 4, 1968, he was present in the Embassy Room of the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, California, where he heard and observed Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY deliver an address to his campaign forces.

He stated that at that time he was not employed by the Radio Station, WEAN, Providence, Rhode Island, but was subsequently employed when he contacted an individual by the name of HARRY MC KENNA, News Director, for the Radio Station WEAN.

Mr. KENNY stated that he was on the stage when Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY addressed his campaign forces, and took several pictures of the KENNEDY entourage as well as a number of individuals in the audience.

He stated that he took several pictures of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, as he was speaking at the podium.

He stated that after Senator KENNEDY spoke he walked to his right, on the stage, and then turned around and proceeded to the rear of the stage and jumped off the stage and proceeded into an area, which he now knows as the kitchen corridor area.

He stated that he with his camera continued to follow after Senator KENNEDY and continued to take pictures of him proceeding through the kitchen corridor door, which is located to the rear of the Embassy Room.

He stated that he held his camera over his head and took a number of shots.

He stated that when he entered the small corridor of the room he heard a loud explosion and then observed the individual, now known to him as SIRHAN B. SIRHAN, being held by a very large Negro male, who he now knows as ROSEVELT GRIER.

He stated that a union official who was shot in the corridor, and who was previously standing on the stage, next to Senator KENNEDY as he addressed the crowd fell down in front of him.

KENNY stated that to the best of his knowledge and recollection he did not see SIRHAN B. SIRHAN prior to the time that he saw him being subdued by ROSEVELT GRIER.

KENNY pointed out that as he trailed behind Senator KENNEDY, who was departing through the kitchen corridor, he extended his hands over his head and with his camera attempted to take photographs in the kitchen corridor.

He stated that he had submitted the photos for development, but they were returned with a notation that they were not good enough for printing.

Mr. KENNY stated that upon his return to Providence, Rhode Island, he was interviewed by HARRY MC KENNA, News Director of Radio Station WEAN, Providence, Rhode Island, and stated that he kept a tape of the interview with MC KENNA.

In addition to the names of individuals, there also appears the names and addresses of various business establishments, the names and business establishments have been previously set forth in referenced memo.

With respect to ~~MYLEEN KAYE~~, Los Angeles Police Department records reflect she is also known as Eileen Murphy, a former belly dancer; ex-employee of the FEZ Restaurant, and at one time, girl friend of ADEL SIRHAN.

With respect to the name of ~~SOPHIE BONNESAR~~, there is no reference in the files of the Los Angeles Police Department. There is, however, a reference to one ~~DAVID BONNESAR~~ of 276 Twickenham Avenue, Los Angeles. Interview of that individual by members of the Los Angeles Police Department reflects he admitted having met ADEL SIRHAN approximately seven years ago; has been a business associate of ADEL; was of somewhat acquainted with SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN when he was employed at the race track, and last saw SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN during the later part of April 1968

With respect to ~~ISAAC BOUHADANA~~ of 539 East Hazel, Inglewood, California, Los Angeles Police Department files indicate he was contacted and stated he knows no one in the Pasadena area.

~~ROBERT C. GARNETT~~ is likewise mentioned in the list of toll telephone calls. His address is indicated to be 12421 Rush Street, El Monte, California. Los Angeles Police Department files reflect he was interviewed by Agents of the FBI, as reflected in the report of Special Agent AMEDEE O. RICHARDS, JR., dated 7/1/68, at Los Angeles, page 553. He has also been interviewed by the Los Angeles Police Department under interview number I 3227.

~~ABRAHAM J. TAWIL~~, 530 North Lucerne Boulevard, also appeared on the list of toll telephone calls made from the SIRHAN residence. Investigation by the Los Angeles Police Department reflects he was interviewed (Interview Number I 2187). Investigation reflects he was the victim of neighborhood complaints, and does not know anyone in the SIRHAN family.

MARTIN~~ advised that MARTIN, a former Ambassador to the Dominican Republic, is actively participating in HUMPHREY's election campaign. She said ~~LAWRENCE O'BRIEN~~ would know how to reach MARTIN, as would HUMPHREY's secretary or chief aide traveling with him. EBERLEIN said MARTIN was in the Ambassador Hotel at the time of KENNEDY's shooting. He had conferred briefly with the Senator about comments he would include in his address in the ballroom. KENNEDY left for the ballroom while MARTIN remained behind. He left the suite to get a smoke in the hallway and had intended observing KENNEDY's speech on TV. 1. How do you justify taking one land from one people (Palestinians) and giving it to another (Zionist Jews)?

3. How do you justify the Zionists Jews coming from other countries and taking the place of the real owners (Palestinians) who have fled to different parts of the world from Zionists terrorism and aggression?
4. How do you justify the killing and murders that take place and are still taking place in Palestine?
5. How do you justify giving and supporting the Zionists state with military aid as phantom jets so that they kill more innocent and peaceful people (Palestinians)?
6. How would you like someone forcing you out of your house and throwing you in the backyard and giving it to someone else that is not the owner?
7. How would like someone to strip you from your country and consider you as a second class citizen after you were a first class citizen? This is what happened in Palestine.

Palestine belongs to Palestinians just as America belongs to the Americans whether you like it or not (it depends on your conscience whether you believe in justice or not). We as Palestinians are ready to die for our beloved country (Palestine) and the only peaceful solution for our people is that Palestinians should go back to their homes and the Zionist Jews should go back to their original countries where they come from. If the Zionist Jews come from paradise, let them go back to paradise and if they come from hell let them go back to hell and the Palestinian Refugees should go back to their homes and land.

I am not a communist and I hate communism. You know and it is very clear that there is no communist practices or organizations in the Arab World. If there is communism in the Arab World, they were forced to accept and ask for help from Russia in order to liberate Palestine from Zionism because the United States has turned against them and if there is communism in the Middle East, American politicians are to blame because they are using good hearted American people for their own glory and fame. It is a shame to mention this but it is the truth. American politicians should look for America's greatness, fame and glory and not for themselves. It is also a shame to see American Presidential candidates bow and kneel to Zionism to get in the White House.

Communism is using new techniques in modern warfare which is (kill yourselves) as for example what happened in Viet Nam where American soldiers were killed and not one Russian soldier's blood was shed.

Zionism is using America and taking advantage by claiming that America should fight communism for their aim which is the destruction not only for America but for the whole world. For example, the killings, murdering, and robbing and inhuman barbarian and animalistic and criminalistic acts and behavior that they committed against the innocent peace-loving Palestinians is illegal. Also, Zionism in America is blurring the vision of good hearted Americans so that they cannot see black from white and keeping them away from the truth. The disorder and violence, crime, hunger in America is caused by Zionism through their propaganda and by sending millions of American dollars to the Zionist State. I wonder how they can be loyal to two countries, America and Israel? Is America their country or the Zionist State which is called Israel?

I not only love America but I am ready to die for America. I hate to see America being used by Communism and Zionism. Communism is destroying America on the outside, and Zionism is destroying America on the inside.

I have asked these questions to Senator Robert Kennedy in May 1968 but he ignored us and went on promising the Zionists with jets so that he gets more votes to get to the White House, here I find myself asking the same questions to you again. Please do not force us to believe in political assassination which is against our heritage and culture unless we are pressed from you. Let it be clearly known that I have ordered and directed by Palestinian Commandos to destroy every American politician who supports or negotiates any kind of help to the Zionist State. We are aware of Dayan's visit to the United States in December 1968. This will be his last visit.

I further more beg and ask again and again please do not make us believe in political assassinations. and as I mentioned above, I am willing to die for America as for Palestine. I hate to see America destroyed by Zionism and Communism. We think in America that we are above Communism and Zionism. The truth is not that, but we are lost in between.

We thank you for giving this matter the greatest consideration hoping that you will be against the aggressors (Zionists) for the sake of justice and the world peace, thank you.

On 10/28/68, representatives of Secret Service Headquarters furnished a copy of a communication addressed to Richard Nixon and Hubert Humphrey, National Headquarters, Willard Hotel, Washington, D. C. This communication was allegedly signed by Sharif Bishara Sirhan and was postmarked Pasadena, California, October 22, 1968. The return address was given as Sharif B. Sirhan, 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California, and the envelope was addressed to Nixon.

Copies of the attached are forwarded for the information and assistance of Los Angeles. An effort is being made through Bureau liaison to obtain the original or a more detailed copy. The Laboratory is conducting examination of the signature in order to determine if it was, in fact, that of Sharif Bishara Sirhan.

Inasmuch as the communication may constitute a possible violation of the Extortion Statute Los Angeles should initiate immediate investigation in order to determine whether it was in fact prepared by Sharif Sirhan. Consideration should be given to conducting an immediate interview of the suspect.

Expedite and advise Bureau of results.

Here is some information I feel you may be interested in and I wish to report it in the hope it will be of value to you, but also hope you will not make my name public.

On the evening of Sunday June 2nd 1968 my niece, <sup>her</sup> husband and children from Illinois came to visit me on their vacation.

On Monday the next day, June 3rd, they felt too tired from their trip to do much sight seeing around Atlanta, but suggested they would like to go to the airport in the evening to see the Jets come in and take off; a past time enjoyed by many people.

That evening of June 3rd when we walked into the main upper lobby of the airport building about 7 PM Atlanta time, we heard a loud voice coming over the airport loud speaker calling Cerrano - Cerrano. It was repeated several times asking the party to come to one of the ticket counters. My friend who lives with me looked at me and I at her both thinking what an odd name with both first and last names the same.

We went immediately to the observation platform and enjoyed seeing the children enjoying the sights. As I was seated on one of the benches 3 men pushed by me rather rudely, so I took special notice of them. One, a thin slender, blonde about 5ft 5 inches long thin face with very light complexion. A second man short about 5 ft, round face dark hair but looked american, and a taller man about 5ft 9- thin, dark brown hair and dark skin who looked foreign to me. Their countenances looked evil to me and they seemed to be in a hurry. I jumped up from the bench to find the children not knowing what 3 men were up to. Then I saw them enter (the 3 men) the inner glassed in portion of the observation platform and pointing towards the Eastern air lines planes. The thought crossed my mind and I wondered whether they were plotting to hi-jack a plane. Then they disappeared.

About ten minutes to 9 PM we left the platform going back thru the main lobby to the parking lot to get our car. Again when we entered the lobby we still heard the name Cerrano Cerrano being called and repeated several times. I kept wondering to myself what was the significance of that name.

The next morning Tuesday June 4th when we heard that Robert Kennedy had been shot by a man whose name was SIRHAN SIRHAN, I still could not shake off the feeling of the night before. Then when a clear picture of Sirhan was shown on the news on TV I saw that of one of the 3 men seen at the airport evening.

Perhaps I should have reported this before but I am one who does not want to get myself involved either and tried to forget it. But this morning when reading the Atlanta Constitution page 7 an account of Earl Ray (Kings murderer) telling a news man about a Blonde Latin man who had made different kinds of arrangements

for him, I thought could this be the same blonde man I saw at the airport and a part of some type of conspiracy? It is since reading this mornings paper that I felt urged very strongly to report what I had heard and seen at the airport on the night of June 3rd 1968.

I shall be glad to discuss this with you but believe I have given all the important details. I would appreciate very much also that you not give me any publicity in this matter. I am not easily scared and have no fear from the wrong element. I have reported things before to the FBI here in Atlanta and respect your good judgment.

SUBJECT: Agustin CORREA Rafael

1. An official Spanish service informed this office in a report dated 24 September 1968 that it had taken a statement from Spanish national Agustin CORREA Rafael, DPOB: 2 August 1947, Herrera de Alcantara, (Caceres), Spain, after he had been arrested on 20 June 1968 by the Civil Guard for driving without a license. He had been arrested twice before for having crossed international borders (not further identified) clandestinely.

2. CORREA stated that he had become involved in smuggling activities in Portuguese territory about three years ago through a Portuguese count (not further identified). The count is about 45 years old, owns a castle in Castel de Vide, Portugal, which is about eight kilometers from the Spanish-Portuguese border, and has ten children.

3. The above-mentioned count is in contact with a United States national whose name is believed to be Jose CAR(R) from Dallas, Texas. CAR owns twelve launches on which he transports merchandise, liquor, and tobacco to different places on the Portuguese coast mostly in the Lisbon and southern areas. CAR comes to Portugal about every 20 days and stays at an unidentified hotel in Lisbon. The count is always informed of CAR's arrival in Portugal.

4. On 12 June 1968, CORREA overheard a conversation between CAR and an unidentified person during which CAR said, "We have already taken care of Robert Kennedy, his brother will fall soon." The conversation took place on the launch "Fatima".
