A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention.

The second source advised in September, 1966, that Mike Zagarell, CPUSA Youth Director, stated that in Negro communities the Party still supported the plan to build "left" socialist centers and to solidify the Party base through the DCA. This source also advised in September, 1966, that Daniel Rubin, CPUSA National Organizational Secretary, stated the Party believes the DCA should have a working-class outlook and be a mass organization favorable to socialism, socialist countries and Marxism, and in April, 1967, advised that Gus Hall, CPUSA General Secretary, indicated the DCA primary emphasis should be on developing mass resistance to the draft.

A third source advised in September, 1967, that Jarvis Tyner was elected chairman of the DCA on September 10, 1967, at the Third National Convention of the DCA held in New York, New York, from September 8-10, 1967.

A second source advised on April 17, 1964, that as of April, 1964, RUTH GREENBAUM was a member of the Southern Califernia District Communist Party (SCDCP) and that MARVIN

The first source above stated that the Du Bois Club was organized mainly to meet the needs of Marxistcrientated students at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), but that the club eventually hoped to spread its influence into other areas in West Los Angeles.

A third source advised on March 12, 1964, that at a Communist Party (CP) meeting held in Los Angeles, in February, 1964, BEN DOBBS, Executive Secretary of the SCDCP, spoke on the CP youth movement and stated that the Du Bois Club was one of two youth groups operating in the Los Angeles area, both groups were Marxist-orientated and that members considered themselves Marxist.

A fourth source advised on March 25, 1965, that since its inception, the activities of the Du Bois Club have been mainly limited to participation in protests against a alleged racial discrimination, participation in Marxist classes, participation in conferences which led to the creation of the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America in the summer of 1964 and participation in demonstrations protesting U.S. intervention in Viet Nem. This source advised that the W.E.B. Du Bois Club of West Los Angeles is now affiliated with the W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America and is operating as a chapter of that organization.



Just prior to the commotion, Alprentice "Bunchy" Carter (now deceased) had been speaking. The individual whom felt resembled Sirhan got up and spoke about the "Muslims" somewhat in opposition to Carter's remarks.

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During the conversation, did not recall that the name of Sirhan Sirhan was mentioned. In connection with the meeting at the EC, stated that at no time did he hear the name Sirhan Sirhan.

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On September 8, 1977, SA's BRENDAN O. CLEARY and RAYMOND A. MISLOCK, JR. interviewed SIRHAN SIRHAN in a classroom at Soledad Prison, Soledad, California. Prior to interview, SIRHAN was apprised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and it was indicated to him by SA CLEARY that the interview would concern a conspiracy to steal a nuclear device, a matter of prosecutive potential. SIRHAN was advised that, therefore, he would have to be advised of his Constitutional rights prior to his responding to questions.

SIRHAN inquired as to whether or not the · interviewing Agents had, in fact, contacted his attorney, GODFREY ISAAC, and received his permission for the interview. SIRHAN was advised by SA CLEARY that the interviewing Agents had not contacted his attorney and were under no such obligation to do so.

SIRHAN stated he did not want to talk to interviewing Agents without his attorney's presence or consent. SIRHAN was advised that he was under no obligation to talk to interviewing Agents, but was requested to at least listen to an allegation received by the FBI at Los Angeles. SIRHAN indicated that he would listen, but reserve comment.

SA CLEARY then advised SIRHAN that the FBI had received an allegation from an individual named CARMEN FALZONE, a former inmate at Soledad, indicating that he, SIRHAN, along with other unnamed individuals outside of prison, had concocted a plot to steal a nuclear device and transport this device to MUAMMER QADDAFI, President of Libya, in exchange for forty million dollars. SA CLEARY elaborated further on this plot, upon completion of which SIRHAN stated that he knew FALZONE.

SIRHAN was again reminded that he was under no obligation to discuss this matter without the presence or

advice of his attorney and that in this regard should read or be read the "Interrogation; Advice of Rights" form. SIRHAN refused to read the form, but voluntarily provided the following information:

SIRHAN stated he recalled FALZONE and remembered him as a "braggart" and "con-artist". According to SIRHAN, FALZONE had "ripped-off" several inmates on "money" transactions. FALZONE, according to SIRHAN, had indicated that he was to be paroled in the Los Angeles area and would like to meet SIRHAN's family and maybe get some good "Arab food". In this regard SIRHAN did furnish FALZONE with SIRHAN's mother's telephone number for possible contact.

SIRHAN stated that in view of his "notoriety", many inmates in his particular wing try to "get close" to him, but he carefully avoids getting too involved with other inmates as he does not trust them, particularly their motives. SIRHAN stated that relative to FALZONE, that"he had all the ingredients of a good story for the press, all ne needed was to fill in the names".

SIRHAN stated that he would never discuss his past activities nor his future plans with any inmate as he prefers merely to listen and play a passive role, inasmuch as his primary interest is to secure his parole as scheduled.

SIRHAN indicated that in recent telephone calls with his family, they had indicated that FALZONE had been calling them incessantly and they were not sure why he was so friendly. The family did indicate that they did give some sort of "party" or dinner for FALZONE, but were now trying to avoid him.

SIRHAN requested that interviewing Agents contact his attorney, GODFREY ISAAC, in Los Angeles and relate the above story to him.

At no time during the interview did either interviewing Agents or SIRHAN SIRHAN discuss the matter for which he is currently incarcerated.



MARTIN stated that INS has received information through the Phoenix Police Department, Organized Crime Unit, to the effect that JHORAN has made statements that he was present with SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN at the scene of captioned matter and knows that "SIRHAN was not the only gunman involved in the shooting of ROBERT F. KENNEDY." H. RICHARD CHEW, 1419 North Courthouse Road, Arlington, Virginia, telephonically furnished the following information:

He advised that on June 4, 1968, he was a member of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY staff and was accompanying Senator KENNEDY on his campaign tour at Los Angeles, California.

Mr. CHEW stated that he was registered at the Ambassador Hotel and had occasion to enter the Embassy Ballroom twice during the day that Senator KENNEDY was shot and killed. He stated that he had no information concerning a possible conspiracy, nor did he know SIRHAN B. SIRHAN. CHEW advised that he does not recall observing SIRHAN at any time while he, CHEW, was in the Embassy Ballrcom. CHEW stated that he was not personally in the Ballroom at the time Senator KENNEDY was shot.

CHEW further advised that he had no additional information to furnish.

> BOB JACKSON, Investigator on loan from the District Attorney's Office to the Board of Supervisors, telephone number 974-9794, telephonically contacted SA J. HAROLD MARSHALL at the FBI, Los Angeles. He is investigating this matter for the Board of Supervisors as a result of a motion made by Supervisor BAXTER WARD. The Board of Supervisors is trying to clear up several questions regarding this matter. JACKSON has a copy of a tape recording that was made when KENNEDY was shot and he does not know exactly where the tape came from. It is his recollection and information from other people that the FBI obtained a copy of a tape recording made during KENNEDY's assassination and took out some of the background noise so that what happened could be ascertained from the tape. He desired to listen to the FBI's tape and see if it was the same as his.

Former Case Agent A. O. RICHARDS was contacted regarding this matter and he said he was not aware of any tape recording that was made or enhanced by the FBI.

This information was furnished to JACKSON and he then stated that there were several unanswered questions which had arisen because of photographs taken in this matter by SA AL GREINER and other statements made by FBI Agents.

JACKSON said that he had reviewed previous files of the FBI regarding this matter and several questions were left unanswered by the FBI. He requested that the FBI make some type of statement to him regarding some of these unanswered questions.

BESSIE SMITH, FOIA Section at the Bureau, was contacted regarding this matter and she said that a great deal of information had been released on this case and that it was all in the possession of the District Attorney in Los Angeles. She suggested that JACKSON review this material.

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In the course of an inquiry by the office of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors into certain aspects of the physical evidence at the Senator Robert F. Kennedy assassination, questions have arisen concerning certain FBI photographs. These photographs, purportedly taken by Special Agent Greiner and numbered E-1, E-2, E-3 and E-4, are captioned "bullet holes".

If these were, in fact, bullet holes, it could be inferred that more than one gun was fired in the pantry during the assassination. Mr. Allard Lowenstein, Ambassador to the United Nations, among others, has maintained that a possibility exists that another assassin was present. Mr. Lowenstein and other critics of the official version have referred to the above photographs as representing the official opinion of the FBI inasmuch as the captions are unequivocal in stating "bullet holes".

If the captions had said possible, probable, or apparent bullet holes, one could assume that no precise examination had taken place at the time the photographs were taken. However, the captions would lead one to believe that a determination had been made by someone with the requisite knowledge and skills:

The dilemma we are faced with is that the photograph captions are being used as evidence of the official FBI position in the absence of any other official stated position.

If more bullets were fired within the pantry than Sirhan Sirhan's gun was capable of holding, we should certainly find out who else was firing. If, in fact, the FBI has no evidence that the questioned holes were bullet holes, we should know that so that the air may be cleared. Mr. Hal Marshall

It is therefore requested that the official position of the FBI regarding these bullet holes be relayed to this office.



Enclosed for the Bureau are two copies each of a letter to Los Angeles Division from the Chief Administrative Officer, County of Los Angeles, dated 11/2/77, and FD-302 of SAA ALFRED C. GREINER, dated 6/7/68.

The Bureau has previously been advised of the inquiry by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors regarding the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

The enclosed FD-302 was extracted from Los Angeles report of SA AMEDEE O. RICHARDS, JR., dated 6/9/68, regarding this matter.

No ballistics investigation was conducted by Los Angeles Division and SA GREINER did not know whether or not the holes depicted in the photographs were actually bullet holes or not. The photographs were taken two days after the death of Senator KENNEDY and after investigation had been conducted by the Los Angeles PD.

It is the opinion of Los Angeles that the Los Angeles County Chief Administrative Officer should be advised by the Los Angeles Division, in writing, of essentially the facts furnished above. Investigator ROBERT H. JACKSON has a copy of the FD-302 of SA GREINER and the photographs.

INVESTIGATION CONCERNING THE ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY JUNE 5, 1968 LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

On June 7, 1968, crime-scene photographs depicting the area of the Ambassador Hotel in which Senator Robert F. Kennedy was shot were taken by an FBI photographer with the aid of a Special Agent. A photographic log was maintained as part of the crime-scene record. The use of the terms "bullet holes" and "bullet mark" in the photographic log to describe the photographs marked E-1, E-2, E-3, and E-4 was for the convenience of the photographic team in recording information as reported to them. Neither the photographs nor the photographic log were ever purported to be a ballistics report and as such are not intended to be demonstrative evidence of the existence of bullet holes.

The FBI conducted no ballistics examinations in this investigation.
