Certain indented writings were found on pages of the notebook, Q3. It was found that these indented writings correspond to writings on other pages in the submitted material.

Various ink and pencil writings appear on the questioned documents. Faint writings consisting of ink transfers were noted on pages 65 and 122 of notebook, Q3. Ink transfers of this nature sometimes occur when documents are pressed closely together for some period of time. The faint writing on page 122 of Q3 is a transference of a portion of page 123 of Q3. The original document from which the ink transference on page 65 of Q3 originated does not appear to be contained in any of the submitted material.

The seven sheets of spiral notebook paper listed as Q5 correspond in physical features to the pages in the notebook, Q3. The sheets in Q5 were probably torn from Q3.

Stains appear on certain of the questioned documents. Since exhaustive Laboratory examination of the stains would entail destruction of portions of the documents, chemical examinations of the stains were not made.

Two copies of the translation of the foreign language material contained in the submitted specimens are forwarded to Los Angeles.

The signature on the available photocopy of the fingerprint card of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN (obtained by St. Horse Racing Bd., Los Angeles, California) is too limited and not sufficiently comparable with the questioned writing on the specimens described above for the purpose of determining whether SIRHAN wrote any of the questioned writing.

The submitted material is being returned separately to FBI, Los Angeles. This material has been photographed.

A translation of the foreign language material contained in the submitted specimens is attached.

Note for Los Angeles:

This supplements Bureau teletype dated 6/6/68 to Los Angeles in this case.

A separate report is being submitted concerning the fingerprint examination, at which time you will be advised with respect to the return of the submitted evidence.

Nothing significant was noted in the cryptanalytic examination of specimens Q1 through Q14.

The questioned writing was searched through the appropriate sections of the National Security File without effecting an identification with any prior submission.

It was found that the typewriting on Q7 and Q11 is not clear enough for adequate examination.



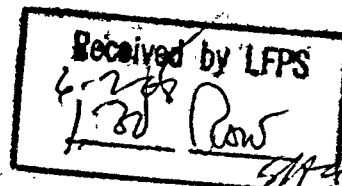

**Result of examination:**

The typewritten message on Qc15 is a photocopy reproduction. The photocopy was folded and the address and stamp were then added. The address on the front of Qc15 consists of original handwriting which was written with blue-black ink.

The typewriting corresponds to the standard for Underwood pica style of type, having a horizontal spacing of ten letters to the inch. This typewriting was compared with the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification. Copies are being added thereto.

The typewritten name "Merle M. Matteson" is included in the questioned typewriting. Based on the name mentioned, a search was made in the files of the Identification Division. The handwriting on Qc15 was compared with signatures on the fingerprint cards located. No identification was made.

Qc15 is being returned separately. This specimen has been photographed.

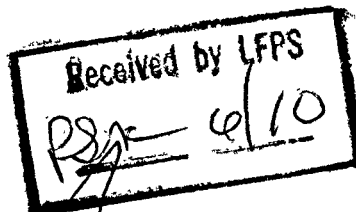

of America will be advised of their punishments for their treasonable crimes against the state. More over we believe that the glorious United States of America will eventually be felled by a blow of an assassin's bullet."

A third page contains the following statement. "Ambassador Goldberg must die die die." Repeated numerous times on this same page appears "Goldberg will be illiminated."

Page four contains the statement "Kennedy must die - Kennedy must fall," which is repeated numerous times.

Page five contains the statement that "RFK must be disposed of like his brother was."

The statement "I advocate the overthrow of the current President of the (obscene) United States of America. I have no absolute plans yet - but soon will compose some" appears on page six.

Page seven contains the statement "Well, my solution to this type of Govt. today is to do away with its leaders and declare anarchy, the best form of Govt. or no Govt."

On page eight appears the statement "I believe that I can effect the death of Bert C. Altfillisch," who was the employer of Sirhan at the time he was thrown from a horse during September, 1966.

Also appearing was the notation "Robert F. Kennedy must be assassinated before 5 June 68."

In addition, a source who has furnished reliable information in the past and who is an active member of the Communist Party in California advised that he received information from an associate of Sirhan's to the effect he was extremely anti-Semitic in his views, was in favor of the Vietcong and supported some Communist Party ideals. Sirhan, according to this source, had been thoroughly briefed on Communist Party activities at the University of California at Los Angeles within the last two weeks. Although it was reported to this source that an attempt had been made to recruit Sirhan into the Communist Party, Sirhan allegedly has not engaged in any Communist Party activities.

Investigation by the FBI is continuing in order to determine the full facts surrounding this situation and in order to ascertain if Sirhan acted alone.



## ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY

Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, according to records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Los Angeles, California, was born on March 19, 1944, in Jerusalem, Palestine. His current address was given as 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California. Immigration and Naturalization Service records show he entered this country on January 12, 1957, with his father, Bishara Salameh Ghattas Sirhan, his mother, Mary, four brothers and a sister who is now deceased. His brothers, Adel, Munir, and Saidallah, are currently shown as residing with their mother and Sirhan at 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California. The fourth brother, Sharif, is a resident of Highland Park, California. His father allegedly resides now in Jordan.

Our Los Angeles Office reports that Sirhan Bishara Sirhan graduated from high school in Pasadena, California. He thereafter attended Pasadena City College, a junior college, for approximately two years, but did not graduate. He formerly worked as a race horse exercise boy and during September, 1966, sustained a head injury after falling from a horse. Interviews with his family indicate his behavior has changed considerably since this injury. Records of the State of California reveal he was awarded a settlement on March 27, 1968, in the sum of \$2,000. His brother, Adel, advised the assailant has been unemployed for the past three months. When taken into custody he had \$409 in cash on his person.

During a search of his room in the Pasadena family home numerous items, including notations advocating the overthrow of the President of the United States and statements alluding to the necessity for assassinating Robert F. Kennedy, were found. According to United States Attorney William Matthew Byrne, Jr., Central District of California, who had been in contact with the office of the Los Angeles County District Attorney, this material should not be disclosed publicly prior to the trial nor should it be made available to unauthorized persons since it could have a serious adverse effect upon successful prosecution in either Federal or State court. One handwritten page bearing the date May 18, 1968, 9:45 a. m., contains numerous notations among which are "My determination to eliminate RFK is becoming more the more of an unshakeable obsession." "RFK must die - RFK must be killed. Robert F. Kennedy must be assassinated." Another page contains the handwritten statement that "The so-called President of the United States

This is to advise that Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, a Jordanian national, has been identified as the individual who shot Senator Robert F. Kennedy at 12:15 a. m., Pacific Daylight Time, June 5, 1968, in the ballroom of the Ambassador Hotel at Los Angeles, California. The Senator subsequently died at 1:44 a. m., Pacific Daylight Time, June 6, 1968, at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Los Angeles.

After the assailant was taken into custody by authorities, he refused to identify himself or otherwise discuss this matter. He was shortly thereafter charged by the Los Angeles Police Department with intent to commit murder and held on \$250,000 bond.

His brother, Adel Sirhan, notified authorities as to Sirhan's true identity. The FBI subsequently identified Sirhan's fingerprints as being identical with those of an individual by the same name which were submitted by the California State Horse Racing Board during 1965.

According to the Los Angeles Police Department, the weapon used in the assassination was an eight-shot .22 caliber Iver Johnson pistol. All eight shots were expended. Records of the California Department of Justice show this pistol to have been sold on August 10, 1965, to one Albert Leslie Hertz of Alhambra, California. It was subsequently traced by police authorities through several parties to one of Sirhan's brothers, Munir Sirhan.

Sirhan is presently confined to an eight by ten foot hospital room located on the second floor of the Los Angeles Central Jail. The room contains no windows and has a single steel door with a twelve by twelve inch glass window which permits observation by an outside guard. Sirhan leaves the room only to shower and for medical attention. He is under guard at all times. Inspector Ralph C. Welch, officer in charge of the jail, advised that no electronic device is in Sirhan's cell nor will one be installed. Sirhan is constantly surveilled through the glass window by police guards. Inspector Welch advised that under no circumstances will he be brought to an interview area in the jail because of security reasons. Medical examination showed that upon attendance he had a fractured finger and a swollen ankle. There were no indications he had been using narcotics in any form. Agents from our Los Angeles office are at the jail full time.

Information developed by our Los Angeles office through interview with the family indicates that while Sirhan had exhibited Anti-Semitic attitudes in the past, he had never indicated any previous dislike for Kennedy. No information has been developed indicating he was associated with others in connection with this offense. It appears that he had no close associates and belonged to no racial-type organizations.

#### ACTION

(1) Attached is a letterhead memorandum for the White House with copies to the Vice President, the Attorney General, the Deputy Attorney General, and the Civil Rights Division.

(2) An all-out investigation is continuing in order to fully develop all facets of this case.

Attached for approval is a memorandum to the White House with copies to the Department summarizing developments relating to the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, who died at 1:44 a.m., Pacific Daylight Time, at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Los Angeles, California, after being shot in the head by an assailant at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, at 12:15 a.m., 6/5/68. The assailant has subsequently been identified by his family and FBI identification of fingerprints as Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, a twenty-four-year-old Jordanian national who resided in Pasadena, California.

In summary, the attached memorandum to the White House sets forth details relating to the shooting, the subsequent identification of Sirhan and results of inquiries by local authorities and the FBI concerning the background of Sirhan and his family, all of whom reside in the Los Angeles area with exception of his father, whose whereabouts is unknown. We set forth certain information relating to notations found in Sirhan's room by FBI Agents and Los Angeles police officers, which indicate Sirhan had considered the assassination of not only Kennedy, but the President and Ambassador Goldberg, among others. This information has not been made public to our knowledge and the U. S. Attorney in Los Angeles has indicated to do so could adversely effect successful prosecution of this case. We have set forth the U. S. Attorney's comments in the attached memorandum.

The original documents are being flown in by commercial aircraft and will be examined by the Laboratory and Identification Division immediately upon arrival. In addition we make reference to certain associations with the California Communist Party.

of the family; other victims of the assault; current incarceration of Sirhan as well as other related matters. Christopher, Lynch and Byrne all went to the county jail, observed the cell area and discussed the situation with the Los Angeles County Sheriff. They also viewed the crime scene at the Ambassador Hotel. According to SAC, Los Angeles, all appeared highly pleased with the thoroughness and accuracy as well as the over-all handling of the FBI investigation. No mention was made as to whether the FBI should interview Sirhan at this time, it being noted we have on 6/6-7/68 discussed this aspect with the Civil Rights Division requesting their views as to what action should be taken along these lines.

#### THE GIRL IN THE POLKA DOT DRESS

One phase of this investigation which has been receiving considerable attention by the news media is the so-called girl in the polka dot dress who was reportedly seen running from the ball room immediately after the shooting screaming "we have shot him." A student, Sandra Serrano appeared on television shortly after the shooting describing the incident. Cathie Fulmer, a Los Angeles cocktail waitress, contacted the Los Angeles Sheriff's Office indicating she may have been the girl involved since she had a polka dot scarf over her dress and did run from the hotel screaming "They have shot him" immediately after the incident. Fulmer although not certain, believes she saw Sirhan several times prior to the shooting at the hotel.

When questioned thoroughly by Los Angeles Agents it was noted that the area of the ball room where Fulmer states she was located and the entrance and exit she used were not near the area the witness claims to have seen the girl in the polka dot dress. The witness after viewing Fulmer claimed she was not identical with the individual she saw. This phase of our inquiry is being pressed.

#### ATTEMPT TO SMUGGLE GUNS INTO JAIL

According to information received from the Los Angeles Sheriff's Office on 6/7/68, that department received information from a confidential source to the effect that a woman was going to smuggle three guns into the jail in order to effect the escape

This is to advise of current developments with respect to our investigation into captioned matter.

## ADMISSIBILITY OF EVIDENCE

With respect to the material obtained from Sirhan's room in the family home at Pasadena, California, information has been received from Los Angeles that Lynn Compton, Chief Deputy District Attorney, Los Angeles County, has voluntarily opined that the search was completely illegal as no search warrant had been obtained, and, furthermore, the evidence had been tainted by Los Angeles Mayor Yorty's public comment concerning the contents of the material seized. We had contacted Compton in connection with our Laboratory and Identification Division examination of this material and he emphasized that he was furnishing this opinion in extreme confidence and only for the information of the FBI.

Los Angeles reports that when a Bureau Agent reached the scene of the search the press and television were already at the home at 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, setting up television equipment with newsmen searching through the trash cans. Local law enforcement officers immediately entered the home and the Agent, with another officer, went to the rear of the residence in order to determine if anything had been taken by the newsmen. When the Agent finally entered the residence police officers were in the process of sorting through the notebooks and other material. Our Agent did not participate in the search but merely observed the proceedings.

## BRIEFING OF DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL CHRISTOPHER

SAC, Los Angeles, reports that he conferred for approximately an hour on 6/7/68 with the Deputy Attorney General, Department Attorney William Lynch, and United States Attorney William Matthew Byrne, Jr., Central District of California, concerning the evidence recovered to date; the preliminary autopsy report; Sirhan's background and character

of two convicted murderers awaiting execution. At 7 p.m., 6/7/68, a 55-year-old woman, Edyth Claybaugh Grant, subsequently entered the jail building and the deputy discovered the guns secreted in a typewriter which she intended to leave for one of the inmates. This has no direct connection with captioned matter; however, it has received considerable attention in the press.

PHOTOGRAPHS AT AMBASSADOR HOTEL SOLD TO LIFE MAGAZINE

Peter Berksen Spencer, a professional free lance photographer was present at the scene of the shooting and reported to our Los Angeles Office that immediately upon hearing the shots took approximately 20 to 30 photographs of the ensuing action. The negatives were purchased by Life magazine and forwarded to New York City. We are contacting Life in an attempt to obtain copies of pertinent photographs.

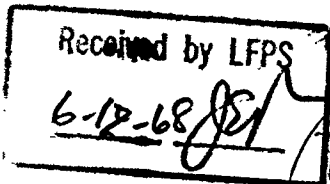
