Result of examination:

The hand printing on Q30 and Q31 was compared with the Anonymous Letter File and with the specimens submitted previously in this case without effecting an identification.

No indented writing of value was noted on Q30 and Q31. It was not possible to determine the sources of Q30 and Q31 since there are no watermarks or other identifying characteristics present on these specimens other than the design printed at the top of Q31 which appears on correspondence paper usually available to members of the Armed Forces.

Q30 and Q31 will be retained in the files of the Bureau upon the completion of the fingerprint examination. Appropriate photographs have been made.

Dear Brother Kennedy:

Oh, dear God, is it possible that such tragic fate must keep befalling the most noble family of the 20th century, the Kennedys. Please follow the following instructions most faithfully, because a big gang has condemned you, too, to death.

1. Make no statements, not even among your friends or your family, because walls have ears too. Keep quiet.
2. Leave America without delay.
3. Do not get in touch with anyone, not even your own wife, until after the elections.
4. Three months after the elections, you may return to your wonderful and unhappy children.
5. You must take as your companion a hapless Serbian.
6. Do not engage in 1969 in any State affairs.
7. You, unhappy brother Ted, have been condemned to death by the same gang that killed your two brothers. They will kill you on the election day this year. I entreat you as God himself to leave America right away, as soon as you receive this letter.

8. You will find out who I am only after the elections, through your sister in Paris.
9. In 1972, you will become the deserving master of heaven and earth, you will become President of the United States.
10. In 1973, you will avenge your brothers and do away with this gang.
11. For four years, the idiot Johnson has refused to let me settle in Chicago. My entire file is at the Embassy. I should like to ask of you that your sister make it possible for me to settle in Chicago, as I am a political emigre. I am an unfinished student, have not completed my studies. I was an agent of Belgrade, Washington, Moscow, Tel Aviv, and Peking. I was born the same year as you, or, perhaps, a year earlier. I was expelled from France, appealed and my appeal was granted. I look very much like you. I am a teacher by profession, and have completed the work in the Faculty of Philosophy at the University of Belgrade.
12. Let them get me to America in some way. Your sister can do it. I was sick and because of my illness, I was turned down in 1966. My health has now improved, so let them call me for another physical. Your sister can do this for me.

13. To be frank, I am totally impoverished and without money. Now I clean streets. I should like to ask you, therefore, dear brother Ted, for \$1,000 help.

14. I will get in touch by mail with your sister, the wife of the Ambassador in Paris - I'll use the same green pen and tell her who I am.

The youth of the entire world is grateful to John and Bob Kennedy. May they live in eternal glory, and may the black soil in which they rest forever be light to them.

Long live Ted Kennedy, the avenger of his brothers.

It was found that the writing on Q32 and the Serbian writing on Q33 are not comparable with the material previously received in the FBI Laboratory in the Kensalt case and, therefore, the writing on Q32 and Q33 could not be adequately compared with the writings submitted previously in this case.

SUBJECT: Information concerning the Yugoslav national, Djura STOKIC.

Djura STOKIC, born on April 26, 1931 at Dolovo, Yugoslavia, son of Zorco and Julijana ZIVANOV, Yugoslav national, is employed with the "Bar Cleaning" establishment, 18, Rue Chaussee d'Antin, Paris 9. He resides at 23, Rue Cullierie Bell, Paris 17.

STOKIC entered France on January 21, 1963. He is considered to be of good repute by his circle of friends. He is the holder of a residence permit valid until 3-18-67 and of Political Refugee Card No. 142-460/5636.

STOKIC is very well thought of by his employer; he is a hard worker, sober and honest.

However, following a demonstration, he was taken to the Psychiatric Institution of the Prefecture de la Seine in May 1965 and was then transferred to the Psychiatric Hospital of Ferrey-Vaucluse, Seine et Oise, where he stayed for two months.

STOKIC shows temporary signs of abnormality, relating that his uncle is a minister; that his father was a superior officer in the National Yugoslav army, but compatriots from the same district confirm that he comes from an agricultural family. However, STOKIC is widely knowledgeable. He can read but not write French. He appears to have a rather strong leaning towards writing to certain Heads of Foreign States.

He is in letter contact with some of his compatriots and is said to correspond with Vladimir ZICHENICH, 1913 W Schiller Street, Chicago 22, Illinois.

In general, Djura STOKIC is not subject of bad information and despite his occasional mental deficiency, is not considered as a dangerous person.

STOKIC, Djura.

Official French police records reflect that STOKIC, Djura born 28 April 1931 at Dolovo, Yugoslavia is unmarried.

A Serbian Nationalist, STOKIC claims to be supporter of the reestablishment of the monarchy in his homeland.

Manifestly obsessed with Yugoslav political problems, he often reads to his compatriots, some letters which he is addressing to the high dignitaries of the actual Yugoslavian regime, even to the Yugoslavian Ambassador in France. In these letters, STOKIC, denounces with violence the "Régime Concentrationnaire de la Yougoslavie". These letters are oftentimes incoherent with vague threats.

Concerning his private life, this foreigner is unfavourably noted in the Records of the Prefecture de Police. He is generally reported as unstable in his job, hot-headed and poses as a homosexual. He lives with a Russian citizen YARESKO, Michel, born 8 Oct. 1898 at Tchensockoff, a butler, well-known for his peculiar mores ("mœurs spéciales").

Your attention is directed to the fact that while this report bears no security classification its contents are of a personal nature and should be handled on a need-to-know basis and must be secured accordingly.

Djuro STOKIC

Reference is made to your memorandum of July 24, 1968, enclosing a photograph and letter in the Serbo-Croatian language - Cyrillic script, received by the Embassy in Paris.

Due to the handwriting, a complete translation cannot be made; however, portions of the letter indicate subject to be possibly a mental case. The photograph attached to the letter is that of the subject. It is to be noted that the letter is dated January 22, 1968, at Paris, and signed "Long live Djuro Stokic, the Jew."

The first sentence of the letter indicates that subject plans to get even with President Johnson by stealing his wealth. He also claims to have a list of names of 13 American millionaires, the first being President Johnson and the 13th Governor Nelson Rockefeller. Subject claims he has been forced to this action because President Johnson is responsible for his being turned down a thousand times for a visa to enter the United States. Subject also claims that women and other people are always looking at him and following him. Subject states that, although he likes women, he loves money, "dollars," more.

Our Paris records contain no information identifiable with the subject.

In view of the threat against President Johnson, the original letter and photograph are being furnished to Mr. John H. Hanly, U. S. Secret Service, Paris.

ReBulet to Paris 8/16/68, enclosing copies of anonymous communication dated 6/11/68 at Paris, France, addressed to Senator EDWARD KENNEDY, and the translation of this communication.

By referenced letter, Paris was requested to attempt to identify the author of the above-mentioned letter..

For information of the Bureau and Los Angeles, the Paris Office recently received from CIA, Paris, a photograph and letter in the Serbo-Croatian language (Cyrillic script). A partial translation of this letter identified the writer as DJURO STOKIC. As the letter alluded to a threat to President JOHNSON, the original letter and the photograph were furnished to the Paris office of the Secret Service.

Enclosed for the information of the Bureau and Los Angeles is one copy each of Paris letter dated 8/7/68 to ALS (CIA), with copies to Secret Service and Visa Section, American Embassy, Paris. Enclosed for the Bureau is one copy of the Serbo-Croatian letter dated 1/22/68 at Paris, with photograph of DJURO STOKIC.

It is to be noted that there are numerous similarities between the letter written to Senator KENNEDY and the STOKIC communication. Both of these letters were written in the Cyrillic script of the Serbo-Croatian language and both enclosed photographs. Both letters alluded to the fact that

the writer had been refused a visa to immigrate to Chicago and both letters ended with the words "long live" (ziveo). In the letter to Senator KENNEDY, the author stated he had been born in the same year as the Senator. It is to be noted that Senator KENNEDY was born 2/22/32, while STOKIC, according to information contained in Paris Secret Service file, is listed as having been born 4/26/31 at Dolovo, Yugoslavia.

Enclosed for the information of the Bureau and Los Angeles is one copy each of Secret Service, Paris, report and American Embassy, Paris, Visa Section memorandum dated 5/26/66 pertaining to STOKIC. It is to be noted that the source of the Secret Service report is the Police Judiciaire (Criminal Police), Surete Nationale, Paris, and that it denotes that STOKIC had been placed in a psychiatric hospital in France in 1965. This same report also states that STOKIC appears to have very strong leanings toward writing letters to certain heads of foreign states.

STOKIC's visa file at the American Embassy, Paris, reveals that his application for an immigrant visa to the United States was rejected as he was found medically ineligible, class "A." According to the Visa Section, classification "A" is a classification given on the basis of mental or physical inability seldom overcome.

Based on the information set out in this letter, it is believed that the author of the letter to Senator KENNEDY may be possibly identical with DJURO STOKIC.

The Bureau is requested to have the FBI Laboratory make a comparison of the handwriting between the letter addressed to Senator KENNEDY, dated 6/11/68, with those written by STOKIC, dated 1/22/68, and the one STOKIC wrote in 1966 on the front and back of a World Council of Churches letter dated 5/24/66. Copies of these three letters are enclosed.

It is to be noted that the original STOKIC letter of 1/22/68 was furnished to the Paris office of the Secret Service on 8/7/68 and they have, in turn, forwarded this letter to their headquarters in Washington. The original STOKIC letter of 1966 is located in the American Embassy, Paris, visa file.

In addition to the Laboratory comparison, the Bureau is requested to determine from Secret Service headquarters in

Washington, D. C., if the photograph or picture enclosed with the letter to Senator KENNEDY (see page three, next to last line of translation letter) was that of the author. In the event this was the case, the Bureau is requested to compare the photograph of STOKIC with that contained in the letter to Senator KENNEDY.

A copy of the translation of the letter to Senator KENNEDY has been furnished to the Ambassador's office in view of information that the author plans to contact Mrs. SHRIVER in the future. Copies of this same communication were also furnished to the Secret Service, Security Office and the Visa Section of the American Embassy, Paris.

For the assistance of WFO, there is attached a translation from Serbian of a communication dated June 11, 1968, Paris, France, from "an anonymous Serbian." There is also attached a copy of a letter from Legat, Paris dated 8/29/68 and enclosures thereto dealing with this matter.

It is requested that Secret Service be contacted and a determination made as to whether the photograph contained in the 1/22/68 letter to President Johnson from Djuro Stokic is identical with the photograph that apparently was enclosed in the 6/11/68 anonymous communication. It is noted that Secret Service did not furnish a photograph in its referral to the Bureau.

Copies of the above-referred-to material are likewise enclosed for the information of the Los Angeles Office.

An examination is being conducted by the FBI Laboratory of the handwriting in both communications and you will be advised of the results.

Result of examination:

It was found that the purported writing of DJURO STOKIC appearing on the submitted photocopies designated Kc23 and Kc24 is entirely too indistinct to permit a suitable comparison with the questioned writing on the two-page letter designated as Q33. Specimen Q33 is the original letter for the photocopy Qc33. Q33 and the envelope in which it was mailed, designated Qc32, are described in FBI Laboratory report dated 8/23/68, a copy of which was furnished to the Director, U.S. Secret Service, Washington, D.C. Photocopies of Q32 and Q33 were furnished with FBI Laboratory report of 8/23/68.

Due to the indistinctness of the writing on Kc23 and Kc24, a definite conclusion was not reached whether DJURO STOKIC wrote the questioned writing on Q32 and Q33. Certain handwriting characteristics were noted in the purported known writing of DJURO STOKIC on Kc23 and Kc24 which are consistent with handwriting characteristics in the letter designated as Q33. These consistencies in handwriting characteristics indicate that Q33 may have been written by DJURO STOKIC.

The submitted material is being retained in the FBI files.

For the information of the Bureau, in addition to the handwriting samples of members of the family taken by Agents of this office, there are additional documents on file at the Pasadena, California, Police Department and at the City of Pasadena Welfare Department containing the signatures of SHARIF SIRHAN and SAIDALLAH SIRHAN. The most recent of these is a receipt for welfare funds given to SHARIF and SAIDALLAH SIRHAN dated 11/4/68. The second is a handwriting sample card made out in the name of SHARIEF B. SIRHAN on 3/30/65 and signed by him in the same way. Also available are copies of handwriting specimens of SAIDALLAH SIRHAN as contained on two pawn tickets dated 9/16/68.

Xerox copies of these documents are enclosed. The Bureau is requested to advise Los Angeles if the originals of these documents should be obtained at this time.

For the information of the Bureau, on 11/8/68 Lieutenant GERALD WRIGHT, Pasadena Police Department, Pasadena, California, advised that there is a deep and bitter rift in the

SIRHAN family between SAIDALLAH and SHARIF SIRHAN, who are living apart from the family home, and the mother, MUNIR and ADEL SIRHAN. Pasadena police officers who have been guarding the house on Howard Street have reported that several days ago SAIDALLAH SIRHAN appeared at the house and was refused entrance by his mother. He allegedly threw a fit of temper, screaming at her and accusing her of having money and not dividing it with SHARIF and himself. Lieutenant WRIGHT indicated he has arranged some welfare payments to SAIDALLAH and SHARIF on the basis of their contention that they could not work under their present circumstances.

At the time of the interview of SHARIF SIRHAN on 11/7/68 it was noted that SAIDALLAH SIRHAN, who was present, had been drinking. Later the same evening, about 10:00 P.M., SAIDALLAH appeared at the Pasadena Police Department looking for his brother SHARIF. SA PHILIP J. REILLY spoke with SAIDALLAH on the telephone to assure him that his brother was not in FBI custody. SAIDALLAH appeared to be quite intoxicated at this time, and separate conversation with Sergeant CHARLES T. DUVAL of the Pasadena Police Department, who was interviewing SAIDALLAH at the time, confirmed this.



NOTE:

The questioned communication allegedly signed by Sirhan Sirhan's brother is extremely pro-Arab and anti-Semitic in nature and is generally critical of positions allegedly taken by Nixon and Humphrey in support of Palestine. The writer pleads "do not force us to believe in political assassination which is against our heritage and culture unless we are pressed from you." The letter contains implied threats to destroy every American politician who supports or negotiates any kind of help to the Zionist State. In view of the contents of this letter it is necessary that we pin down its origin.

ATTENTION FBI LABORATORY:

Attempt through known specimens of Sharif Bishara Sirhan's handwriting to determine whether he did in fact prepare this communication. Bureau Liaison is attempting to obtain either the original or more clearly defined copies.

On 10/28/68, representatives of Secret Service Headquarters furnished a copy of a communication addressed to Richard Nixon and Hubert Humphrey, National Headquarters, Willard Hotel, Washington, D. C. This communication was allegedly signed by Sharif Bishara Sirhan and was postmarked Pasadena, California, October 22, 1968. The return address was given as Sharif B. Sirhan, 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California, and the envelope was addressed to Nixon.

Copies of the attached are forwarded for the information and assistance of Los Angeles. An effort is being made through Bureau liaison to obtain the original or a more detailed copy. The Laboratory is conducting examination of the signature in order to determine if it was, in fact, that of Sharif Bishara Sirhan.

Inasmuch as the communication may constitute a possible violation of the Extortion Statute Los Angeles should initiate immediate investigation in order to determine whether it was in fact prepared by Sharif Sirhan. Consideration should be given to conducting an immediate interview of the suspect.

Expedite and advise Bureau of results.

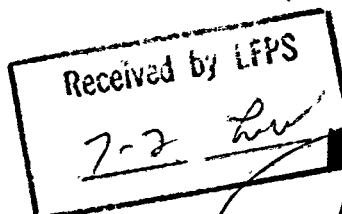
