Mr. Unruh stated that on the night of the shooting, he was with the Kennedy party. He arrived on stage sometime prior to the arrival of the Senator and began speaking about the Senator pending his arrival. According to Unruh, the Senator arrived and gave his victory speech. During the speech, Mr. Unruh was on stage with the Senator. At the conclusion of the speech, the Senator exited the stage via a rear door. Mr. Unruh exited via a door to the left of the stage.; He followed the Senator into the kitchen area. At the time of the shooting, he heard between five and ten sharp shots but could not distinguish them as individual reports. He did not see the suspect do the shooting, nor did he see the Senator or Paul Schrade fall. He said at the time his attention must have been directed somewhere else, or he was possibly engaged in conversation. There was a tremendous amount of confusion in the crowd during the shooting. Immediately after the shooting, he moved forward and recalled passing victim Paul Schrade, who was lying on the floor, on his left side. He made a short right turn, and this placed him at the feet of the Senator. He felt there was nothing he could do for the Senator and therefore engaged himself in holding back the crowd of people who were coming from the direction of the Colonial Room. After order had been somewhat restored in the room, he went to check on the suspect. He took upon himself the responsibility of maintaining the suspect's safety. He kept the suspect under observation although not under physical control until the arrival of the police. Once the police arrived, he accompanied them and the suspect to Rampart Station. En route to the Police Station in the police vehicle, the suspect made the statement, "I did it for my country." Mr. Unruh asked the suspect, "Why him?" (referring to the Senator) to which the suspect replied, "It's too late."

OFFICERS' COMMENTS: In viewing the CBS film which was made immediately after the shooting, Mr. Unruh appears approximately 15 seconds after the start of the film. He is seen holding back the crowd. Mr. Unruh's statement that he went to the Senator first, felt he could do nothing for him, and so attempted to control the crowd is therefore verified by the film. Because of the time involved in the film, it would definitely indicate that Mr. Unruh was in the pantry area of the kitchen where the shooting took place at the time of the shooting. He

Lisa Lynn URSD Lisa Urso resides at 6405\_Bradford Street, San Diego, telephone (714) 582-0441, date of birth February 28, 1950. She is a student at Mesa Junior College in San Diego.

Lisa Urso stated that on the night of the shooting she was in the Enbassy Room prior to Senator Kennedy making his speech. The room was hot and she subsequently left and went into the kitchen area behind the stage. She went through the double doors, leading from the foyer, adjacent to the Embassy Room, into the kitchen area. She noticed a small television monitor to the left as she entered the doors and remained there in that area for some time watching the speech. She recalls a Negro employee (probably Michel Lagurre).

She left this area of the kitchen during the speech, walked toward the end of the kitchen (in the direction of the Colonial Press Room) made a left turn and entered another area of the kitchen. She returned a few moments later and was retracing her steps, walking back in the direction of the Embassy Room, when she observed the Schator

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approaching. She stopped approximately in the middle of the room in the area between the first and second table and stood watching the Senator shaking hands with Hotel employees. While standing here watching the Senator, she recalled that thore was pockibly one man, maybe a Hotel employee, standing between her and the Senator.

She then recalled a male enter her field of vision approximately three to four feet from her (between her and the Senator) and about three to four feet to her left. She was looking at what would be the right rear of the person. She observed this person take his right hand, move it across his body in the area of his waist and then move his hand back across his body, extend his arm in an upward position and at this time she observed the gun and the flash of the first shot. She heard three shots that she recalled,

16 After the first shot, she recalled the Senator 17 move his right hand in the vicinity of his right ear and 18 possibly stagger forward slightly or backward. She was not 19 sure. She indicated she was not sure of the distance, but from what she observed she thought the shot was fired from "point-blank" range. She then stated that a group of men inmediately began to scuffle with the suspect. She further stated she can rocall that the suspect the men were struggling with, who was later apprehended, was the same man that crossed her field of vision and drew the gun that shot the Senator.

Supplemental Interview:
This investigator received information that the business card of Keith Duane Gilbert was in the posession of Wayne, at the time of his apprehension after Sen. Kennedy was shot. Gilbert is reported to be an extremist and militant who has been involved in a dynamite theft, previously.
Michael Wayne was contacted and asked to explain his possession of the card. Wayne stated that he does not know Gilbert. He does not know how the card came into his possession, and does not remember ever having it. He cannot recall having a card from any Reloading Shop.
During the interview with Augustus Mallard (I-260) he was asked about the business card. Mr. Mallard could not remember anything about the card, and does not know if he found it or even saw it. Mallard was the Security Officer who apprehended Mr. Wayne on 6-5-68.
Mr. Wayne was brought to our attention by Mr. Charles Winner (I-239), who stated a Michael Wayne had spoken to him in the kitchen area, prior to Sen. Kennedy being shot.
A photograph was taken of a man in handcoffs at the Ambassador Hotel. This photo was taken by Mr. Fontanini, L.A. Times. The man in the hand- coffs was Mr. Wayne.
Mr. Wayne was in the kitchen when Kennedy was shot, and was the subject of reports by Patti Nelson, Tom Klein and Dennis Weaver (I-623) of a man running through the lobby with a long object in his hand, which appeared to be a rifle.
Wayne was on the 5th floor of the Hotel prior to Kennedy going down the elevator to the Embassy Room. He was attempting to obtain an autograph from Kennedy. Kennedy went down the elevator and Wayne went down in the one with the press. They arrived at the kitchen at approx. the same time.

He moved through the kitchen with Kennedy, and managed to stop Kennedy at one point and get his signature on a roll of posters.

After signing the poster, Kennedy moved into the Embassy Room with his party, to make his victory speech.

The poster is described as approx. 3 ft long, tightly rolled (1 1/2 in.)

There were not too many people in the kitchen area after Kennedy left. At this time, Wayne spoke to a man, attempting to get a Humphry tie clasp. (Wayne collects political campaign souveniers). This man was Charles Winner (I-239).

Wayne went into the EmbassyRoom and listened to Kennedy's speech.

Wayne recalls observing two women in the kitchen area prior to Kennedy entering the Embassy Room. One woman was caucasion, blond, wearing a light colored dress, and had a Kennedy Press Pass in a plastic holder, on a chain around her neck. She told him to leave the kitchen area.

The second woman he described as Fe. Latin, 5-5, heavy, dark hair, looked messed up, wearing the sash across her chest that was similar to that worn by the Kennedy Girls. She was also wearing one of Edward Kennedy's tie clasps from his 1962 campaign. Black skirt.

Wayne left the Embassy Room and returned to the kitchen prior to Kennedy completing his speech. After completing his speech, Kennedy returned to the kitchen. When Kennedy entered the kitchen, Wayne was standing on the east end of the kitchen, close to the doors which lead to the lobby outside the Embassy Room. Kennedy walked toward Wayne as he walked through the kitchen.

Wayne became aware of noises, and someone stated "He's been hit." Suddenly I was aware of the shots. I turned and saw him beginning to move, and mon falling on top of a man in a blue shirt.

I paused, people paniced, I went into the Press Room and tried to use the phones with the light on them, but was unable to get the operator.

He states people didn't know about the shooting - He tried 4 or 5 phones - for a few seconds. Unk how long.

He rushed out of the Press Room (Colonial Room) and through the crowd. People asked him what happened and he told them "I can't say".

When he left the Press Room he turned right, then went to the Gold Room where he talked to a Hotel Employee who didn't speak English. He couldn't locate a phone, so he walked and ran through the crowd in the lobby, to the fountain area, turned right, and went to the area of the Venetian Room where he ran up to a Security Guard (Augustas Mallard) and said "I need a telephone quickly." Mallard wanted to know why, and Wayne made a statement about Sen. Kennedy having been shot.

Mallard took Wayne into the room and placed handguffs on him.

Wayne was taken to the Hotel Security Office, and later to the Gold Room and interviewed by LAPD Personnel. He was released from custody.

Wayne states he did not have a camera, or take any pictures that night. He cannot place a woman in a polke dot dress in the kitchen.

He has not been interviewed by the PBI, Press, or District Attorney's Office.

The only person he recognized in the kitchen area was Roosevelt Grier, and people Wayne only knows by sight, not names. He was not aware of Sirhan's presence in the area prior to the shooting. He has not knowlingly seen Sirhan prior to that night.

Wayne was born in Manchester, England, entered the U.S. in 1951, naturalized in 1960. He professes to be of Jewish background, but not from the Middle East.

He does not know the names of the people he rode with. Just two men and one woman.

WAYNE was re-interviewed by investigating officers. Officers had information that Sirhan or some body resembling Sirhan was in the electrician's booth adjacent to Rafferty's headquarters at the Ambassador Hotel between 10:15 & 11:15 PM the night of the shooting. When WAYNE was questioned about being at this location, he replied that he was uncertain and did not recall.

He had spent the evening at Kennedy headquarters on Wilshire Blvd. From there he wont to McCarthy headquarters at the Hilton and from . there to the Ambassador Hotul. He was not sure of his times, but he estimated somewhere batasan 8 & 10 PM he arrived at the Ambassador. After arriving at the Hotel, he went to the Ambassador Ballroom area, from there to the Colonial Room which he entered via the main hallway. He was refused admittance to the room itsalf, left the room, went hack into the main hall, and from there took a short corridor into the kitchen area and then entered the Colonial Room via the kitchen area. He gained admittance and managed to obtain a press button. With this button he then went to the 5th floor where he mingled with the crowd in the Kennedy suite. When the Senator left his suite to go to the Embassy Room, WAYNE followed. WAYNE recalled going down in an elevator next to the elevator used by the Senator. He went into the kitchen area and after loitering about, was asked to leave. From there he went into the main hall and then into the Embassy Room where he watched part of the speech. He left the Embassy Room via the front entrance and from there entered the kitchen again through a short corridor. He placed himself in the kitchen area somewhere between the ice machines and the doors to the Colonial Room at the time the Senator entered the kitchen area. He did not see the Senator but sawithe group which he assumed the Senator was a part of, entering the kitchen area. His next recollection was that of noises which were the shots from the suspect's gun. He recalled looking in the direction of the sounds and observing the rear of the suspect. He did not see the gun and could not state which hand was holding the gun. Sometime during the struggle with the suspect, he ran into the Colonial Room and picked up several telephones attempting to call for help and

stated he was unable to get a line. He left the Colonial Room and was in the main lobby area by the fountain and was taken into custody by a guard as a possible suspect. He was later released. WAYNE was interviewed on 7-12-63 at 3:30 PM by Sgt. Varney, S.U.S. Unit. This interview goes into more detail regarding WAYNE'S activities that evening. The purpose of the re-interview was to establish whether or not WAYNE was in the electrician's booth prior to the shooting. This could not be substantiated or denied by WAYNE.

On the evening of June 4th, he went to a hotel with a letter from his union stating that their local had voted to support Robert Kennedy for President of the United States. He arrived at the hotel at approximately 9 p.m. He went to the Colonial Room, produced identification, and the letter from the union and was allowed admittance through the Colonial Room through the pantry area leading to the Embassy Room. He stated the pantry area where ABC was doing interviews and he had sandwiches with the television crew, he was standing in this area when Senator Kennedy walked through en route to the stage to make his speech. He gives the following account of the occurrence which followed: I was standing in the pantry when Senator Kennedy passed me after his speech. He came through very fast. I recognized Jesse Unruh, who was with him, and then it seemed like a few seconds later I heard shots. I did not see the Senator when he was shaking hands with anyone. I ran around the partition and saw a man on the floor. There was blood on his head. I ran over to a table and Rosie Grier had a suspect. I did not see Kennedy at this time. 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She indicated that during the Senator's speech, she was about three feet from his right. At the conclusion of the Senator's speech, she exited the stage and followed the Senator clong with the crowd into the kitchen area. At the time of the chooting, the only way she was able to place herself was to indicate that the victim, Paul Schrade, was slightly in front of hor and to her left. She did · not see the suspect with the gun until after the shooting. She recalled hearing eight shots. Her recollection of the secuence of the shets were one, a pause, two shots, a second pause, and then the balance of the shots. She recalled Faul Schride being hit in the head from one of the shots. The only person she could remember in the room uas Sandy VanCher of NBC, whom she heard state, "Get the gun." She had no idea where anyone else was in the room.

10 Mr. Yaro states that on the night of the shooting, 11 he was not working but that he had gone to the Ambassador 12 Hotel in the hopes of getting some pictures of Senator 13 He states he arrived at the Hotel at approximately Kennedy. 14 10:45 P.M. He went directly to the Press Room (Colonial Room) 15 and when the Senator arrived in the Embassy Ballroom, he went 16 in and, while the Senator was making his speech, took about 17 ten photographs. He then went into the pantry area of the 18 kitchen to wait for the Senator to pass through. It was his 19 intention to photograph the Senator as he passed by.

20 Mr. Yaro was accompanied by a Richard Drew who is a 21 reporter for the Pasadena Independent Star News. They were 22 both standing just inside the double doors of the pantry. He 23 had his camera up and was attempting to focus it when Dick 24 Drew stated, "You missed him." At this time. Mr. Yaro states 25 he looked and saw the Senator had passed him and he started 26 to follow behind approximately five or six feet. He again

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put his camera up and at this time heard two shots. He stated they sounded like firecrackers. And then three more shots.

At this time, he stated there were two men standing next to the Senator. When the shooting started, they moved off to the right. He observed the Senator take several steps back and he had his hands and arms up to his head. The suspect was lunging at the Senator and shooting. Then two male Caucasians, one of whom could have been Bill Barry, pounced on the suspect. The gun fell out of the suspect's hand. "I grabbed it but as I did someone grabbed it out of my hand. I then turned and started taking pictures of the Senator. I shot about five more pictures and then left to make sure that I got them to the paper in time to beat the deadline."
