


Mr. Aubry works part-time for the Negro Press Bureau. He had been assigned to cover the Kennedy Campaign since the Oregon Primary, approx. 3 weeks prior.
On the 4th of June he arrived at the Hotel during the early afternoon. Spent most of the evening wondering about the Hotel gathering information. As Senator Kennedy began his speech, Mr. Aubry "floated to the back of the crowd."
He accounts for his time as follows:
After I walked across the back of the room, I walked forward to the Anteroom, right of the stage. I went into the Anteroom, paused for about 20 seconds. Then I noticed Sen. Kennedy coming off of the side of the stage. I walked ahead into the kitchen to stay ahead of the crowd.
As I walked toward the press room, I <u>noticed a man kneeing on the metal</u> table. He was getting down as I <u>pasted him</u> , I bumped his knee.
Described as Male Cauc 25/26 Short Mearing dark sport coat. I walked a few feet further then heard one shot, a pause, then five rapid shots. Two girls in Kennedy dresses brushed by me from between the tables. I turned and saw Senator Kennedy falling down. I stood there for about 30 seconds. I say Rosie Grier come up with Rafer Johnson and grab the suspect. When they grabbed him, I turned and went into the Colonial Room. I yelled for someonel to help"We need a doctor and a priest." I spun around and went back into the kitchen. I went to the area of the scuffling. Rosie had the suspect by the neck. I yelled at him to let up a little "Take it easy." I went around the table and saw Booker (Booker Griffin) trying to hit the suspect. I yelled at him, telling him not to do that. There was lots of yelling. I went over by Kennedy and knelt beside him. Barry grabbed me by the neck and threw me back. I moved over by the Employment Eating Area (indicated on mock- up) for 2 or 3 minutes. (Con't)

I saw the police arise and take the suspect of through the kitchen (indicated the same direction as Kennedy was removed).

When I first saw the struggle, I saw a guy name George striking at the suspect. He works for a Culver City outfit. I'll get his name for you.

My photographer shot pictures; about 15 or 20 minutes after the shooting. He was not in the kitchen when the struggle was going on.

His name is Cliff Hall.

I think Booker was in the Ballroom when the shots were fired.

By the time we hit 16 the kitchen area now we're going to the right of the platform, 17 we hit the kitchen area I would say--I would say I was about, 18 I estimate 5-6 feet at the most, maybe, in front of the 19 Senator. Because I looked back and he was grabbing hands 20 again, this slows him down, so just then I heard these, I thought it was Chinese firecrackers, going "pow, pow," and I 21 22 turned around and I just saw like a flash, you know, I thought 23 it was still firecrackers until I seen a figure go, and I see another figure just like people and then I just hollered, "My 24 God, that was Kennedy." 25 I just--

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room.

Usually there is a lot of things laying around and I always watch for 12 something, and then I just made a--several more steps when I 13 heard the first report. And I turned around again and, as I 14 say, this was in my mind, who was shooting Chinese firecrackers 15 in this area, you know, it was the thing, and right away, just 16 impulsive, I say, "Oh, my God," I just saw this blue (*) just 17 like--it was blue to me because two or three people who come 18 in from this area after we, you know, as I said, right at the 19 beginning of this steam table, there is an entrance coming 20 from back--from this way from in the kitchen, see. 21

Q Uh huh.

So when he came--he was coming this way, these Α 23 people were running to grab his hands and I looked around, I 24 just saw a--like a flash, like maybe something from a fire-25 cracker, then as I say, it was just going, though, "pow, pow, 26

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pow, pow," and this fellow, I just saw three or four people 1 2 running and hollering, "ai--a," and this one guy hit him in the mouth, hit this fellow that I saw in the mouth because 3 he was standing against the -- the counter this way. Another 4 thing I saw two people standing, looked like they was standing 5 6 on top of the seat, you know how people get on top of things? On top of the table? 7 0 I thought he had jumped--I thought he was just a 8 Α 9 quy that had jumped down on, you know, fell into the crowd. 10 But then I thought he was being pushed, just everything came 11 into my mind. 9 Ά That's right, I yelled to this--there was a lady on 10 the phone and she hung it up right away. I said, "Call a 11 doctor immediately and get a priest back here." That's it. 12 When I got back, there was a young doctor, somebody said, 13 "Let him in, he's a doctor." He was in a little jacket, I 14 think. (*)

This guy that you described as a male Latin, was he Q standing behind you or to the side of you as you were going 17 out? Now, Kennedy was to your rear, you say, about ---

18 I didn't even notice him as an individual going Α 19 out, I mean, you know, I went--I went ahead, you know, it was 20 just as I said, the crowd thinning out remarkably because they 21 would come to (*) just like in San Diego, I guess had no 22 control--

I said. 17 "Get down," I mean, that the last report was finished, but I 18 still didn't know this, again, who was there, what was there, 19 I said, "Get down and stay down." But-how many was there.

Q You really didn't get any indication that there was anybody helping him, is that correct or not correct?

A Not at that time, no. Somebody later on, you hear a lot of reports, said--

Q No, not what you hear, just what you saw yourself.
A Well, I didn't get any.

Q Any indication at all?

Witness indicated he was and the suspect then extended his hand and stated, "Shake hands with another Democrat." Witness shook hands with suspect and the two began conversing. Witness did not recall the conversation in its entirety or the sequence of the remarks. Some of the conversation went as follows: (All questions that follow are by suspect) Q. Have you seen Kennedy before. A. Yes, several times. Q. How long has Kennedy been staying in the hotel and/or where is he staying. Witness did not recall the answer to this question. There was a question regarding protection or security in the hotel. Witness indicated to suspect he assumed there was some type of security, but didn't know what it was.

Witness recalled a fireman entering the room and the suspect engaging him in conversation, as to what he was and what he did. Witness felt the suspect was not aware that the fireman was a fireman. Witness recalled the fireman answered the suspect's questions by stating he was there for fire safety and crowd control. The fireman left and returned a short time later. Witness recalled no conversation with the suspect during the fireman's absence, as he was working. Also, he recalled no conversation between the suspect and the fireman when he returned. After returning the fireman remained a short time and left again. The suspect left shortly after the fireman. Witness did not know if the suspect followed the fireman.

Witness indicated to investigating officer that his first impression of the suspect was that he was half drunk. His opinion was formed because the suspect had a drink in his hand and was very talkative. When suspect first approached victim and began talking, victim recalled his impression at the time was "Here comes another drunk." Witness stated that in working for the hotel he often comes across drunks at conventions and other functions who want to talk.

When guestioned by investigating officer, witness reported that he does not drink himself. He did not recall the suspect stagger into the room nor sway, as an intoxicated person would, while seated. He had no recollection of the suspect's facial appearance indicating intoxication, i.e. flushed face, bloodshot eyes. Witness could not recall suspect drinking from the half full glass during the time (15 minute period) that he was in the electricians booth. The suspect did not leave his glass in the booth. It was witness's final opinion that had the suspect not been carrying a glass he would have considered him merely a talkative person.

This was a re-interview. On a prior interview, witness accurately described the suspect by physical description and clothing. Investigating officer showed witness 8 look-alike mugs, including one of the suspect. Witness quickly picked the suspect's picture, but admitted he had seen the photograph at a prior interview and in the paper.

On 6-4-68 at approx. 3:30 PM, BRESLIN observed two young people (Hippies) passing out orange and black bumper stickers, which stated, in effect, "Expose Kennedy Death Hoax." He brought this to the attention of Mort GOODMAN, Hotel Public Relations, who took care of the situation. BRESLIN confirms earlier reports that these stickers referred to John KENNEDY, not Robert Kennedy.

BRESLIN states there were never any serious complaints from the press, that Kennedy gave them all a fair shake. He discounts any story that Kennedy made a last minute decision to have a press conference to appease anyone.


