ACCOMMODATE PERSONNEL INVOLVED IN INVESTIGATION.

INVESTIGATION TO BE UNDER COMMAND OF CAPTAIN HUGH BROWN, CENTRAL HOMICIDE DETAIL, WHO HAS BEEN DETACHED FROM CENTRAL HOMICIDE FOR THIS PURPOSE. DIRECTLY UNDER HIM WILL BE LIEUTENANTS CHARLES HIGBY, ROY KEENE AND MANUEL PENE. THE INVESTIGATIVE STAFF CONSISTS OF SEVENTEEN DETECTIVE SERGEANTS INCLUDING A DETECTIVE SERGEANT FROM THE SCIENTIFIC INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION (SID), WHO IS A POLYGRAPH EXPERT. THIS FORCE WILL BE FURTHER ASSISTED BY ONE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT WHO IS A CIVILIAN NOT YET IDENTIFIED WHO WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR INDEXING AND MAINTAINING OF FILES AND INVESTIGATIVE REPORTS. ARRANGEMENTS ARE BEING MADE FOR INSTALLATION OF SIX OUTSIDE AND SIX INSIDE TELEPHONE LINES AS WELL AS APPROPRIATE FURNITURE, SUPPLIES AND AUTOMOTIVE EQUIPMENT.

INSPECTOR POWERS ADVISED THE PERSONNEL INVOLVED IN THIS UNDERTAKING COMPRISE THREE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE YEARS OF POLICE EXPERIENCE, THE AVERAGE YEARS OF EXPERIENCE BEING FIFTEEN YEARS AND FOUR MONTHS. THIS ORGANIZATIONAL SETUP WILL OPERATE WITH DAY AND NIGHT WATCH AND PERSONNEL WILL BE ON TELEPHONE DUTY ON A TWENTY-FOUR HOUR BASIS TO RECEIVE TELEPHONE CALLS WITH RESPECT TO THIS INVESTIGATION.

AT NOON TODAY A.L. WIRIN, ACLU ATTORNEY, HAD CONFERENCE OF PRESS NEAR LOS ANGELES COUNTY JAIL AND IN EFFECT SAID HE HAD VISITED SIRHAN EVERY DAY EXCEPT SUNDAY AND HAD VISITED TWICE ON MONDAY. ADVISED HIS VISITS WERE AT REQUEST OF SIRHAN WHO HAS HAD NO OTHER VISITORS. SAID HE HAD TAKEN HIM SEVERAL BOOKS ON "CULTISM" NOT NAMED (POSSIBLY ON ROSICRUCIANS) AND WAS GOING TO HAVE LOS ANGELES COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION PICK AN ATTORNEY FROM A LIST WIRIN HAD PREPARED. NO CRITICISM OF PUBLIC DEFENDER. ALSO ADVISED THAT SIRHAN HAD NO COMPLAINTS OF HIS TREATMENT. SAID ARRANGEMENTS MADE TO HAVE SIRHAN EXERCISE IN FRONT OFFICE CELL.

POOL HALLS IN PASADENA AREA MENTIONED BY BROTHERS AS THOSE IN WHICH THEY HAD PLAYED CHECKED. SIRHAN NOT RECOGNIZED IN TWO OF POOL HALLS AND KNOWN AS CASUAL PLAYER IN ANOTHER BUT NOT SEEN THERE ON JUNE FOUR LAST.

JAMES MC MANUS HAD ADVISED SALINGER THAT ON MAY TWENTY NINE, LAST, WHEN HE, MC MANUS, ARRIVED IN LOS ANGELES TO SET UP KENNEDY HEADQUARTERS AT AMBASSADOR HOTEL HE WAS APPROACHED IN THE COLONIAL ROOM BY AN INDIVIDUAL WHO ASKED FOR A SCHEDULE OF ACTIVITIES FOR SENATOR KENNEDY' FOR THE PERIOD OF JUNE FOUR TO FIVE, NINETEEN SIXTY EIGHT. In connection with the death of Robert F. Kennedy, United States Senator, I believe, I have some useful information concerning the person held in custody, as far as I can identify him from the news photo. This information dates back to 1952 Santa Monica, California, an attempt of assassination; I at that time recognized him from Tangier, where I served as International Narcotics Police Officer until 1938.

I am a distant cousin of Robert F. Kennedy and in 1953 he came to me for help in some difficulties originating from San Francisco, it could be a continuation of the same matters.

I have written the Family a condolence letter, but did not mention anything about the above matters.

Enclosed herewith for Los Angeles Division are 16 photographs; eight of which were taken by free lance photographer PETER SPENCER BERKSON (those bearing number COA-75092 on reverse side) and eight of which were taken by Life Magazine photographer BILL EPPRIDGE (those bearing EPPRIDGE's stamp on reverse side).

On 6/8/68, RICHARD POLLARD, Life Photo Editor, Time and Life Building, New York, New York, made available to SA JOHN MILTON JONES the enclosed photographs. He stated that Life Magazine purchased the roll of Berkson film because it contained some overall photographs of the scene immediately following the shooting, which he said appears to be the only ones available to his firm as all other photographs taken by Life photographer of ensuing action of shooting scene are of victims.

POLLARD explained that colored film purchased from BERKSON is being developed in black and white and is currently in early process of this development, which according to him is quite time consuming. He said that in addition his photo laboratory is swamped with film to be processed of the current coverage being afforded the

funeral of ROBERT KENNEDY. POLLARD stated that when the BERKSON film was first received he edited the frames and selected about eight shots, of the corridor scene of the shooting and had these immediately developed. He made these photographs available and they are enclosed.

POLLARD advised that the BERKSON film contained some photographs of what appeared to be BERKSON's relatives in addition to the photographs BERKSON took at the Embassy Room and corridor to kitchen of Ambassador Hotel. He said that he would make available copies of all pertinent photographs taken on the roll by BERKSON at the Ambassador Hotel, but, that such photographs will not be available until early morning hours of 6/10/68.

POLLARD disclosed that Life Photographer BILL EPBRIDGE was assigned to cover the KENNEDY Campaign and was at the scene of the shooting and also obtained photographs prior to and immediately following the shooting. He made available eight photographs taken by EPBRIDGE, for whatever value they may be worth. These photographs are also enclosed.

POLLARD said that he understood that EPBRIDGE was very close to ROBERT KENNEDY at the time of shooting and that soon after Mrs. KENNEDY rushed to her husband's side she immediately asked the press and everyone to move back, but allowed EPBRIDGE to remain because she personally knows EPBRIDGE.

Enclosed photograph number 5, taken by BERKSON shows EPBRIDGE at right where small arrow has been placed on border edge. Photograph number 8, also by BERKSON, shows position of EPBRIDGE. A small x has been placed just above his head on border. He is person with camera to his eye.

This material contains many notations indicating the writer's desire to assassinate Senator Kennedy, Ambassador Goldwater, The President and indicates the writer is strongly influenced by Communism and the Arab Republic. Laboratory examination to date of extremely limited known handwriting of Sirhan Sirhan has not resulted in the identification of Sirhan as the writer of this material. Los Angeles is attempting to obtain further examples of Sirhan Sirhan's handwriting. The Laboratory has obtained numerous latent fingerprints from this material, 49 of which have been identified with Sirhan Sirhan's fingerprints to date. It appears advisable to obtain known handwriting and major case fingerprints from Sirhan's family, including his four brothers, to determine if any of these individuals have written any of the material or handled it.

Colonel Rubenstein, former Agent who was subsequently with OSI and Headquarters Staff, Air Force Security, and is now associated with the Mosler Safe Company, advised me that on a recent trip he met one Shmuel Ruth, who is now assigned to the Israeli Mission in New York City, 850 Third Avenue, New York, New York 10022, Suite 604, telephone 212 Plaza 2-5687 or Plaza 2-5600.

Ruth was formerly Chief Superintendent of the Israeli Police, head of the Criminal Investigative Division. This is the top agency of the country that has over-all jurisdiction, according to Colonel Rubenstein. *Mo*

Ruth said that he was greatly concerned about the recent killing of Senator Kennedy and the whole matter seemed to be incongruous to him. He said he had some information which may have a bearing on this case in view of his extensive knowledge concerning Arabs, their thinking and habits.

According to Rubenstein, he was with the British police before Israeli became independent and has a lifetime background of police work.

Attached for approval is a memorandum to the White House with copies to the Vice President and the Department summarizing developments relating to the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. Enclosed with the memorandum are copies of material found by FBI Agents and Los Angeles police officers in a search of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan's room. This material relates to notations possibly by Sirhan threatening in nature against President Johnson, Senator Kennedy and Ambassador Goldberg. Of significance is one statement that "Robert F. Kennedy must be assassinated before 5 June 68."

In summary, the attached memorandum to the White House briefly sets forth results of additional inquiries into Sirhan's background, interviews with his brothers and the fact that we have insufficient samples of Sirhan's known handwriting specimens to identify the notations appearing on the above-referred-to material. Additional specimens are being obtained. With respect to statements by Samuel W. Yorty of Los Angeles that Sirhan is affiliated with the WEB Dubois Clubs, we advise that no information has been developed to establish this fact at this time.

The following details do not appear in the letter-head memorandum. One Terry Mickey Welch, a former exercise boy with the Granja Vista Del Rio Thoroughbred Horse Farm at Corona, California, where Sirhan was employed, was interviewed by our Detroit Office and claimed to know Sirhan well. He last saw him during May of 1967 and advised while Sirhan was, prior to his accident when he fell from a horse in September, 1966, good natured, popular, gentlemanly and ambitious, he underwent a complete personality change becoming quiet, aloof, unpredictable and a "loner." Welch alleges Sirhan, to his knowledge, was anti-communist and did not appear to be prejudiced against race or nationality.

He named among individuals knowing Sirhan, T.V. personalities Desi Arnez, Buddy Ebson and Dale Robertson all of whom kept horses at Granja Vista Del Rio.

Of interest is the fact that the District Attorney in Los Angeles County, who is prosecuting Sirhan, is Evelle Jansen Younger, a former Bureau Agent. Younger entered on duty December 9, 1940, he was placed on leave without pay for military purposes May 2, 1942, and submitted his voluntary resignation effective 12/5/45, as he did not desire to return to active duty. His services were satisfactory.

ACTION:

(1) Attached for approval is a letterhead memorandum for the White House with copies to the Vice President, the Attorney General, Deputy Attorney General, and Civil Rights Division.

(2) In view of the fact that the material found in Sirhan's room bearing threatening notations ~~is~~ of direct interest to the Secret Service, CIA and the State Department, if approved, copies of this material will be made available to these agencies.

(3) All phases of this investigation are being pressed to the utmost.



With respect to the information dealing with previous employment of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan at the Granja Vista Del Rio Thoroughbred Horse Farm at Corona, California, and the fact he apparently underwent a personality change after falling from a horse during September, 1966, this specific information was not contained in the memorandum that went to the White House on June 7, 1968, since it represented the opinion of only one individual and did not differ in substance from information previously furnished the White House. Accordingly, in the interest of brevity and in keeping our memorandum as succinct as possible, it was not repeated.

In connection with the material which was obtained from Sirhan's room in the Pasadena family home, much of it containing notations threatening not only the life of Kennedy but President Johnson and Ambassador Goldberg, copies of this material were disseminated June 7, 1968, by liaison to Secret Service, CIA, and State Department in view of their interest in the matter.

Early in the afternoon of June 7, 1968, the Laboratory concluded its examination of the material and it was forwarded the Identification Division for processing for latent prints. The Identification Division completed its examination late on June 7, 1968, the evidence was returned immediately to Los Angeles and at 10:30 a.m., Los Angeles time, June 10, 1968, the material was turned over to Lieutenant Charles Hughes, Rampart Division, Los Angeles Police Department.

FLOYD ARMSTEAD, Instructor, Mathematics Department, Olympic College, Bremerton, Washington, advised on June 6, 1968 that on the morning of June 6, 1968 while he and some Olympic College students were in a discussion with a student named SULAIMAN NOSAYAN, the latter made some statements concerning the assassination of New York Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY in Los Angeles, California, June 5, 1968.

Mr. ARMSTEAD stated that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN — said the assassin of KENNEDY was "justified in doing what he did". He said that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN further said he knew the assassin personally, having met him in San Francisco. However, he did not indicate the closeness of their relationship. Mr. ARMSTEAD said that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN also remarked "you must remember that this took place one year from June 5" (of last year). Mr. ARMSTEAD said further that SULAIMAN NOSAYAN was apparently well informed concerning the statements of Senator KENNEDY and pointed out that Senator KENNEDY had recently made statements supporting the shipment of arms to Israel. Mr. ARMSTEAD said that he, ARMSTEAD, told SULAIMAN NOSAYAN that "you (Arabs) will not get anywhere by blood shed" whereupon SULAIMAN NOSAYAN said "we'll be back again" (apparently referring to the Arab-Israeli dispute).
