

The enclosed items consisting of various notes, books, and writings found in the room of the subject were obtained by the Los Angeles Police Department as evidence. United States Attorney WILLIAM MATTHEW BYRNE, JR., Central District of California, has been in contact with the office of Los Angeles County District Attorney EVELLE YOUNGER. Mr. BYRNE states this material should be handled like all other evidence, that is, the contents should remain confidential and not be disclosed publically prior to trial or to unauthorized individuals. Mr. BYRNE added that should the contents be disclosed, it could have a serious adverse effect involving successful prosecution in either Federal or State court and could neddlessly subject the Federal Government to adverse criticism.

Taking all factors into consideration and if feasible, the Bureau may desire to consider the processing of the enclosed material for fingerprints. In addition, the Bureau is requested to make appropriate handwriting comparisons to establish the identity of the author and or owner. In addition, the Bureau is requested to conduct all other known possible types of examinations of the material that may be of benefit to the investigation and prosocution of this case or may be pertinent at any future

Deputy Attorney General Warren Christopher called with reference to captioned matter. He said he had received a call from Deputy Chief of Police Robert A. Houghton. Houghton is handling the special squad for the District Attorney's Office who has been investigating this matter. Our office has worked closely with the District Attorney's Office and the local police department.

Christopher stated that Houghton had inquired as to whether anything could be done to accelerate submission of the reports in this matter. I advised Christopher that I had been in touch with Departmental Attorney Lynch of the Criminal Division and had advised him that we were hopeful to have the report in proper shape by Monday, June 17, 1968. Christopher said that if there were any portions which he could read, he would appreciate being furnished them. I advised him that the report would be submitted in toto to the Department and that we were working on some exhibits which we thought would be helpful in submission of the reports. (These are photos being reproduced which have been made from copies previously submitted. Such photocopies are much more readable.)

He also inquired as to whether any information or contact with Central Intelligence Agency would be furnished. I advised him that any information which we had received pertinent to this investigation would be submitted to him. If the information was furnished by CIA and was labeled "Secret," it would have to be handled separately. (In this connection, I am not aware of any information which falls into this category.) I also advised him that if the information was from a confidential source, we would not identify the source, but would furnish the information. It was pointed out that if the disclosure of the information would identify the source, that it would have to be properly labeled. In any event, the report would contain the information which was pertinent to this case. REC 11 62 - 587 - 424

Christopher thanked me and said that he was hopeful he would be able to get the report sometime Monday. I told him the report would be sent through appropriate channels and when in proper form would be submitted to the Department.

The report is in final form. We are assembling it and it will be ready for transmittal on Monday, June 17, 1968.

Secret Service notifying New York City Police Department (NYCPD) of Freenen's call. Bufiles on Freenen negative and Secret Service was so advised.

BACKGROUND:

New York teletype, 8:29 p.m., 6/8/68, captioned as above, advised that Bureau of Special Services, NYCPD, arrested DeDell on 6/8/68 at 9:30 a.m. in front of St. Patrick's Cathedral. DeDell possessed official invited guest pass. When challenged, he surrendered his attache case which contained unloaded .38 caliber revolver. He identified himself as from Syracuse, New York, and had New York State pistol permit for the revolver in his possession. NYCPD arrested him on charge this permit not valid in New York City.

At 3:05 a.m., 6/9/68, T. R. Rudd, Intelligence Division, Secret Service, telephonically advised Duty Supervisor Goble of a telephone call he had received at 2:35 a.m., 6/9/68, from a male identifying himself as Bob Freenen, 3671 Florence Street, New York City.""Rudd said Freenen told him he was a juvenile and Freenen referred to DeDell. Freenen told Rudd that DeDell white. intended to go into St. Patrick's Cathedral "to shoot Teddy Kennedy." According to Rudd, he asked Freenen how he knew this and Freenen replied: "I'm the one who plotted the whole thing," then chuckled and hung up. Rudd said he had already furnished this information to the New York Office of Secret Service and instructed it to furnish the information to the NYCPD. He said he was furnishing it to us for our information. He said he thinks the call might have been a hoax, or the caller a "nut." REC 11 6 2 - 5



The order was packaged and Los Angeles was placing it on Trans World Airlines Flight #62 which was scheduled to depart Los Angeles Airport at 10:50 p.m., 6-15-68, and arrive at Friendship International Airport at 6:20 a.m., 6-16-68. The package was to be delivered to the Operations Center, U.S. Department of State, who had received instructions from the Deputy Attorney General concerning this matter.

The above information was telephonically furnished to Duty Agent James E. Ritter, Washington Field Office, at 7:35 p.m., 6-15-68, and Ritter stated an Agent of the Washington Field Office would pick up the package and deliver it to the State Department the morning of 6-16-68.

In connection with our investigation into the shooting of Senator Kennedy at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, California, on the night of June 4 - 5, 1968, of interest is the fact that we have located and interviewed a college student by the name of Paul W. Grieco who was in the kitchen area waiting for the Senator to complete his speech. As Senator Kennedy came into view approximately ten to twelve feet from him he heard several shots then saw the Senator lying on the floor. Grieco immediately knelt by him attempting to stop the bleeding with his hand and according to Grieco, Kennedy asked him "Is Paul all right? Is everybody all right?" He then apparently lapsed into unconsciousness. Grieco did not see Sirhan Bishara Sirhan the assailant until after attempting to comfort the Senator and after Sirhan had been restrained.

Witnesses have been located who have positively identified Sirhan as being in the hotel area up to three hours before the shooting. The most recent, Judy Marie Royar, private secretary to former California Governor Pat Brown, while not observing the shooting, has positively identified Sirhan as an individual she had seen at approximately 10:00 o'clock in the vicinity of the Embassy Ballroom.

Our investigation has developed several instances wherein individuals traveling abroad in Europe and the Middle East between May 15 - 18, 1968, heard reports from various sources of an alleged assassination of Senator Kennedy. These reports appear to stem from erroneous releases from Européan news media at about that time. We are currently conducting investigation to obtain full facts with respect to this situation and in particular we are attempting to pin down the origin of this story.




