**ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR
ROBERT F. KENNEDY**

On 6/17/68, Mr. EDWARD GREEN, Hickory Lane, Binghamton, N.Y., furnished the following information:

He graduated from St. Gregory's College, Shawnee, Oklahoma, a two-year school, during the first week of June, 1968, and returned to his parents' home in Binghamton, N.Y. On a Sunday night in May, 1968, possibly 5/12 or 5/19/68, television comedian DICK GREGORY was on the campus of St. Gregory's College giving a talk at the gymnasium and GREEN heard part of it. After GREGORY's talk, he went to the Commons and spoke to a large group of students numbering about 150, according to GREEN, and GREEN walked in during the middle of this talk by GREGORY.

GREGORY made some comment about Mayor LINDSEY of New York and Sen. KENNEDY of N.Y., would be shot before the election. GREEN did not hear the entire talk, but on the following day discussed it with 2 of his classmates, GREGORY SMITH, 119-18 232nd St., Cambria Heights, N.Y., telephone 528-2924, and CHARLES SHIRO, 100 Ludlow Ave., Spring Lake, N.J., 449-7828.

GREEN stated he personally did not hear GREGORY make the statement, but did hear a student question GREGORY about what GREGORY had just said, and GREGORY replied that he had received the information from a reliable source. GREEN

GENERAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

Attached concerns alleged statement made by Dick Gregory on campus of Saint Gregory's College, Shawnee, Oklahoma, during mid-May, 1968, to effect that Senator Robert F. Kennedy or Mayor Lindsay of New York would be shot before the election. We are making inquiry of some individuals who were in attendance in order to get true facts. Upon conclusion of our inquiry, consideration will be given as to whether interview of Gregory is warranted.

is certain it had something to do with Sen. KENNEDY and Mayor LINDSEY, and the comment was made by GREGORY that they would be shot before the election. During the discussion the following morning, GREGORY SMITH stated he had heard the entire talk and commented that GREGORY allegedly said either Mayor LINDSEY or Sen. KENNEDY would be shot.

GREEN stated he left the campus in Shawnee, Oklahoma, a few days before the assassination of Sen. KENNEDY and was enroute to his home in Binghamton, N.Y., when he heard the news of the assassination. Therefore, he does not know what reaction took place on the college campus after the assassination. He said he felt that there was somewhere between 100 and 200 students, in the Commons Meeting Hall when GREGORY allegedly made his statement.

Albany indices contain no information regarding this incident and it is being furnished to the Oklahoma City Office for action deemed advisable by OC. No further investigation being conducted by Albany Office.

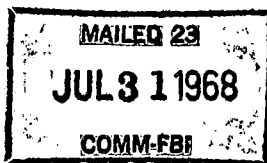

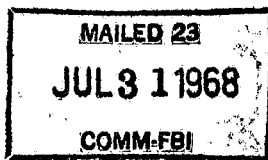

On 6/18/68, JERRY JENKINS, 710th Military Intelligence Detachment (MID), Honolulu, Hawaii, telephonically advised that he had learned that day from a Sergeant HICKS of the Mililani Recruiting Station, Honolulu, that one JOHN RODNEY JUSTICE, Skylane Inn, 2628 Waiwai Loop, Room 260, Telephone 814-251, was in the process of enlisting in the U.S. Army. JUSTICE, according to JENKINS' information, was a witness to the assassination of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY in Los Angeles and had either been an aid or on the staff of the KENNEDY party. JENKINS related that he had been informed that JUSTICE had been interviewed by the Los Angeles Police Department.

It is being left to the discretion of the Office of Origin as to whether or not any available photographs be shown to JUSTICE relating to the unknown female wearing a polka-dot dress at the Ambassador Hotel on the night of 6/4/68. It is to be noted that JUSTICE will probably be in the Honolulu area for only about two weeks while being processed for enlistment in the Army.

It is further being left to the discretion of the Office of Origin as to whether or not RICK ROSEN, mentioned in enclosed FD-302, be interviewed and to further identify the girl, (FNU) O'SULLIVAN, for possible interview.

JUSTICE is presently residing with his father, RICHARD J. JUSTICE, Skylane Inn; and his dad is currently employed by B. G. Marine Services, 1375 Dillingham Boulevard, Suite 201.

JOHN RODMAN JUSTICE, Skylane Inn, Room 260, 2628 Waiwai Loop, advised that he had worked on the staff of the party of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY in the Los Angeles area, working out of 5615 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, having obtained this job through one TOM BRADEN, who resides in Oceanside, California. JUSTICE related that in this capacity, he was at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, on the evening of June 4, 1968.

JUSTICE related that in the early evening of June 4, 1968, he was in the serving area of the Embassy Room adjacent to the back right of the podium helping one RICK ROSEN keeping people from going into the serving area from the Embassy Room.

Sometime between 10:00 and 11:00 p.m. on June 4, 1968, JUSTICE observed a man and a woman in the serving area who, according to JUSTICE, were "definitely together," and this couple looked suspicious.

JUSTICE related that he asked this man to clear the area and the man said that he was with CBS. He was then asked if he was with the camera crew and this man said, "Yes." According to JUSTICE, members of the press were supposed to have a yellow press badge in their possession but that neither one of this couple had such a badge visible and JUSTICE did not ask this couple to display a press badge.

According to JUSTICE, while this couple was in the serving area the man made a phone call which was about fifteen minutes in length, and after completing this call the couple disappeared through the serving area and this was the last time that JUSTICE had seen them.

JUSTICE thought that he recalled that this girl was carrying a manila type folder.

JUSTICE advised that he feels sure he could identify the unknown female from photographs but he does not believe that he could identify the unknown man and that he has been unable to identify the man as SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, whose photographs have appeared in the newspapers.

JUSTICE related that late in the evening the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY left the podium in the Embassy Room and walked through the serving area and within a minute or so after KENNEDY walked through the serving area, JUSTICE advised that he heard three "pops" which sounded like firecrackers. This noise came from behind where JUSTICE was standing. Upon hearing these three "pops," JUSTICE turned around and a large group of people was moving from the noise area. According to JUSTICE, there was panic. He related that he did not realize that the noises he heard were gun shots. JUSTICE advised that there was a time lapse of one-half hour to forty-five minutes between the aforementioned unknown man making a call from the serving area to the time when he heard these three "pops."

JUSTICE advised that he went to the area where the shooting occurred but did not see the suspect nor did he hear any woman in a polka-dot dress saying anything to the effect that "We shot him."

According to JUSTICE, RICK ROSEN, 11030 Agua Vista Street, Apartment 40, Los Angeles, Telephone 985-5841, and a girl, (First Name Unknown) last name believed to be O'SULLIVAN, observed the shooting of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and in all probability could describe the entire incident.

San Diego is requested to immediately forward a photograph of MC BRIDE to San Antonio, and San Antonio is requested to exhibit said photograph to NORMAN JOSEPH KENNEDY, JR., and ascertain if MC BRIDE is identical with the individual NORMAN JOSEPH KENNEDY, JR., knows as "JIMMY."

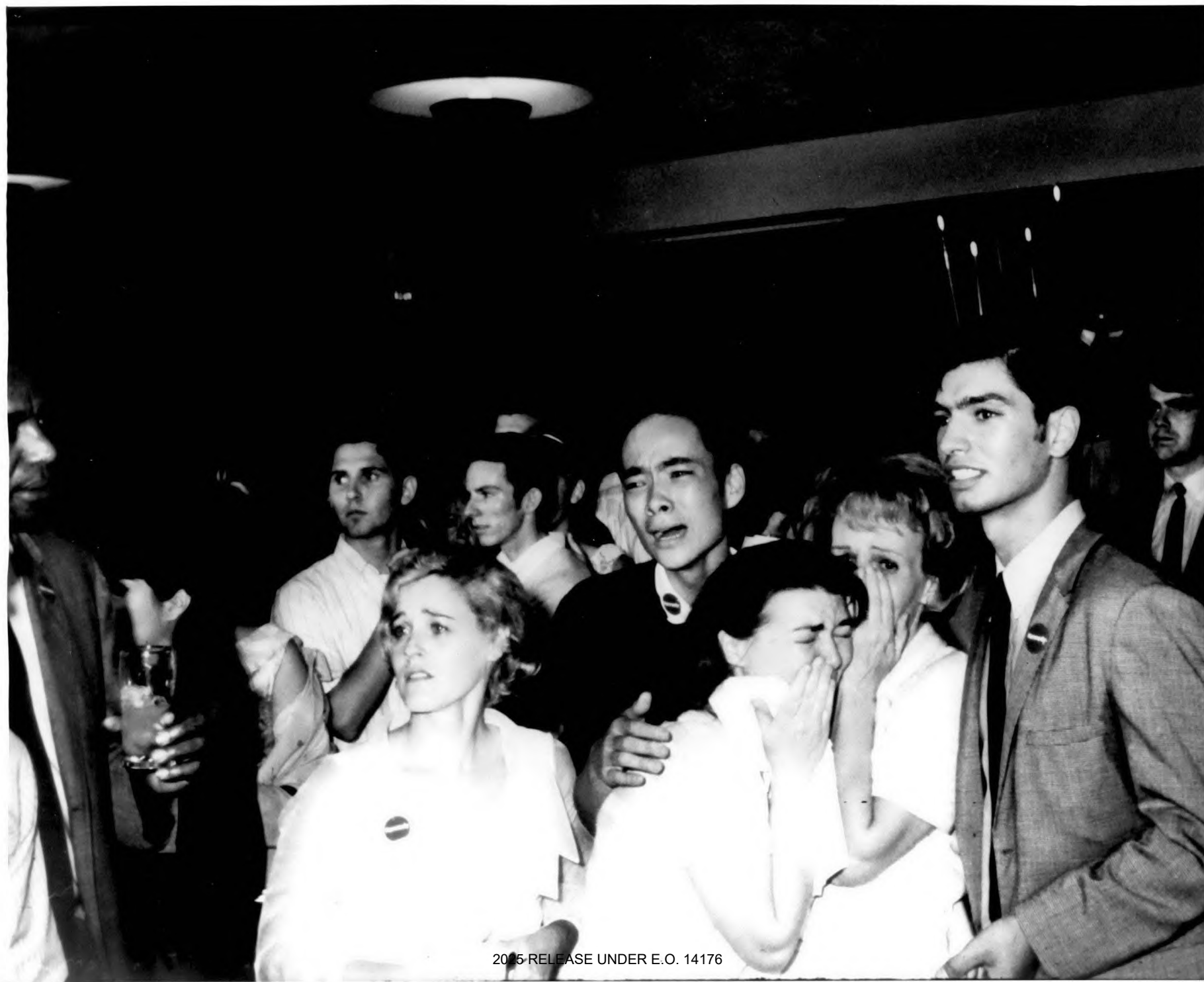

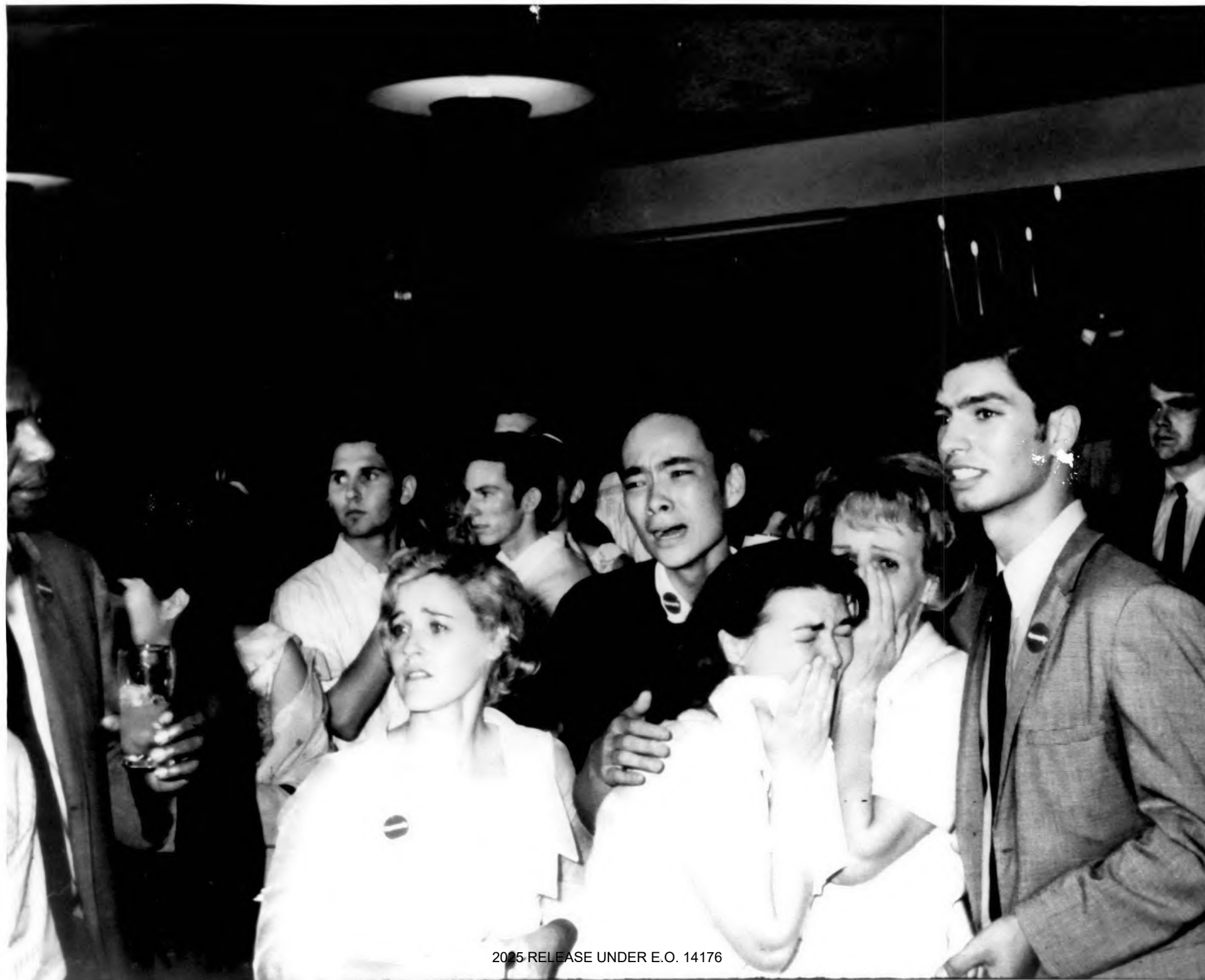
