

people at this party were members of the Du Bois Club at Venice. This party was broken up by the police and the majority of the persons present arrested. DRIGGS states the names of persons present were in a local paper with photos of the party and that about 1/3 of the people at the beach party were also present at the party at SERHARND's home on 7/4/65.

DRIGGS stated he has lived in California off and on since 1961 doing "day work" and living with friends and sleeping on the beach. DRIGGS has been unable to locate other photos he took at the party at SERHARND's home and believes they have been destroyed. DRIGGS described the Communist literature in SERHARND's home as approximately 90% dealing with Communist aims and objectives in Latin America. The other literature dealt with alleged American atrocities in Vietnam and the alleged use of chemical warfare by the United States in Vietnam.

DRIGGS stated he could only describe one pamphlet specifically and this concerned with chemical warfare. DRIGGS stated he does not remember the size of the pamphlet however, the cover bore a photo of an alleged American airplane spraying something. DRIGGS stated that it looked almost like a cropduster to him. DRIGGS stated this literature was spread on a table at SERHARND's home during the party.

For further information of Los Angeles, a separate case has been opened at Cincinnati captioned, ROBERT LEE DRIGGS, SM - C, Cincinnati file 100-17655. Any information concerning KENSALT resulting from information furnished by DRIGGS or information concerning DRIGGS' activities developed by Los Angeles should be furnished to the referenced file as well as KENSALT.

For the information of WFO, DRIGGS did not go to Washington as planned, however, he now tentatively plans to leave for Washington, D. C. on 6/15/68 or 6/16/68, and to arrive at Washington by 6/19/68, to participate in the demonstration scheduled for that date.

A report totaling 1,082 pages has been received from the Los Angeles Office setting forth results of FBI investigation through June 9, 1968, into the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. It contains photographs and charts depicting the area where the shooting occurred, as well as photographs of Senator Kennedy immediately prior to autopsy.

The report, which is four volumes plus two volumes of exhibits, has a brief succinct synopsis, a table of contents, and an index.

The report has been thoroughly reviewed for accuracy and content. Minor typographical corrections have been made; however, over-all, the Los Angeles Office has done an excellent job in its preparation and has indicated a second report will be forthcoming within the next few days.

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION SET FORTH IN REPORT:

Senator Kennedy, following victory speech at Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, left podium at approximately 12:15 a.m., 6-5-68. As he and a number of his staff walked toward the Colonial Room to attend a press conference, he was shot three times in corridor leading to hotel kitchen. One bullet entered his head in right mastoid area. Two bullets entered under the right arm, one lodging in the neck near the spine, the second exiting the body. Five other persons also wounded, none critically.

Witnesses to the assault have been interviewed and several positively identified Sirhan Bishara Sirhan as the assailant. Sirhan was subdued by two hotel employees, assisted by Roosevelt Grier, professional football player, and Rafer Johnson, Olympic decathlon champion.

Confusion existed immediately following shooting and same situation prevailed at the emergency hospital where Kennedy was first taken. He was thereafter taken to Good Samaritan Hospital where brain surgery was performed and he expired at 1:44 a.m., 6-6-68.

The Los Angeles Police Department has established that the murder weapon was an eight-shot Iver Johnson . 22 caliber revolver. All 8 cylinders in chamber contained expended cartridges. One bullet removed from Kennedy determined to have been fired from this revolver.

The Los Angeles Police Department furnished copy of their initial interview with Sirhan which was taped. Sirhan repeatedly advised of his rights by Los Angeles Police Department officers. The interview appears to have been conducted in an appropriate manner but it was totally unproductive and irrelevant.

No motive has been established for the killing beyond the probative value deduced from literature which Sirhan possessed and writings taken from his room which show he was deeply disturbed concerning the relations between Arabs and Jews.

Considerable investigation has been conducted concerning the background of Sirhan and his family, which consists of his mother and four brothers, all of whom have resided in Pasadena, California, area since they entered the United States. The father, the mother, subject Sirhan, two brothers and a sister came to the United States in 1957. Two other brothers came to this country in 1960. Sirhan's sister died in 1960. Sirhan resides with his mother and three brothers in house in Pasadena. His father currently resides in Jerusalem.

Sirhan attended Pasadena City schools, graduating from high school in June, 1963. He entered Pasadena City College immediately thereafter until his dismissal for poor scholastic record in May, 1965.

While attending Pasadena City College, he was employed as a gas station attendant and subsequent to dismissal from school, he was employed as an exercise boy for race horses and as clerk in a health foods store.

During September, 1966, while employed as an exercise boy, he fell off a horse, sustaining what doctors describe as minor injuries; however, he was compensated in March, 1968, in the amount of \$2,000 for damages. Relatives and some associates state following Sirhan's accident there was a noticeable change in his demeanor.

Subject actually has few friends, no known girl friend and is considered to be a 'loner.'

Report contains numerous references to the alleged girl in the "polka dot dress." This refers to statements made by one Sandra Serrano who was sitting on steps outside the Ambassador Hotel when she heard sounds like "backfire" and seconds later a man and a woman ran down the stairs, the woman shouting "We shot him." Serrano states that prior to the shooting this woman and two men, one of whom she identifies as Sirhan, entered the Ambassador Hotel via the steps she was sitting on.

Identity of the girl in "polka dot dress" has not been established and inconsistencies in Serrano's alleged observations are set forth. Vigorous investigation continuing concerning this and any other unresolved aspects of this case.

For your additional information, Sirhan was indicted on 6-7-68, on one count of murder and five counts of assault with a deadly weapon with intent to commit murder and a hearing has been set for 6-28-68, at which time he is to enter a plea.

Dear Mr. Hoover,

Just in case you have not heard the following story, I have decided that you should be informed about it so that if it contains any truth you may (while yet you are in control of the F. B. I.) take proper action to counteract the evil influence of the people involved whose connections very probably reach deeply into the U. S. State Department and the highly secret C. I. A. Organization. I believe that you and your organization yet represent the grass roots integrity of the American Way of Life and sensibly conservative Democratic Form of Government both of which appear to be fast vanishing from the contemporary scene.

> William Lynch of the Criminal Division, who is handling this case for the Attorney General as a special, called to inquire whether we have a report and whether we planned to send the results of our investigation to District Attorney Evelle J. Younger of Los Angeles.

I told him that any report which we receive will be furnished, in accordance with the Department's request, to the Department. He wanted to know if we planned to submit it to the Department before it went to Younger. Pollak has previously stated they wanted to review it before it went out to Younger.

It is noted that Pollak asked me when he can expect a report. I told him we expect a report sometime toward the end of the week and that it had to be carefully reviewed. I also told Lynch the report would be transmitted to the Department in accordance with the request of the Attorney General.

For your information, we have the report. It is most bulky, it is over 1,000 pages, and it is being carefully reviewed. It represents the current investigation to date. Corrections are being made and it is being rechecked with Los Angeles in any instances where questions arise. Just as soon as the review is completed, an appropriate memorandum will be transmitted forwarding the report to the Department, and at that time, we will specifically inquire to be advised when the material may be submitted to District Attorney Younger.

HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN INFORMATION CONCERNING

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Marge Rodak, 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona, was interviewed at her place of employment, Motorola, Inc., 5005 East McDowell Road, Phoenix, at her request. Mrs. Rodak advised that on the Wednesday (June 5, 1968) following the assault on Robert F. Kennedy while she; her daughter, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian; and her son-in-law, Hagop H. Djeredjian, were watching television at the above 31st Street address, it was flashed on television a photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, as the assailant of Senator Kennedy. Mrs. Rodak advised that at that time Hagop Djeredjian stated "I know that man." Djeredjian further stated "Didn't I tell you (Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian) two days ago that Kennedy was going to be shot and Humphrey will probably be shot next and Ted Kennedy shot if he runs for office."

Mrs. Rodak advised that when she queried Djeredjian regarding these statements, he refused to discuss them with her. Mrs. Rodak admitted that she dislikes her son-in-law intensely, advising that he never works and mistreats her daughter Sherie and her grandson David by Sherie's first marriage.

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian was interviewed at 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arizona. At this time she denied that her husband made such statements

as related by her mother above. Mrs. Djeredjian stated that it was she who speculated two days before the actual assault on Kennedy that he would be shot and furthermore, it was she voicing her opinion that Vice President Hubert Humphrey and Senator Ted Kennedy would probably be shot also. Mrs. Djeredjian insisted that such prophecies were based exclusively on her own evaluation of these political times and not because she has any knowledge such happenings will, in fact, occur.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband is in the United States on a visa from Beirut, Lebanon; that he came to the United States in 1958 and for a time lived in Los Angeles. She believes that he went to Pasadena City College where he was active in American Foreign Crusade, allegedly an anti-Communist organization. She stated she married Djeredjian on June 5, 1965, against the wishes of her mother and she believes her mother is very spiteful against Djeredjian.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised that she and Djeredjian lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965 until the latter part of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 108 West Margaret Street, where Djeredjian supported the family on infrequent Perfume and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Dr. Zohrab Djeredjian, No. 28, Khoder Hadjine, Beirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. Djeredjian stated that during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and her son David drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, where she and David stayed while Djeredjian drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which he returned to Phoenix June 4, 1968. She stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) regarding staying in this country and he knows a Mr. Hebbard Lampkin (phonetic) of INS in Los Angeles. Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband left Phoenix June 11, 1968, by Greyhound Bus to go to Eastern Oklahoma

State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temporary address would be Box 155, Wilburton, Oklahoma. Mrs. Djeredjian advised she received a telephone call from her husband June 12, 1968, at which time he advised he was at the college.

On June 13, 1968, Special Agent Robert Keyser, U. S. Secret Service, Phoenix, Arizona, was advised of the above.

On June 13, 1968, Hagop H. Djeredjian was interviewed at Eastern Oklahoma State College, Wilburton, Oklahoma. He advised that beginning in October, 1959, he attended Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, for three semesters when first arriving in the United States from his home country of Lebanon. During this period he worked with a Mr. Lampkin, Special Agent in Charge, Security Office, U. S. State Department, Los Angeles, California. During this time he submitted numerous reports to Lampkin concerning various foreign and erratical student organizations, including the Arab Student Association.

He stated that in Phoenix, Arizona, shortly after the assassination of Robert Kennedy, he saw a picture of the alleged assassin on television and stated in the presence of his wife and mother and father-in-law that the face looked familiar to him. He believed he had seen this individual around either Pasadena City College or Pasadena High School while attending school in Pasadena. He did not and still does not recognize the name Sirhahn Sirhahn. It was his opinion that of all the organizations, at Pasadena City College, the best possible source of an assassination attempt would come from the Arab Student Association. He advised Mr. Lewis, Dean of Admissions, and Mr. Weldon, ex-Dean of Admissions at Pasadena City College, might have more details concerning such individuals or organizations.

Djeredjian stated that the only time he had been in Los Angeles, California, in the past several months was on Monday, May 27, 1968. On May 20, 1968, he had picked

up a Cadillac automobile in Detroit, Michigan, from the Ace Automobile Transportation Company for delivery to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. He stated that he had driven this automobile from Detroit to Phoenix and on May 27, 1968, from Phoenix to South San Gabriel, California. He recalled this date because this was the last day on his contract to deliver the automobile. He arrived at the automobile office at approximately 2:10 p.m., where he turned in the car, received a cashier's check on the Bank of America for approximately \$113.00, cashed this check at the bank across the street and took a bus to Los Angeles.

In Los Angeles, he went to the office of Mr. Lampkin in the Federal Building, where he arrived at approximately 3 to 3:15 p.m. He talked with Mr. Lampkin concerning a possible trip of his back to Lebanon caused by his father's illness and departed at approximately 4:30 p.m. He walked several blocks to the Greyhound Bus Depot where he purchased a ticket to Phoenix, Arizona, and departed on this bus to Phoenix at approximately 7:10 p.m. that date. Djeredjian stated he had not been back to Los Angeles since that time for any reason. He stated he had not seen nor talked with any other person on that occasion in Los Angeles, and that he has no friends or acquaintances currently living in the Los Angeles area with whom he has visited recently or with whom he corresponds.

Djeredjian could not locate his ticket from Los Angeles to Phoenix but did produce a contract with the Ace Automobile Transportation Company to deliver a Cadillac to 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California. This contract indicated that the vehicle was picked up on May 20, 1968, in Detroit, Michigan, and was due on May 27, 1968, in South San Gabriel. Since coming to the United States, Djeredjian has often visited Lamkin and also telephoned and written to him from all over the United States, mostly regarding visa fraud information, none of which information has ever been truthful. Lamkin stated Djeredjian cannot be believed and he will "feed" you anything if he thinks you will believe him. Djeredjian is a glory seeker and would welcome an interview by the FBI; however, he should be considered extremely unreliable.

Djeredjian last contacted Lamkin telephonically on June 12, 1968, from Wilburton, Oklahoma, where he attends Eastern Oklahoma State College. Djeredjian stated the FBI had talked to his wife, Sherie, and he assumed the FBI would contact him regarding Sirhan Sirhan. Djeredjian told Lamkin

he believed he had furnished information to Lamkin regarding Sirhan while Djeredjian was attending PCC. Lamkin stated a review of his files failed to substantiate this and he believes it is another lie. Lamkin was not aware of any visit to Los Angeles by Djeredjian on June 3 to 4, 1968.

On June 14, 1968, Harold Schneider, Assistant Manager, Los Angeles Auto Auction, advised his records reveal that Hagop H. Djeredjian delivered a 1967 Cadillac El Dorado to Auto Auction at 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California, on May 27, 1968. Exact time of day could not be determined. Djeredjian First came to the attention of the State Department in Beirut, Lebanon, in 1959 where he served in informant capacity regarding fraudulent visas. Djeredjian subsequently came to the United States and attended Pasadena City College)PCC) starting September, 1959.

Since coming to the United States, Djeredjian has often visited Lamkin and also telephoned and written to him from all over the United States, mostly regarding visa fraud information, none of which information has ever been truthful. Lamkin stated Djeredjian cannot be believed and he will "feed" you anything if he thinks you will believe him. Djeredjian is a glory seeker and would welcome an interview by the FBI; however, he should be considered extremely unreliable.

Djeredjian last contacted Lamkin telephonically on June 12, 1968, from Wilburton, Oklahoma, where he attends Eastern Oklahoma State College. Djeredjian stated the FBI had talked to his wife, Sherie, and he assumed the FBI would contact him regarding Sirhan Sirhan. Djeredjian told Lamkin

he believed he had furnished information to Lamkin regarding Sirhan while Djeredjian was attending PCC. Lamkin stated a review of his files failed to substantiate this and he believes it is another lie. Lamkin was not aware of any visit to Los Angeles by Djeredjian on June 3 to 4, 1968.

On June 14, 1968, Harold Schneider, Assistant Manager, Los Angeles Auto Auction, advised his records reveal that Hagop H. Djeredjian delivered a 1967 Cadillac El Dorado to Auto Auction at 8001 East Garvey, South San Gabriel, California, on May 27, 1968. Exact time of day could not be determined. Djeredjian was issued a check in the amount of \$111.28 for this delivery.

On June 14, 1968, Rose Avakian, 13158 Chandler Drive, Van Nuys, California, advised she had not seen Hagop Djeredjian in the past four years. She recalled that she loaned him a few dollars while he was attending PCC and since then has not heard from him and has no idea as to his present whereabouts or activities.

HAGOP H. DJEREDJIAN INPORKATION CONCERNING

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Marge Rodak, 16606 North 31st Street, Phoenix, Arisona, was interviewed at her place of employment, Motorola, Inc., 5005 Mast McDowell Road, Phoenix, at her request. Mrs. Rodak advised that on the Wednesday (June 5, 1968) following the assault on Robert F. Kennedy while she; her daughter, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian; and her son-in-law, Magop H. Djeredjian, were watching television at the above 31st Street address, it was flashed on television a photograph of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, as the assailant of Senator Mennedy. Mrs. Rodak advised that at that time Magop Djeredjian stated "I know that man." Djeredjian further stated "Didn't I tell you (Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian) two days ago that Mennedy was going to be shot and Humphrey will probably be shot next and Ted Kennedy shot if he runs for office."

Mrs. Rodak advised that when she queried Djeredjian regarding these statements, he refused to discuss them with her. Mrs. Rodak admitted that she dislikes her sen-in-law intensely, advising that he never works and mistreats her daughter Sherie and her grandsen David by Sherie's first marriage.

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Sherie Lynn Djeredjian was interviewed at 18606 North Slat Street, Phoenix, Arixona. At this time she denied that her husband made such statements

as related by her mother above. Mrs. Djeredjian stated that it was she who speculated two days before the actual assmult on Kennedy that he would be shot and furthermore, it was she voicing her opinion that Vice President Hubert Humphrey and Senator Ted Kennedy would probably be shot also. Mrs. Djeredjian insisted that such prophecies were based exclusively on her own evaluation of those political times and not because she has any knowledge such happenings will, in fact, occur.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband is in the United States on a visa from Beirut, Lebason; that he came to the United States in 1958 and for a time lived in Los Angeles. The believes that he west to Passdena City College where he was active in American Foreign Grunde, allegedly an anti-Communist organization. The stated she married Djeredjian on June 5, 1965, against the wishes of her mother and she believes her mother is very spiteful against Djeredjian.

Mrs. Djeredjian advised that she and Djeredjian lived in Detroit, Michigan, from the fall of 1965 until the latter part of May, 1968. In Detroit their residence for the last two years was 108 West Margaret Street, where Djeredjian supported the family on infrequent Perfuse and record sales of his export-import company, Zo-Jac, which he operated out of his home, as well as frequent money orders received from his brother, Dr. Zehrab Djeredjian, No. 28, Kheder Madjine, Deirut, Lebanon.

Mrs. Djeredjian stated that during the last week of May, 1968, she and her husband and her son David drove an unknown person's car from Detroit to Phoenix, where she and David stayed while Djeredjian drove the car to an unknown place in Los Angeles on June 3, 1968, after which he returned to Phoenix June 4, 1968. The stated her husband has been having a great deal of trouble with the Immigration and Inturalization Service (IMS) regarding staying in this country and he knows a Mr. Hebbard Lampkin (phonetic) of IMS in Los Angeles. Mrs. Djeredjian advised her husband left Phoenix June 11, 1968, by Grejhound Bus to go to Eastern Chiahoma

State College, Vilburton, Oklahoma, for summer school and his temperary address would be Box 155, Vilburton, Oklahoma. Brs. Djeredjian advised she received a telephone call from her husband June 12, 1968, at which time he advised he was at the college.

On June 13, 1968, Special Agent Robert Reymer, U. S. Secret Service, Pheenix, Arimona, was advised of the above.

On June 13, 1968, Magop M. Djeredjian was interviewed at Eastern Oklahoma State College, Vilhurton, Oklahoma. He advised that beginning in October, 1959, he attended Pasadema City College, Pasadema, California, for three semesters when first arriving in the United States from his home country of Lebanom. During this period he worked with a Er. Lampkin, Special Agent in Charge, Security Office, U. S. State Bepartment, Los Angeles, California. During this time he submitted numerous reports to Lampkin concerning various foreign and erratical student organizations, including the Arab Student Association.

The stated that in Phoenix, Arisona, shortly after the assassination of Robert Kennedy, he saw a picture of the alleged assassin on television and stated in the presence of his wife and mother and father-in-law that the face looked familiar to him. He believed he had seen this individual around either Pasadona City College or Pasadona High School while attending school in Pasadona. He did not and still does not recognize the same Mirhahn Mirhahn. It was his opinion that of all the organizations, at Pasadona City College, the best possible source of an assassination attempt would seen from the Arab Student Association. He advised Mr. Lewis, Duan of Admissions, and Mr. Weldon, ex-Duan of Admissions at Pasadona City College, might have more details concerning such individuals or organizations.

Djoredjian stated that the only time he had been in Los Angeles, California, in the past several months was on Monday, May 27, 1968. On May 20, 1968, he had picked

up a Cadillac automobile in Detroit, Nichigan, from the Ace Automobile Transportation Company for delivery to 8001 Mast Garvey, South Man Gabriel, California. He stated that he had driven this automobile from Detroit to Phoenix and on May 27, 1968, from Phoenix to South San Gabriel, California. He recalled this date because this was the last day on his contract to deliver the automobile. He arrived at the automobile office at approximately 2:10 p.m., where he turned in the car, received a cashier's check on the Bank of America for approximately 3113.00, canhed this check at the bank across the street and took a bus to Los Angeles.

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
