Dear Mr. Hoover:

The following is an excerpt from a letter sent to me by a constituent:

...the fingerprints (of Sirhan Sirhan) were not recorded in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. They did turn up finally in the hands of juvenile court officials. Now I feel that if all sets of fingerprints were required to be recorded and on file at the FBI, any case such as this could be solved as to the identity of the alleged assassin. I don't think any good loyal American citizen would object to having his fingerprints on permanent file. I also feel that all immigrants that come to America should be fingerprinted and their prints be set on file also.

Will you please furnish me with information or comment upon which I might base a reply to my constituent.

My dear Senator:

I have your letter of June 11, 1968, concerning fingerprinting on a national scale.

In the past many suggestions have been made for universal fingerprinting, which of course is the best method of identification. However, no funds have been appropriated for such an undertaking and as a matter of information we are now receiving approximately 29,000 fingerprint cards each day. This volume of prints taxes our facilities to the fullest and we simply cannot take on additional work. Also I wish to point out that within the Department of Justice the consideration and recommendation of legislative proposals are functions of the Attorney General.

Your constituent's comment concerning the fingerprinting of immigrants is being referred to the Immigration and Naturalization Service for an appropriate reply.

NOTE: According to Carl Burrows, INS, Title 8, US Code, Section 1302, provides that applicants for immigration visas 14 years of age and older must register and be fingerprinted. Those aliens who enter the US under age 14 are required to be fingerprinted after reaching the age of 14. Sirhan allegedly came to this country when he was 13 and INS authorities did not follow up and procure his prints at a later date. It is felt the question relating to this phase of Senator Byrd's letter should be answered by INS. Copy of incoming and our reply to Senator Byrd being referred to INS.

On June 7, 1968, SIRHAN SALIM SIRHAN, home address 2505 Green, Detroit, employed as a computer technician, Bryant Computer Products, Division of Excello Corporation, 850 Ladd Road, Walled Lake, Michigan, was interviewed at his residence by SA(A) DAVID C. NESBITT and SA(A) VERNON G. WALTERS. He advised that he was born June 15, 1934 at Palestine, Jordan, and that he came to the United States with his parents on October 25, 1948. He advised the point of entry was New York, New York, and they came directly to Detroit. He advised that his father, SALIM SALEM SIRHAN, age 68, came to the United States in 1920 and was naturalized in 1927 and, therefore, he, SIRHAN, was born an American citizen. NELLIE SIRHAN

SIRHAN advised on June 14, 1968 that while in the United States Army, he served in Germany, and in May, 1957 he received four or five weeks leave, during which time he went to Taybeh, Jordan, and married NELLIE KHADER on May 27, 1957 and brought her to the United States. They now have four children through this marriage. He pointed out this has been his only return to Jordan since coming to the United States in 1948. SIRHAN said that although he was born an American citizen, he nevertheless obtained a Certificate of Citizenship number AA 72775, dated April 11, 1961 at Detroit.

SIRHAN denied knowing or being related to SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, who is involved in the assassination of Senator KENNEDY.

On June 14, 1968, ERNEST RIECKHOFF, Employment Officer, Bryant Computer Products, Division of Excelllo Corporation, 850 Ladd Road, Walled Lake, advised SA(A) NESBITT that SIRHAN S. SIRHAN has been employed as a computer technician since August 17, 1965. Mr. RIECKHOFF advised that SIRHAN is considered to be an extremely capable and dependable employee. He said SIRHAN's employment application shows his date of birth as June 15, 1934 and his parents as SALIM and MARY SIRHAN, 1211 Hubbard Street, Detroit.

On June 7, 1968 SALIM SALEM SIRHAN, father of SIRHAN SALIM SIRHAN, 1211 Hubbard, Detroit, furnished information to SA(A) DAVID C. NESBITT and SA(A) VERNON G. WALTERS that he had seen a picture of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN's father on television being interviewed in Jordan and that he knew this person as BISHARA SALAMEH KHATTAS (phonetic). He said he was not personally acquainted with KHATTAS and furthermore, did not know the whereabouts of his wife, whose name he believed to be MARY, or his children. He said he recognized him because he is from the same village, Taybeh, Jordan, and that he saw KHATTAS on one occasion when he last visited Taybeh about four years ago. Mr. SIRHAN said he has never known KHATTAS to use the name SIRHAN but it is possible that if he visited the United States he changed his last name to SIRHAN. Mr. SIRHAN, who has difficulty understanding English, said he was born February 10, 1900 in Palestine, Jordan, came to the United States in 1920, and became a naturalized citizen in about 1928.

On June 14, 1968 ALICE BATAYEH, daughter of SALIM SALEM SIRHAN, 2100 Mc Kinstry, Detroit, furnished a complete itinerary of travel to Jordan from 1955 to the present time of the SIRHAN family residing in Detroit and Goshen, Indiana, which visits were made for the purpose of visiting relatives in Taybeh, Jordan:

At one point in this film coverage, Belyea said he noticed a man walking in front of the crowd to the right of the cavalcade and from this man's attitude Belyea felt he was about to take some action towards Senator Kennedy.

We previously asked Legat, Ottawa to arrange for Belyea to view the film.

Legat, Ottawa by teletype 6-21-68, advises that it would be preferable to have the viewing in the company of a representative of the Los Angeles Police Department. There is no logical reason for this and we are therefore instructing Legat, Ottawa to continue with arrangements for Belyea to review the film.

On 5/21/68, Paul Shinoff, Los Angeles area Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) leader and spokesman who recently returned from trip to Cuba, presented talk and slides of Cuba at open meeting of Los Felitz Peace and Freedom Party at 3800 Amesbury, Los Angeles, California.

Jose Duarte, anti-Castro Cuban who describes himself as spokesman for Los Angeles area Cuban exile organization, together with 8 to 15 anti-Castro Cuban companions attended this meeting. Estimate of total audience reported to be from 35 to 70 persons. Duarte stood up in the meeting and demanded time to present his views on Cuba. Following noisy debate and vote, he was given permission to speak after the slide presentation by Shinoff. *Thompson*

On 6/8/68, Duarte was interviewed and advised that at the above-mentioned meeting when he demanded and attempted to speak he noticed an individual in the audience whom he described as dark complexion, white male in mid-20s, short in stature and casually attired in tee shirt and trousers. Duarte advised that this individual began shouting derogatory remarks at him and accused him of being a Central Intelligence Agency agent. Duarte advised he confronted this individual who claimed to be an Arab and this individual became violent and frenzied and a brief scuffle ensued. Duarte was shown photographs of Sirhan B. Sirhan and advised he is positive that the above-described individual is identical to Sirhan. Duarte has furnished a statement to the Los Angeles Police Department and press regarding his identification of Sirhan at above meeting. *e*

Three associates of Duarte who were interviewed identified Sirhan's photograph as being identical with the above-described individual. However, three other associates could not state that Sirhan attended the meeting and subsequent interviews with several other individuals who attended the meeting have failed to substantiate Duarte's allegations. Los Angeles has been instructed to conduct appropriate investigation to locate and interview Shinoff and other individuals who attended the 5/21/68 meeting.

CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS:

San Francisco has advised that Shinoff, a Security Index subject, telephonically contacted the San Francisco Office on 6/18/68 and advised that he can be reached through his attorney Charles R. Garry.

Garry is on the Security Index and Agitator Index of the San Francisco Office. He is a partner in the law firm of Garry, Dreyfus, McTernan and Keller. He is presently the attorney representing the Black Panther Party and is defending Huey P. Newton, the accused murderer of an Oakland police officer, and makes almost daily press releases critical of law enforcement.

San Francisco believes that an interview with Shinoff would have to be conducted in the presence of Garry and believes nothing would be accomplished by such an interview and, therefore, recommended that no effort be made to contact Shinoff through Garry to arrange an interview.

OBSERVATIONS:

Because it is extremely important that Shinoff be interviewed in this matter to complete the record concerning this phase of the Kensalt investigation, San Francisco is being instructed to have two mature experienced Agents immediately contact Charles R. Garry and arrange to interview Shinoff, if necessary in the presence of Garry. If at all possible, the interview will be conducted in the San Francisco Office and will be limited to Sirhan's attendance at Peace and Freedom Party meeting on 5/21/68. San Francisco is being instructed not to conduct interview with Shinoff at his residence or at his attorney's office.

RECOMMENDATION: That attached teletype to San Francisco be approved.

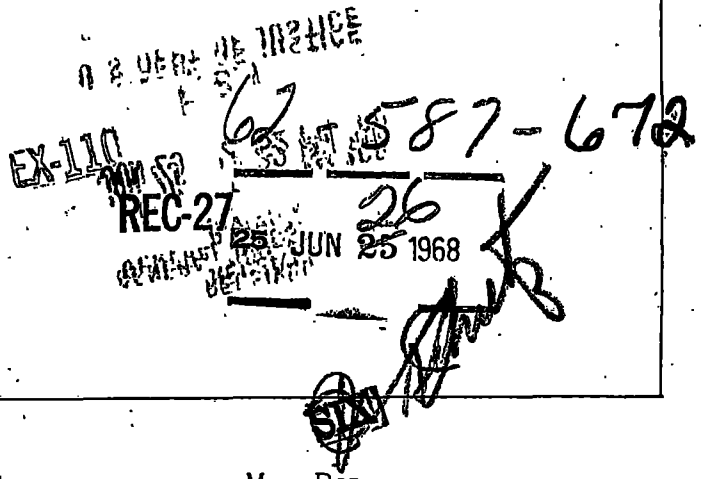
SMITH advised that he was in attendance at the lecture given by DICK GREGORY at St. Gregory's College, Shawnee, Oklahoma, in May, 1968. He was also in attendance at the informal discussion following the lecture. He heard GREGORY comment, in discussing the political styles of the various presidential candidates, that both Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and Mayor JOHN LINDSAY like to mingle among the crowds of people and that Senator KENNEDY would be shot before the election.

SMITH advises he attached no significance to the comment and does not believe GREGORY had any knowledge of events to come. He did not hear anyone question GREGORY regarding the comment and heard no additional references to that remark.
