FBI, Los Angeles, on 6/28/68, received anonymous telephone call saying that if Sirhan Sirhan dies so will President Johnson. Since call was placed through the telephone company, the operator was able to determine from where it originated. This number is listed to Ivan or Alexey Tikhonoff, East Los Angeles, California.

In a related development the Los Angeles Sheriff's Office received a telephone call from a Los Angeles newspaper who had received a call from an anonymous male that he was going to kill President Johnson. Telephone company had traced this call also to the Tikhonoff telephone. Secret Service is handling this as a threat to the President.

SA J. CLARE WILLIAMS, AT EIGHT PM, ADVISED AGENT ANTHONY SHERMAN, SECRET SERVICE, LOS ANGELES. SHERMAN AT THIS TIME ADVISED THAT AT APPROXIMATELY SIX THIRTY PM, JUNE TWENTY EIGHT INSTANT, HE HAD RECEIVED CALL FROM LOS ANGELES SHERIFF'S OFFICE WHO ADVISED THEIR AGENCY A FEW MINUTES EARLIER HAD RECEIVED CALL FROM THE LOS ANGELES HERALD EXAMINER NEWSPAPER. NEWSPAPER ADVISED APPROXIMATELY SIX FIFTEEN PM, SAME DATE, CALL RECEIVED AT THEIR OFFICE FROM ANONYMOUS MALE WHO ADVISED THAT HE WAS GOING TO KILL PRESIDENT JOHNSON AND THAT HE MEANT IT. SA WILLIAMS ADVISED SGT. PROJANOWSKI, LOS ANGELES POLICE DEPARTMENT, INTELLIGENCE DETAIL, ABOVE INFORMATION, NINE PM.

UNABLE IDENTIFY TIKHONOFF LOS ANGELES INDICES.

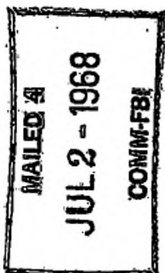

ASSASSINATION OF  
SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY

On June 14, 1968, Leonard A. ~~Smith~~, 5788 Chestnut Avenue, advised a Special Agent of the FBI that he received a letter dated May 30, 1968, from his son, Phillip Smith, who is a member of the Peace Corps stationed in Modadiscio, Somolia Republic, Africa.

LOS ANGELES, CALIF  
Mr. Smith said his son's letter was postmarked June 2, 1968, Modadiscio. The letter contained the following sentence: "Now I hear the RFK assassination was a sham - Some Somalis made it up or something - but the problems are still the same way".

Mr. Smith was of the opinion that possibly there was a rumor in Africa that Robert F. Kennedy had been assassinated prior to the date he was shot in Los Angeles. He said the letter made no other reference to Robert F. Kennedy other than noted above. He furnished the following physical description of his son, Phillip ~~Smith~~:

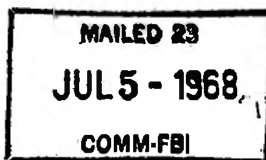



Sydney MORRIS above noted address contacted this Office, this being further to a conversation he had at 12:50PM 7 JUN 68 with a S/SGT. whose name he does not remember regarding the assassin of Senator Robert F. KENNEDY. He stated that he was listening to the C.K.C.M. program "HOT LINE" at 12:20 PM this date and heard a woman saying that she had met Mr. KENNEDY's assassin some three (3) years ago in Montreal and that the latter had mentioned to her at that time that he intended to kill KENNEDY. Mr. MORRIS further added that this conversation was taped by C.K.G.M. and that no doubt we could obtain same from that Radio Station. Mr. MORRIS also informed that he imparted this information to Mr. George STONE, Chief of the Bureau of Investigation, District Attorney's Office, Los Angeles, California and that no doubt we would be contacted in connection with this matter by the U.S. Authorities.

The tape was made heard by Peter JONES and Michelle HOULE staff members at the US Consulate who lately have received "crank" calls however the voice is not familiar to them. Reference Bureau letter dated 6/11/68.

RICHARD ALLEN HUNTER, age 52, was located and interviewed on June 26, 1968, at Room 57 of the Lisboa Hotel, Calle Huerto 20, Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico. His letter dated June 5, 1968, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation was acknowledged. HUNTER explained that he had desired to express his sorrow concerning the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and for this reason had sent the letter.

HUNTER said that ERNESTO OSWALD, age 57, a U. S. Army veteran who resides at the 18 peso (\$1.44 U.S.) a day Lisboa Hotel, had caused him trouble in the past, and he wanted to "report him." OSWALD's lady friend, EDITH V. FLUSSER, of Calle Emiliano Carranza 87, Zapopan, Jalisco, was identified by HUNTER as a former resident of Germany, with whom OSWALD had spoken of opening a hotel at Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco.

HUNTER was assured that his letter would be kept confidential.

Vice Consul GEORGE HIRAGA of the American Consulate General at Guadalajara, Jalisco, on June 26, 1968, stated that RICHARD ALLEN HUNTER receives a Social Security check at the Consulate. He advised that inasmuch as HUNTER is not old enough to receive a retirement check he apparently receives a check for health reasons, possibly mental.

The files of the Mexico City Office contain no previous reference to RICHARD ALLEN HUNTER or ERNESTO OSWALD.

Inasmuch as inquiries show that HUNTER's letter to the Bureau does not have a direct bearing on this case, no further action concerning it is contemplated.

MEMO FOR THE RECORD

Subject: Suspicion of Palestinian Conspiracy Behind  
Kennedy Assassination

1. In our second (unclassified) meeting on 12 June with John Joseph Boles, Political Advisor to the executive officers of Occidental Petroleum, we obtained the following information consisting largely of impressions and interpretations. Boles, with a PhD in Economics and 20 years experience in academic and private industry as an area specialist of the Arab Middle East, is convinced that Senator Kennedy's assassination is a product of the Palestinian Refugee resistance group, Al-Fatah. Information supplied at this meeting was admittedly fragmentary and inconclusive, but Boles promised to marshal his facts and identifications while making his next Middle East trip reporting back on his return in early July 1968.

2. The moment he heard the accused assassin's name, Boles concluded the act to be another of 15 or more prominent political assassinations more or less attributed to the Al-Fatah. He dates these killings from 1948 with King Abdulla, Grandfather of Jordan's King Hussein, and continuing to include prominent Arab and non-Arab officials outspoken in their drive for peaceful, equitable solution of the Middle East problem for both Arabs and Jews. Boles pointed to another assassination effort, fortunately unsuccessful, since 4 June which was targeted at Dr. Camille Chamout (ph), prominent Lebanese personality who, during the Eisenhower Administration, permitted the landing of US troops in Lebanon. The US organization most closely aligned with Al-Fatah is the Arab Federated Students, of which there is a prominent concentration in Pasadena, according to Boles. Moreover, in his opinion, the Arab Federated Students come closer to constituting a Fifth Column in the US than any organization he can name.

3. The depth of Arab nationalism in Palestinian refugees in the US has been further clarified to Boles in conversations with several such friends since 4 June. One specific instance was recounted with Dr. Adel ("Ed") Awad, a refugee with 10-14 years residence in the US, and a naturalized citizen with an American wife. Awad is a chemical engineer employed by PETROMIN, a government agency of Saudi Arabia with who Occidental/Boles has considerable contact. Following the Kennedy assassination, Awad addressed Boles on the subject without an ounce of sympathy adding that the US and the world had better get ready for "ve Palestinians" increased demands for greater voice in national affairs of every Arab country, greater demands against foreign oil concession holders, and greater resistance to Israel. This attitude

was most surprising from a man Boles thought he had known quite well.

4. Boles further noted two articles in 27 and 29 May editions of The Daily Star, an English language newspaper published in Beirut and supposedly owned by King Faysal. Each edition contained an article recounting and criticizing campaign pronouncements by Senator Kennedy interpreted as particularly anti-Arab. According to Boles, articles such as these had never appeared in The Daily Star previously, from which he questions the coincidence of timing between the articles and assassination.

5. Amplification of the foregoing will be supplied upon Boles return from a trip including conversations at the White House, in London and the Middle East.

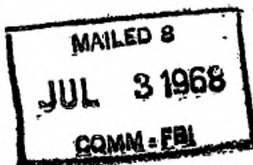

On 6/19/68, Ambassador WALTER P. McCONAUGHY, American Embassy, Taipei, Taiwan, advised that one BERNARD BOULTON, a British businessman in Taipei who is an acquaintance of his, called him and said he wished to discuss something which had been bothering him of late. Ambassador McCONAUGHY said he naturally acquiesced and met with BOULTON who, incidentally according to the Ambassador, is believed to be the ranking MI-6 (British Intelligence) man in Taiwan.

BOULTON advised that during his British intelligence career during World War II he had occasion to investigate the organization known as Jehovah's Witnesses. He said the reason for this investigation was that, although the rank and file of the organization were sincere God-fearing men, the leaders, according to certain documents obtained during that period were fanatics dedicated to causing chaos in the world in order to hasten the second coming of Christ. During the war, BOULTON said, the Jehovah's Witnesses leaders were against the Germans but were also equally dedicated against the Allies.

At any rate, the reason he was bringing this to the attention of the Ambassador was that in a British magazine commenting on the Kennedy (Robert) assassination, mention was made that SIRHAN SIRHAN was a Christian and a member of Jehovah's Witnesses. BOULTON said he knew it was remote, but felt that at least he should bring it to someone's attention. Thus, the reason for calling Ambassador McCONAUGHY.

The Ambassador said he wished to bring it to Legat's attention. He saw no particular urgency in the matter. Legat said he was, of course, interested in anything, however seemingly unimportant, and would furnish such data to headquarters immediately.

1. Following telephoned information and instructions, the undersigned proceeded to interview Det. L. Turgeon of the St. Lambert City Police, regarding the telephone call he had received from one Mrs. J. Patton of 15 Argyle St. St. Lambert, P.Q. Having heard the subject of this inquiry from Det. Turgeon, the patrol was extended to the residence of Mrs. PATTON where the information contained hereunder corroborated that of Det. Turgeon.

CANADA

2. Mrs. PATTON explained that at approximately 11.40 PM, of the 6 JUN 68, she was looking at Montreal T.V. Channel 10, where films of the murder of the captionally noted were being projected and commented. In one scene, just prior to the showing of the prostrate body of Senator KENNEDY, she observed the news photographs of three spectators looking at a document on a wall. These three spectators consist of a female wearing a polk-dotted dress, and flanked by two males.

3. Mrs. PATTON explained that she was reporting this fact to the police, as she did not remember having seen these films on any of the other television stations, and she thought that they may be of interest to the U.S. law enforcement authorities. She informed that she was aware that the FBI was searching for the identity of a polka-dotted female who would have made a remark immediately after the shooting incident, and that she was under the impression that the viewing of this film may be a good investigative aid.

4. Therefore, Mr. Real QUIRET of Channel 10 News Service was contacted in order to learn the source of the films projected. He informed that these films had been supplied to them by U.P.I. (United Press International) and had been projected as received. Mr. QUIRET further added that, if it was deemed important, arrangements could be made for police officers to view the films in question in their studios.

5. The above is submitted for the information of the investigating agencies, in the event such viewing may be of value in the possible identification of the persons being sought, in relation with the captionally noted incident.

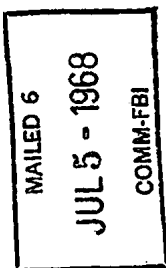
