Here I'm sending you the names of two persons that I told that they have to kill another important person in order that three are completed, beginning with President Kennedy, they are witnesses that I told before it happened.

I didn't tell the Government because there are persons who laugh because they don't know God, and their purpose is to kill.

Let's see if you believe in what I say to you, then you can believe what I say right away. That the policy which you have placed on the Americans is mature [?] and divided. Because of that they take advantage of this to kill those who can defend the Nation and now [they? you? verb used can mean either] are up a blind alley.

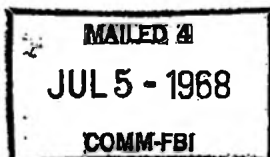

JERUSALEM POST REPORTER ANAN SAFADI, INTERVIEWING FATHER OF SUSPECTED KENNEDY SLAYER SIRHAN SIRHAN AFTER NEWS OF ATTACK ON SA'DALLAH SIRHAN BECAME KNOWN, SAYS IN JULY 5 NEWS STORY THAT BISHARA SIRHAN WANTS TO BRING WIFE AND CHILDREN HOME FROM STATES BECAUSE HE FEELS "THEY ARE UNSAFE THERE." 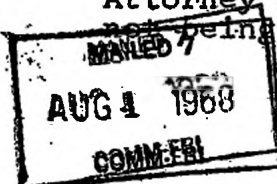

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau is a postcard measuring approximately 3½x9" advertising the Harrison Hotel, 65 East Harrison Street, Chicago, Illinois, which was postmarked July 1, 1968, from Chicago. This postcard is addressed to FBI, Albuquerque, New Mexico. The message side of the postcard bears the notation "The RFK murder case." Also written on the card are the words "Think" and "Murder". There appears to be a list of names written in blue ink and then scratched thru with a brown colored substance. These appear to be names of various movie actors and actresses and other writings which are unidentifiable by Albuquerque. This is submitted to the Bureau for whatever interpretation or significance the Bureau may attach to this postcard.

There is enclosed for Chicago a xerox copy of the front and reverse side of this postcard for information purposes. Albuquerque has retained one xerox copy. Albuquerque will take no further action regarding this postcard UACB.

On July 1, 1968, Lic. Salinas recalled that [REDACTED], on realizing what he had done by attracting so much attention to himself, openly admitted the entire story was a hoax, and he readily criticized newspaper reporters, administration officials, and police officers for being so gullible as to believe this fantastic story.

On July 5, 1968, Salinas advised that [REDACTED], while in solitary confinement at the General Hospital for the Insane, had put together a rope from the mattress material located in his room and he hung himself. He was discovered dead at approximately 7:45 p.m. on the evening of July 4, 1968, by an attendant of the hospital.

For information of recipient offices, Semmel Ruth, Consul of Israel currently assigned to Israeli Mission to United Nations (UN), New York City, visited Bureau 7/8/68 accompanied by Colonel Sid Rubenstein, former Bureau Agent who was subsequently with OSI and is now associated with Mosler Safe Company, and conferred with Assistant Director W. C. Sullivan concerning matters of mutual interest.

Ruth was formerly Chief Superintendent of Israeli Police, head of Criminal Investigative Division, and was a supervisor of Shirut Bitahon, Israeli Security Service. His current assignment in New York will extend another two years. He travels in U.S. occasionally and expects to visit Israeli Consulate, San Francisco, around October, 1968. Bufiles contain no derogatory information concerning Ruth.

For information of San Francisco, Ruth was interviewed 6/11/68, at Colonel Rubenstein's suggestion, by New York Office concerning the assassination of Senator Robert Kennedy. Ruth furnished his views regarding suspect Sirhan Sirhan based on Ruth's vast experience with Arabs in police work and his extensive knowledge of their thinking and habits. Ruth felt the assassination involved more than one person because Sirhan would not talk or admit the act as the average Arab would do. Ruth furnished additional views, none specific in nature, and stated he merely wanted to give the Bureau the benefit of his thinking on this matter.

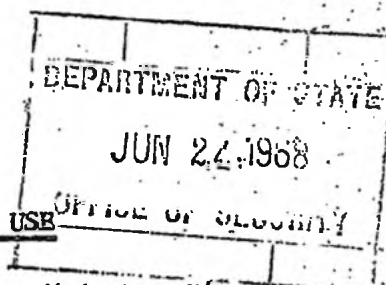

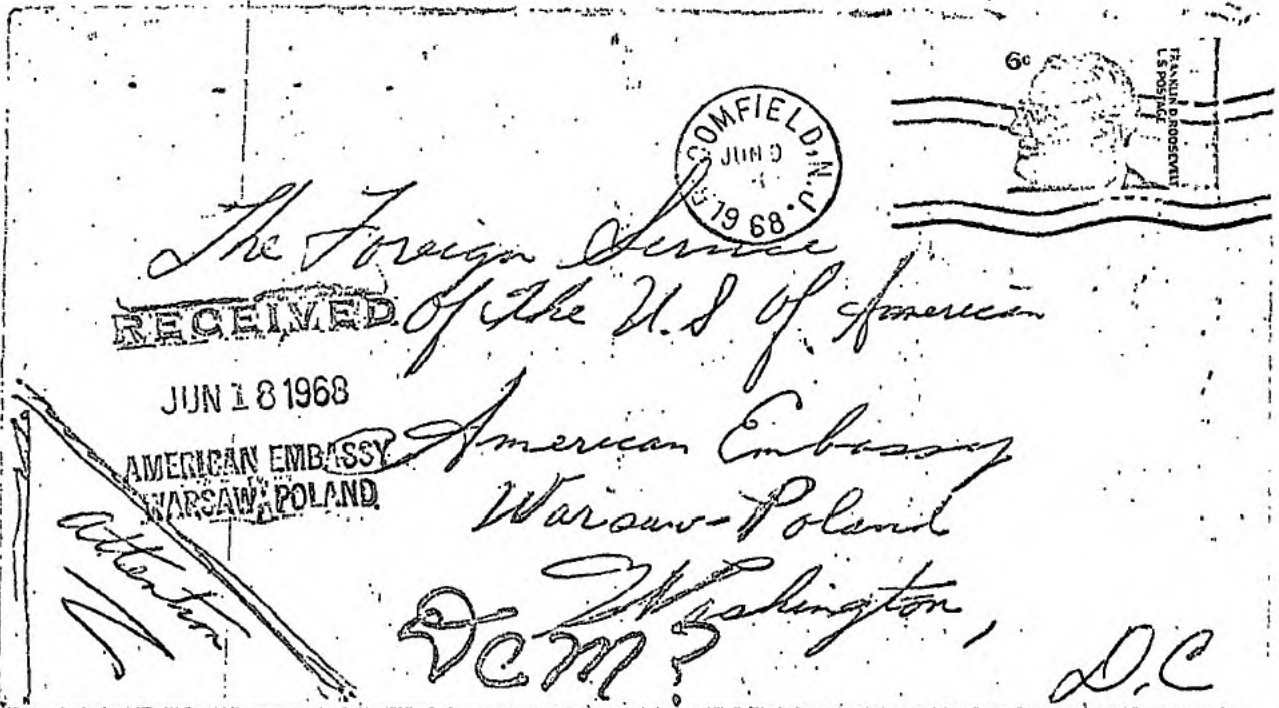

The purpose of this memorandum is to briefly summarize a wild allegation wherein New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison is alleging there was a conspiracy in the assassinations of President John F. Kennedy, Senator Robert F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King.

On 6/25/68 Mr. Richard G. Lubie of Los Angeles, California, informed our Los Angeles Office he was a personal friend of Robert F. Kennedy and had been present as an eyewitness when Senator Kennedy was assassinated by Sirhan B. Sirhan.

Lubie then advised that in approximately May, 1968, he was contacted by one Steven Jaffe who introduced himself as an investigator for New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison. Lubie stated Jaffe informed him that Garrison was concerned over the safety of Senator Robert F. Kennedy since he felt there was a conspiracy involved in the murders of President Kennedy and Martin Luther King and that Garrison felt there was a threat against Robert F. Kennedy as part of this conspiracy. Jaffe claimed Garrison desired to see Senator Kennedy and alert him to this threat.

Lubie further advised that Jaffe then told him that Garrison had determined the assassination of President Kennedy had been planned and executed by a group known as "The Committee" which was composed of individuals from various groups, including the National States Rights Party, anti-Castro Cubans, oil depletion interests, and individuals opposed to the U. S. policy of rapprochement with the communists.

Jaffe claimed Garrison located a letter prepared in 1960 or 1961 by the National States Rights Party which indicated John F. Kennedy, Robert F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King would have to be executed. "The Committee," according to Jaffe,
