In addition, room rates all too often suffer from the competition. This may be beneficial to the conventioneer but can be almost ruinous to the hotel or motel."

Since Florida makes such a big play for conventions and sales meetings, its larger hotels and motels have convention space equal to or larger than that offered by many communities. Such establishments as the Carillon, Fontainebleau, Americana and Dorado Hotel in Miami Beach can seat and feed thousands of persons at one time and in one room, while other big groups are meeting or eating in adjacent areas. It's not unusual to find two or more meetings going on at the same time in one of these hostilities.

Cities Compete. But the competition among hotel-motels isn't the only factor; cities are competing against cities for important conventions and sales meetings. This is growing more pronounced in Florida, as Arpin pointed out.

"A few years ago," he said, "only Miami and Miami Beach had convention halls. Today just about every major Florida city is either fully equipped with big convention halls or they have them on the drawing boards. Now in the competition are West Palm Beach, Jacksonville, Tampa, St. Petersburg, Jacksonville Beach and Panama City. Upcoming are Orlando, Fort Lauderdale, Daytona Beach, Sarasota, Tallahassee and undoubtedly others."

An interesting side effect is that new convention facilities usually lead to other important developments, such as motels and tourist attractions. Typical of this cause-and-effect relationship are the new Sheraton-Jacksonville Hotel, which has 300 rooms and suites and 11 meeting rooms, and Tampa's new Manger Inn, with 285 rooms and suites, being built on the riverfront a couple of blocks south of the city's new Curtis Hixon Convention Center.

There are also other meeting places in Florida that, while not as well known as some of their larger counterparts, nevertheless compete effectively in selected areas. These include such famous hotels as the Bellevue Biltmore at Belleaire, near Clearwater, the Boca Raton Hotel at

Boca Raton, the Breakers at Palm Beach, Port-O-Call at Tierra Verde, St. Petersburg, and Siesta Key near Sarasota.

Airline Co. 1. Florida's convention market is so large, so complex and growing so fast that one airline, Eastern, has just published a text of facilities in the state for conventions, trade shows and such gatherings. Eastern Airlines, incidentally, is active in the charter aircraft business, which is bringing more conventions to Florida. And, like other airlines, Eastern is also buying hotels and motels — so it's not only flying dele-

gates to conventions but housing them too.

With an eye to the future, planners of Walt Disney World near Orlando will have a private airstrip, where charter flights can bring in convention delegates to the meetings that are certain to be booked there in large numbers once the attraction opens.

An interesting aspect of the convention business in Florida is that more regional and national conventions are coming here — 79 per cent more in 1967 than in 1966, according to the Florida Association of Convention Bureaus.

One-Day Delegates Another new trend in the convention world is de-

veloping as a result of the expansion of superhighways, increased and faster air transportation and super-trains. This is the "one day" delegate. He's the man who lives within a reasonable distance of a trade show, sales meeting or convention and who commutes, attending the meeting for one day only.

"Often, in the case of conventions and trade shows, representatives will attend for one day and depart, calling in another representative to attend and see or hear a specific part," Counts said.

Another recent development is sea-

going conventions and sales meetings. In Florida, this is centered at Port Everglades, recognized as the south's leading cruise port and second in the nation only to New York in the number and variety of sailings.

As many as 1500 people in sales and management positions have taken part in one at-sea convention sailing from Port Everglades.

Captive Delegates. J. B. Henderson, port manager, said shipboard meetings have a built-in appeal that gatherings in other areas may lack.

"The business meeting aboard ship has a number of unique advantages which definitely appeal to the sponsoring company," he said. "For one thing, it provides a captive audience and enables a company to do a more effective job. The larger companies with groups numbering in the hundreds claim they have better control. After all, where can you wander off to?"

Insurance Company Conventions Attract New Firms to Florida

A special effort to attract more insurance conventions to Florida, launched by the State Treasurer's office, is paying off.

Since the program began, State Treasurer-Insurance Commissioner Broward Williams told FLORIDA TREND, the number of insurance conventions coming to the state annually has increased by more than 50 per cent.

An additional benefit is that eight insurance companies have established regional home offices in Florida, while others have expanded their facilities in the state and four other newcomers are in the process of locating in Florida.

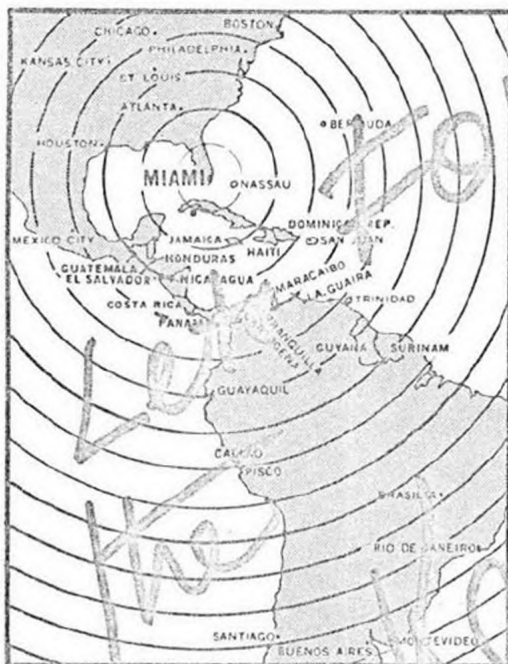
The Florida market is a good one for insurance firms, Williams pointed out.

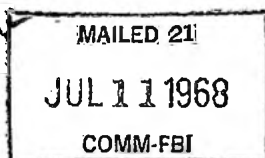

The following investigation was conducted by SA DAVID ROBERT EVANS:

AT AUSTIN, TEXAS

On 7/3/68, Miss ALICE DEXTER PEEL, Owner, Business Services, home residence 704 Rio Grande, advised she was on tour throughout Europe and the Middle East during the period from 5/12 through 7/27/68. She stated the first portion of her tour was sponsored by Brownell Tours.

PEEL advised she departed New York on the evening of 5/13/68, via Transworld Airlines, Flight 840, and arrived in Tele Aviv on the afternoon of 5/14/68. She remained in Tele Aviv through 5/16/68, and then departed by bus en route to Haifa, Israel. She indicated that the guide for this tour during this portion of the trip was JACOB HENIGMAN. PEEL advised on the morning of 5/17/68, she and members of the tour were on a full-day excursion and were en route to Tiberias. While at a rest stop she recalled that a member of the tour, whose identity she did not recall, asked her if she heard that KENNEDY had been shot. Miss PEEL stated this was the first time that she had heard this remark but that later it seemed that the rumor then spread like wildfire and the tour members were questioning each

Miss PEEL indicated that she could only assume that possibly the tour guide, JACOB HENIGMAN, had told the director of the tour, Mr. JACK KEARNS, that KENNEDY had been shot. Miss PEEL stated unequivocally that at no time did she hear either the director or the tour guide, JACOB HENIGMAN, make a direct statement concerning KENNEDY.

Miss PEEL stated she was not aware of the original source of the information that KENNEDY had been shot; however, she assumed that possibly the source was a broadcast over the Israeli radio. PEEL advised that tour members did question the guide, JACOB HENIGMAN, for further details; however, the guide indicated he had no further information. Miss PEEL advised that the guide upon subsequent questioning the next day after periodically listening to the news broadcasts over the radio replied that "No news is good news."

Miss PEEL advised that on the morning of 5/18/68, tour members continued to question the tour guide for any further details regarding KENNEDY; however, the tour guide indicated again that he had no information. She stated that the tour guide did periodically listen to news broadcasts on the radio and upon questioning would indicate to tour members that the broadcast contained no news concerning KENNEDY. Miss PEEL advised she can only assume that possibly there may have been some error in reporting a news item concerning KENNEDY.

San Antonio indices checked on 7/3/68, prior to interview of PEEL, disclosed no reference identifiable with Miss ALICE DEXTER PEEL.

A third report totaling 746 pages dealing with the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy has been received from the Los Angeles Office. Previous reports were furnished the Department on June 17 and June 21, 1968. Major aspects of our investigation have been completed and investigation has failed to establish the existence of a conspiracy. *Liapzan*
Rafman

This report, which is three volumes, has a brief synopsis, a table of contents, and an index. It has been thoroughly reviewed for accuracy and content.

In summary, this report sets forth additional inquiries at the gun club where Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, the accused assailant, was seen practicing with his .22 caliber pistol on June 4, 1968; it includes results of our searching inquiry into his background and the background of his family; and likewise, sets forth results of interviews with customers at the ammunition store where he is known to have purchased ammunition on at least one occasion. Investigation at the Golden Garter Bar, Alhambra, California, where Sirhan was alleged to have been seen during late May, 1968, is also included in this report. Employees of the Ambassador Hotel, the scene of the shooting, members of Kennedy's staff as well as the press covering his victory speech in the Embassy Room of the hotel, have been interviewed in detail. None of these interviews lend any support to the fact that Sirhan was assisted by one or more fellow conspirators. *2*

In conclusion, we included details relative to the results of FBI Laboratory examinations of much of the physical evidence connected with this case.

MISCELLANEOUS-INFORMATION CONCERNING

Miss VIOLA CASSON, 175 Murray Avenue, Yonkers, NY, contacted the NYO, on 7/6/68, to advise that she had sent "important information" via registered mail to PHOEBE COURTNEY, the wife of an associate of JAMES GARRISON, DA, New Orleans, Louisiana. She said that she sent the information approximately one month ago and requested a return receipt from the Post Office. She had not received any verification of this delivery although postal authorities assured her that a trace of the mail had been instituted.

She advised she contacted the FBI to complain about her missing mail. Miss CASSON further advised that the information which she sent to Mrs. COURTNEY had a direct bearing on the assassination of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY. She said she had collected this information from newspaper articles, television interviews and discussions with her associates. She said that she had no personal knowledge of the assassination but felt that the information she had obtained should be forwarded to DA GARRISON to assist him in his investigations.

Miss CASSON advised that she was a strong supporter of GEORGE WALLACE for President of the US and criticized attempts being made to abolish the House Committee on Un-American activities.

Miss CASSON also indicated that she might write to the Bureau to complain about deficiencies in the USPO and a possible take-over of the postal facilities by unnamed individuals.

The Bureau is furnished the foregoing for information in view of the possibility that Miss CASSON may write to the Bureau and because of her attempts to furnish information to DA GARRISON at New Orleans.

Alleged Accusations made against Kennedy Family.

On June 12, 1968, Mrs. Naomi Gross, 13 Russel St., Toorak, Australia, (presently vacationing in London, England) appeared voluntarily at the American Embassy London, and furnished the following information:

Mrs. Gross stated she boarded Qantas flight 530 in Sydney, Australia at 7:00 PM, June 5, 1968, in route to London. Further, she said she was traveling first class and had sat next to a man who said his name was Clifford Flitty, an American industrialist with Amerada Petroleum Co. in Queensland, Australia, (the company is supposedly an American Canadian venture) who worked out of the company's head office in Brisbane. Mrs. Gross said Flitty also stated he was soon to become the new Vice-President of Union Carbide. Source described Flitty as a man of about 40 to 47 (he told her he was born in 1924), 5 feet 10 inches tall weight about 170 pounds, Gray hair, medium build, and wore glasses. Source reported the flight en route to London stopped at Fiji Island, Honolulu, San Francisco, New York, then London. She said before the plane landed at Fiji Island, Flitty stated "I wish someone would put a bullet between Bobby Kennedy's eyes, and I would wish I could pull the trigger myself." Further, source stated that prior to their landing at Honolulu, the announcement of the Kennedy shooting was announced to the passengers by the captain.

Source advised that when the plane landed in San Francisco, there was to be a four hour layover, and it was at this time the death of Robert Kennedy was announced. Further, she said Flitty stated he was going to send a telegram to Ted Kennedy which was to read "After Two how about you?" and said he may even sign it, and further stated "we will be rid of this trash forever." According to source Flitty talked about ordering champagne to celebrate the tragedy. (attached as exhibit # 1 is the alleged note to be sent to Ted Kennedy in Flitty's own handwriting).

Mrs. Gross reported Flitty disembarked at New York. She said he was traveling alone, and appeared to be in complete control of his faculties during the flight.

Mrs. Gross declined to give her London address, stating she did not wish to involve the people with whom she was staying.

It is the opinion of the reporting agent, that Mrs. Gross is a completely stable individual, was articulate in her speech, and gave every impression of being a highly intelligent woman.
