

Los Angeles reports of 6/9/68, 6/15/68 and 7/1/68 have been reviewed at the Bureau in order to insure that all aspects of our investigation into the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy have been completely handled.

With that in mind the following leads, all pertaining to the background of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, are being set forth for your consideration:

Report of 6/9/68.

- During interview with Mrs. Nell Goris. Theodoria Van Amersfoord, a Mrs. Winsink, and a David Hendrickson were identified as being friendly with Sirhan or members of his family. Vanhuersfoord, Winsink, and Hendrickson should be located and interviewed. See Page 859.
- 2. During an interview with Mauf Mohammad Bedran an individual named Mistig last name unknown was identified as having been with Sirhan Sirhan on the evening of 6/4/68 at the Pasadena City College Coffee Shop. Identify, locate, and interview Mistig. See Page 876.
- 3. Edward Van Antwerp allegedly resided with 13 Sirhan during the Summer and Fall of 1966 in the Highlander Motel, Norco, California. Although 62. 587 Van Antwerp is an alcholic and while his wife and other relatives have been interviewed, Van Antwerp should be interviewed. See Page 882.
- Raymond Sichter, former gardner at the Granja 29 1968 Vista Del Rio Ranch, Corona, California, advised Sirban on 4/20/68 made inquiry concerning Frank last name unknown, former head waiter at ranch. Locate and interview Frank. Conduct inquiry on Cota Street in an effort to identify couple with whom Sirhan resided according to Sichter. See Page 905.
- Locate and interview Rex Bilsworth, 3985 Schaefer Avenue, Chino, California, by whom Sirhan was allegedly employed in 1965. See Page 900.

- 12. Sirhan allegedly studied mysticism with an individual named Paul last name unknown. Locate and identify Paul. See Pages 184 and 185.
- 13. Attempt to determine if Sirhan had a bank account. Review of past salary checks may provide pertinent information with respect thereto.

The information contained in the letterhead memorandum was furnished to SA R. J. LA JEUNESSE, JR., on 7/19/68 by Chief GEORGE STONER, of the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office, Bureau of Investigation, 524 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, California.

Mr. STONER explained that the Honorable EVELLE J. YOUNGER, District Attorney for Los Angeles County, received a letter from Mr. THOMAS C. LYNCH, Attorney General for the State of California, dated 7/15/68. In his letter to Mr. YOUNGER, Mr. LYNCH included a letter bearing a date of 6/16/68 from one, JOSE A. PEREZ QUESTA of Calle Maria B. Sanchez, Number 46, Enriquillo, Dominican Republic. In the letter, PEREZ sets forth a personal desire in his part to personally confront SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN in personal combat for the purpose of killing him.

Mr. STONER advised that the letter was referred to the Office of the Los Angeles County District Attorney because SIRHAN will be prosecuted within the jurisdiction of that agency. In view of the Dominican Republic residence of PEREZ, this office does not anticipate conducting any investigation with respect to this letter. He advised, however, that it was desirable that the Bureau be advised and that perhaps appropriate authority to the Dominican Republic could be alerted, in the event PEREZ attempted to obtain permission to enter the United States. 1.



### Gentlemen:

As I listened to the news of the assassination of Senator Kennedy and heard the name Sirhan, my thoughts reflected on an experience that I had at UNESCO-Paris during the first and second week of February.

This morning I purchased the Daily Star, a Beirut paper, and found the name Sirhan has a family name of Sar'han and that this assailant's family lived near Jerusalem. This rang a bell!

During my briefing in Paris, I was interviewed by a Miss Sar'han from the outskirts of Jerusalem who told me in a nervous manner, almost in tears that I would not be accepted in Jerisalem and Ramallah because I was an American and that the people there were bitter against Americans. After our conversation, I reported the remarks to a member of the American Delegation to UNESCO who immediately knew her name without my announcing it. He stated that this lady was a real fanatic. I have since quoted her to people in UNRWA Headquarters who also agreed that this lady was a fanatic.

It might be worth while to investigate this lady's background and connection with the assailant. It appears that her villa contains an office for UNRWA Headquarters for refugees, or perhaps I could be mistaken about this but it looked like the same place that was pointed out to me as "the villa of Miss Sar'han of UNESCO," (to which I made no reply because I was sure it was meant to bring on some statement concerning my meeting her) and later I stopped in to see an official who was out. The place looked the same as the one pointed out the day before, but I refused to ask if it were the same.

UNRWA is the savior of millions of refugees and yet, they

hate it and the Americans like a plague.

I am leaving Beirut on Saturday morning and will mail this in Chicago when I deplane. From Chicago I plan to go to Norman, Oklahoma to attend the University after stopping for a day or so with my sister. Mrs. Jesse Carter (2538 Massachusetts) of Gary, Indiana.

My address in Norman will be P.O. Box 189, if you care to reach me for any reason.

Talso know that several UNRWA folk had been mentioning the fact that Senator Kennedy spoke of giving more aid to Isreal recently. If Sirhan loved his country that much, he would be here with his arms trying to protect it.

Dear Mr. Clark:

On arriving from Beirut, Lebanon in Dallas June 9th, I mailed three letters which I had planned to mail from Chicago, but due to baggage problems, transfer of air-lines, etc., I did not venture to locate a mail box.

The letters were sent to the F.B.I. in Chicago, New York, and Washington. Since I have not heard from any of them, I still do not know if they were intercepted at some point or other, or if they have been received.

Before leaving Beirut, I talked with the Security Officer at the American Embassy and told him that a lady by the name of Miss Sar'han, stationed in UNESCO HEADQUARTERS, PARIS, informed me during my orientation activities at UNESCO that I would not be accepted in Jerusalem, because I was an American, and that the Arabs there were bitter against the Americans because they had helped Isreal to crush them..." This same lady lives near Jerusalem, - on the outskirts, as did Sirhin Sirhin. The day following the assassination of Senator Kennedy, the Daily News, published in Beirut, carried the story and stated that this man (the killer) had a family name, also known as Sar'han with about 150 kinsmen, etc. just outside Jerusalem. I enclosed this clipting the washington letter.

During the last two weeks in March, this same paper, The Daily News of Beirut, ran a column on the right-hand side of one page with a headline to this effect: Jordan Intelligensia Mute Plan to Oust Westerners. The article stated that doctors, lawyers, teachers, etc. planned to oust the westerners, especially the AMERICAN IMPERIALISTS. On the same page, left side, there was an article stating that the United States was sending \_\_\_\_ million dollars worth of food, etc. to the Arab nations. Gentlemen:

This is a follow-up to my letter sent to you which was dated, I believe, June 14, 1968 (I kept no copy of this letter, therefore I'm not positive about this date). This letter was concerning scoues that were taken probably at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles right before the shooting of Senator Robert Francis Konnedy which were shown on a TV channel in my area on the night of wither Wednesday, June 5, or Thursday, June 6, 1968. This letter told of a particular men in one of these scenes, with either his back or profile to the TV camera, who was moving through the large crowd, in a direction that was away from the camera, at what appeared to be a fast pace, as if with some special purpose or destination in wind, while the rest of the crowd appeared to be moving about rather slowly.

When I received an acknowledgment several days later from Mr. J. Edgar Hoover of the receipt of his copy of this June 14 letter, I was surprised to learn that my letter had been delivered so fast as I didn't have complete addresses for any of the people to whom I sent a copy of this letter. I believe that I put my return address on all of the envelopes for these letters when I mailed them and none of them were returned to me; therefore, I am hoping that they arrived at their proper destinations. 
