The airmail envelope, postmarked 6/16/68, 6 Frankfurt am Main 2, addressed to Herrn (Mr.) Karl Uecker, Stellvertr. Empfangschef (Assistant Reception Clerk), Hotel Ambassador, Los Angeles, (California), bears the return address of:

Recently R. Kennedy got assassinated. It was your luck that he died several hours later. Otherwise you would have had to die. Whoever tries to hinder us in carrying out an assassination must die himself. Nevertheless you have to reckon with the fact of being killed yourself some day. It will happen quite unexpectedly. We will also kill your 15year-old son. Edward Kennedy will be murdered next. We will kill all children of R. Kennedy. The U.S.A. is responsible for the war in Vietnam, and it has to pay for This is the reason why R. Kennedy had to die. it. We only wanted to shock and scare the U.S.A. with this murder. As long as the innocent children in Vietnam have to die or keep on being maimed, the U.S.A. will keep on being rocked by assassinations. We have been in Vietnam. You cannot imagine the horror existing there. Wounded children lie crying in the streets; children with bloody faces run around. Hundreds have been disfigured by burns. Children run amidst blood-covered, dead soldiers. Some children scream like mad from pain because they were shot. U.S. soldiers trampled down on the children wriggling from pain on the ground. Believe us, all this brought us to the point where R. Kennedy had to die. The U.S.A. has to pay for this An unimaginable blood bath goes on there, slaughter. Poor children have to experience all of this. We do not like to see children suffer, and when we heard the screaming children in Vietnam we made the decision to kill R. Kennedy in order to punish the U.S.A. for this cruelty. We were harsh. We will carry out many more assassinations if the U.S.A. does

not cease all bombings of Vietnam at once. The more sorry we get for the children in Vietnam, the more cruel we will get. R. Kennedy's children will die the same way as the children in Vietnam. Something has to be done to put an end to this horror over there. If not, we won't show any consideration, and the U.S.A. will be rocked by assassinations and murders of the children of the prominent political men. We are giving you and your 15-year-old son a forceful warning. Maybe you both will soon kick the bucket. No one should hinder us in our assassinations, otherwise he will be eliminated in cold blood.

> The questioned handwriting on Q1 and Q2 was compared with the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification with any prior submission. Copies are being added thereto.

No indented writing or watermarks were found in Ql and Q2.

Specimen Ql is an airmail envelope containing four "DEUTSCHE BUNDEPOSTE" postage stamps. Two of the stamps are thirty pfennig denomination, one stamp is twenty pfennig denomination and one stamp is ten pfennig denomination. Q1 measures approximately 6.4 by 4.5 inches. The name and address on Ql were written in black ink with a ball-point pen. Specimen Q2 is a sheet of ruled white, air-weight paper bearing gray printed lines measuring approximately 0.4 inches apart. The message on Q2 was written in blue ink with a ball-point pen.

Q1 and Q2 are being returned separately. These specimens have been photographed.

On June 20, 1968, Special Agent Thomas Nagle, U.S. Secret Service, Los Angeles, was advised by a Special Agent of the FBI of the receipt of the previously described letter and envelope by Mr. Karl Uecker. On the same date, a copy of this letter was furnished to Special Agent Robert Barker, U.S. Secret Service. On June 19, 1968, notification was made regarding this matter through liaison established between the FBI and the Los Angeles Police Department.

On June 19, 1968, this matter was discussed with U.S. Attorney W. Matthew Byrne, Jr., Los Angeles, by a Special Agent of the FBI for a prosecutive opinion regarding violation of the Federal Extortion Statute. Mr. Byrne said he would withhold an opinion in this matter in view of the sensitive nature and its connection with the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. He recommended that no investigation be conducted by the FBI. Mr. Byrne said he would confer with officials in the U.S. Department of Justice, Washington, D.C., prior to furnishing an opinion.

On July 16, 1968, Assistant United States Attorney Robert L. Brosio, Chief of the Criminal Division, advised that Mr. Byrne has not yet reached an opinion in this matter. Mr. Brosio said Mr. Byrne recommended that no further investigation be conducted.

The circumstances preceding the July 3 early morning shooting at Saidallah Bishara Sirhan, 36, of Pasadena, have been revealed for the first time in an excusive interview with Saidallah by this newspaper.

Saidallah is the brother of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, 24, also of Pasadena, who is charged

with the assassination of Seh. Robert F. Kennedy last June 3. Saidallah had reported to Pasadena police who have since agreed, that he was shot at while driving the Pasadena Freeway early July 3.

P as a d e n a Chief of Police Samuel H. Addis told this newspaper that "based upon the facts that we have now, there is nothing to indicate that the incident is a hoax. I believe it did happen."

In the interview, Saidallah said that the Pasadena police had given him a very rigid lie detector test. Lt. Gerald E. Wright, head of the detective bureau, verified the giving of the test, but refused to tell its result.

Saidallah also said that he was given a similar test by Enrique Hernandez of the Los Angeles Police Department. The result also is undisclosed because Hernandez took refuge under a court order which he said prevented him from talking about the test.

Discrepancies in released reports prompted this newspaper to seek Saidallah in an effort to determine what actually happened that early morning.

This is his story, in the words in which he replied to questions asked:

"I wanted to meet Liza Williams, a columnist on the Free Press. She writes a column call-

ed 'Grey Power.' I read it every week. I met her at David Saldals Shop, 68 N. Fair Oaks Ave., about three months ago.

"I wanted to consult with her about the laws of publishing regarding reporters using my name for exploitation in any document.

"I phoned the Pasadena Free Press office and asked for hor address the night before the shooting, and they gave me an address such as 92 Fairfax, Los Angeles.

("The address listed in the paper's masthead is 938 N. Fairíax, Los Angeles.)

"The Pasadena office also told me if I wanted more information to call the Hollywood Free Press. I was told that it was located at 65 something street. The name sounded like a Spanish term.

"Early the next morning, about four o'clock I went to find her to avoid the traffic and exposing myself to the public during the day in an area that I am not familiar with.

"After being in that area for a while and not finding what I was looking for, I decided to come back home.

"I took Beverly Boulevard to Hill Street and on into the Pasadena Freeway where I encountered the Chevrolet and the Volkswagen bus. There were three people in the Chevrolet, and four in the Volkswagen.

"I still want to talk to Miss Williams."

Saidallah then told of the shooting episode which substantially corresponded with the report of the incident released by police. He said the Chevrolet and Volkswagen bus were the vehicles that pursued him on the freeway when the two shots coming from the bus were fired

He said the entire trip from Pasadena and back took about one-and-a-half hours.

Asked whether he was given a lie detector test by police, Saidallah replied, "The Pasadena police gave me a lie detector test similar to a third degree about 9:30 that morning, and I was also given another in Los Angeles by Mr. Hernandez about three to five days later"



# Police Rebut Statements By Sirhan

Pasadena police officials, who gave Saidallah B. Sirhan roundthe-clock protection after he said shots were fired at him, today rebutted Sirhan's remarks that he was subjected to a "third degree" and an illegal search. Saidallah, brother of Sirhan B. Sirhan, the accused assassin of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, said the police gave him a lie detector test "similar to a third degree about 9:30" the morning of the shots.

"The polygraph test came in the alternoon after routine questioning," replied Lt. Gerald E. Wright, of the investigative section. "We do not use the "third degree."

The "third degree" refers to quizzing accompanied by physical maltreatment of the subject.

Saidallah complained that after the July 3 incident, his home was searched by an "FBI man ... without a search warrant" and that Saidallah was subjected to insult.

"We do not know of any FBI man being involved," said Lt. Wright. "Saidallah gave me his personal permission for our Sgt. t Ben Hetherington and a Los Angeles detective to go with him to his house to look for evidence."

This flier bears a picture of Sirhan and refers to him as Sirhan B. Sirhan, Palestinian Arab refugee. This flier states, "If death is to be the penalty for Sirhan's misguided political act, then what penalty shall world justice and Arab military might deal out for the genocidal massacres and exiling of Palestinian Arabs from their native land?

It was determined that this corporation does not have any meetings and has no other members other than the subject and his wife, Marjorie Lawrence, nee Friedlander.

In October, 1967, it was determined that the purpose of this organization was to obtain information from the Arab Information Center, New York, New York, and to sell these pamphlets on stands which are operated by the subject.

On June 1, 1968, Harry G. Kaplan, Detective Lieutenant, Nassau County Police Department, Mineola, New York, furnished the identification record of John M. Lawrence, born December 4, 1921 and who is also known as John L. Pawluk. This record reflects information set out in the identification record of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). LAWRENCE was committed on May 8, 1962, in Denver County Court, their number P-27006, and was admitted to the CSH on May 10, 1962.

He was thereafter on special leave from the CSH to appear in Denver District Court and at the Denver General Hospital, Denver, Colorado, for trial and safekeeping purposes an several occasions prior to discharge from the CSH on August 23, 1962. His discharge from the CSH was based on mental condition of "Improved" under special conditions of the court order.

The Denver County Court entered an order on July 18, 1962, in their matter No. P-7006, setting forth that the jury returned the verdict that "Respondent does not, by reason of mental illness, lack sufficient control, judgment and discretion to manage own property or affairs...sufficient to require confinement for his own welfare or welfare and safety of others".

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The court then ordered the defendant discharged as to mental action. The CSH file indicates, however, that the defendant was returned to jail at Denver, Colorado, for Contempt of Court.

Original Medical Commission findings of May 8, 1962, at Denver, identified Dr. ROBERT L. SHERE, and Dr. L. E. DANIELS as having reached a diagnosis of "Hypomaniac psychosis with paranoid mechanisms", which results in the court ordering LAWRENCE sent to the CSH.

JOHN L. CRIFFITH, Esq. appears to have been the courtappointed attorney for the respondent, LAWRENCE, in the sanity matter.

During confinement at the CSH, LAWRENCE was diagnosed on presentment to staff conference May 16, 1962, by Dr. BIYIKSEZOGLAR, CSH, Pueblo, as "Schizophrenic reaction, paranoidtype 000 X 24".

CSH file Narrative Section sets out that LAWRENCE came to the attention of the Denver County Court as a result of Vagrancy and Disturbance of the Peace at Denver, Colorado. NY 105-91643 DN 62-2416 P. 3

LAWRENCE basically refused to provide background or history to the CSH, but stated he was arrested in 1942 on a draft card violation and in 1949 for being drunk in Los Angeles.

CSH files contain lengthy Denver General Hospital Discharge Summary, dated May 10, 1962, which includes data that LAWRENCE turned out numerous legal petitions and directed voluminous letters to persons in high places, such as Chief Justice WARREN and ROBERT KENNEDY. He mentioned things he had done in New York against great political and legal odds. He had expertise on a number of fields, including law, especially constitutional law, and civil liberties law. He eventually asserted he had never been in law school or a member of any bar. The description of his activity in legal work was indistinguishable from that of a special attorney. He was born to a Russian immigrant family, and he has been a crusader who was in frequent contact with authority on all levels.

S. District Court, Denver, Colorado, Civil Action No. 8112, in a 1963 case involving JOHN M. LAWRENCE, Plaintiff, pro se, Vs. RICHARD BATTERSON, ET AL, with numerous additional defendants, including Dr. WILLIS BOWER, former superintendent of the CSH, Pueblo, who filed to recover damages in redress for deprivation, denial of equal protection under color of law of the rights of the plaintiff, growing out of an alleged restraint of his liberty, resulting in imprisonment and confinement against his will.



On June 10, 1968, Joseph Willard "Pappy" Luke, owner of Pappy's Stew House, General Delivery, Highway 90, Raywood, Texas, advised he had been attempting to recall more about the man who came into his restaurant on May 23, 1968 and made various claims about the man's intention to kill a senator in California. Mr. Luke recalled the man stated he worked coast-to-coast but he did not mention any person or company names with which he was affiliated. Mr. Luke advised the man may have said he was a food broker rather than being employed by the Broker Food Company.

Luke advised the man was either Syrian, Italian or French. Luke advised he had a nose like a Syrian. The man wore a felt snap-brim business hat, color unknown, low over his right eye. The man was wearing a dark gray business suit, cut of the suit unrecalled. Tie description unknown. The man was not wearing a coat handkerchief or lapel pin to Mr. Luke's recollection. The man was quite nervous, his voice trembled and his hands shook slightly. The man spoke very good English with no accent noted. The man's sentence structure reflected he was well educated. The man had a large brown leather wallet which opened like a book (coat wallet). The wallet was peculiar in that it had a zipper all the way around the circumference of it. It had a ring in one corner and a silver chain which connected the wallet to the man's belt. The man wore the wallet in his right rear pocket and the chain hung straight down and was tied at his right side. The man had a large roll of dollar bills. The man did not smoke while he was in the restaurant and displayed no smoking paraphernalia.

> A photograph of Sharif Sirhan strongly resembled one of the individuals who accompanied the subject on that date (Page 591 - 593). Sharif and the other brothers denied being at the Gun Shop.

Additional investigation should be conducted in order to determine if either Mrs. Herrick or Arnot can make a positive identification of Sirhan's brothers as having been with him at the Gun Shop. Consideration should be given to allowing both witnesses to view Sirhan's brothers in person.

## GOLDEN GARTER BAR

3. Page 608 - 652 of report dated 7/1/68 deals with investigation concerning an allegation that Sirhan Bishara Sirhan was overheard to make a statement to the effect that "We will get Kennedy" at the Golden Garter Bar. Investigation would indicate that an individual named Robert Andrese may have been mistaken for Sirhan. Extensive investigation should be conducted in order to positively resolve this aspect.

Specifically, the following individuals should be located and interviewed:

Don Trumble (Page 609). "Walking Bill" (Page 642). Kathy Venne (Page 609).

In addition, appropriate steps should be taken to show beyond any doubt that Andrese is the individual with whom Steve Stuart shot pool.

7. Interview of hotel employees in most instances does not set out length of employment. With conspiracy in mind, the possibility of aid to Sirhan by an employee cannot be overlooked, hence those employees recently hired may warrant further inquiry into their activities.

8. Is there any information on Sirhan's method of transportation to the hotel? If not, all efforts to run out through parking lot, cabs, et cetera, should be insured bearing in mind a quick getaway may have been arranged.

9. Page 236 of report dated 7/1/68. Gerald Parmenter associated Sirhan's picture with an individual observed in an old car parked near his apartment and visiting a Jordanian couple. Resolve.

10. Page 43 of report dated 6/15/68. William Thomas Hoog saw two persons approximately 12:15 am., 6/5/68 run across the hotel grounds toward the parking lot. Attempt to identify.

11. Page 278 of report dated 7/1/68. John Stanford Shamel was told by an unidentified man he had chased a man with a gun through the hotel lobby. Attempt to resolve.

Be alert for any possible connection between leads 10 and 11.

12. Page 56 of report dated 6/15/68. Irene Wishnuck stated an unknown person tried to obtain a hotel uniform. Resolve.

13. Page 69 of report dated 7/1/68. According to Frances Bailey, two caucasian males attempted to get waiters jackets to get in to see Kennedy. Resolve.

14. Page 77 of report dated 7/1/68. Fallak Ben-Jabr, parking lot attendant, saw four white males - driver appeared arabic - seeking parking space. Approximately twenty minutes later driver and a blonde girl were seen going into the hotel. Conduct additional investigation.

A review by this office of the points set forth in referenced letter reflect that the suggested interviews and/or investigation have either been conducted or leads have been set forth for the completion of this investigation.

It is noted that under point two in referenced letter, the individual referred to as MISTIG is identical to GAYMOARD MISTRI and the results of interview with this individual appeared on page 869 of Los Angeles report dated 6/9/68.

In connection with item six in referenced letter, no interview is contemplated with Dr. SAMUEL W. WEAVER as a review of the medical record reflects that the apointments scheduled with WEAVER were both cancelled. Also in connection with Dr. JOHN T. GARNER, the one apointment that SIRHAN had scheduled with this doctor was cancelled.

Dr. ROBERT G. FREEMAN was the doctor SIRHAN was referred to by Dr. E. G. KIEHN for X-rays and it is noted that the report on the results of these X-rays was signed by JOHN D. RUTLEDGE, M. D., who is associated with Dr. FREEMAN. The entire X-ray report consisted of only two lines indicating no evidence of bone injury on SIRHAN. For this reason, these three doctors were not interviewed by this office and UACB will not be interviewed.

All other interviews mentioned in referenced letter are being conducted by the Los Angeles Office.
