

SUBJECT: Report on Rumor About Robert Kennedy Being Shot

This office has been informed of a rumor similar to that reported in our out teletype number 06680 of 8 June 1968.

On 23 July 1968 our representative in Mogadiscio, 2. Somalia, was contacted (but not deliberately sought out) by a Mr. J. Christian Kinney, a United States citizen, who volunteered information about a rumor of Robert Kennedy having been Mr. Kinney reported that on 18 May 1968 he stopped in Beirut, Lebanon, while enroute to Mogadiscio, with his wife and child. On the evening of May 18th he entered the Phoenicia Bar, Phoenicia Hotel, Beirut, about one-half hour before closing time. This was either 2130 or 2230 hours according to Mr. Kinney. At the bar Mr. Kinney struck up a casual conversation with a Mr. Joseph/Strong, a United States citi-During the conversation Mr. Strong inquired if Mr. Kinney had heard that Robert Kennedy had been shot. Kinney replied that he had not, and Mr. Strong said that he had heard this just before coming to the bar from a man he did not identify. - 5. The files of this office contain no identifiable information on J. Christian Kinney. Our representative in Mogadiscio reports that Mr. Kinney presently is undergoing a security check for the purpose of permitting him to have access to "need-to-know" classified information in connection with the USAID Mogadiscio water project. It is possible, therefore, that USAID Washington may have information on Mr. Kinney.
- 6. Our representative in Mogadiscio reports that Mr. Kinney described Mr. Joseph Strong as being the Middle East Sales Manager for Raytheon. According to Mr. Kinney, Mr. Strong is based in New York and travels to his sales territory several times a year. It is possible that Mr. Strong may be identical with Joseph Addington Strong who was born on 5 October 1911 at Chattanooga, Tennessee. According to information dated mid-1967 Joseph Addington Strong resided at 743 Wellesley Street, Weston, Massachusetts. He was employed by the Raytheon Company, Wayland, Massachusetts, as International Sales and Projects Manager, Surface Radar and Navigation Operation. He has been employed by Raytheon since 1950.
- 7. This office conducted national agency checks on Joseph Addington Strong in 1964. The checks included the Office of Naval Intelligence (ONI); Department of State, Passport Section; House Committee on Un-American Activities; and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The checks developed no unfavorable information. In 1962 ONI completed a favorable background investigation on Strong. The investigation was predicated on his civilian duties in a contract capacity.

By letter dated June 10th, with enclosure, and received 8-6-68, captioned individual alleges that while watching television film concerning the assassination of Senator Robert Kennedy she saw an individual she claims is identical to one arrested in Dallas following the assassination of President Kennedy. She further claims the frames of film showing this individual were cut from subsequent showings on television. She says she had reported this to the FBI the morning after the assassination and also says she has contacted William Turner, a former FBI Agent well known to the Bureau as a troublemaker, concerning this deletion. She requests that the Director contact her personnally "if you care."

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Mrs. Andreozzi has corresponded with both the Bureau and Senator George Murphy on several occasions. In 11-67 she sent the Director information alleging radio codes were utilized on a radio "talk" program in Oakland, California, and by letter to Senator Murphy in 12-67 she furnished this same information; Senator Murphy, having referred her letter to the FBI, Again, in April, 1968, she wrote to Senator Murphy concerning the same radio program and its moderator, with was concerned about a telephone call giving what she alleged to be classified information. She further mentioned the destruction of transmission towers and cables of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, an investigation of which was then being conducted by the Bureau.



- 3. EDWARD VAN ANTWERP was located and interviewed by the San Francisco Office and results of this interview appear in Los Angeles report dated 7/1/68 on Pages 708 and 709.
- 4. V. FRANK (LNU), referred to by RAYMOND SICHTER, is identical to FRANK DONNARUMMA who was the head trainer at the Granja Vista Del Rio Ranch, Corona, California, and whose wife was a waitress in a cafe. Extensive investigation has been conducted to locate DONNARUMMA and investigation is continuing on this phase.
- 5. No interview will be conducted with REX ELLSWORTH as an employment check made at the ranch operated by ELLSWORTH through Mrs. RUBY GRAY reflects that SIRHAN was never employed at the ELLSWORTH ranch. Results of this investigation appear in Los Angeles report dated 6/15/68, on Page 566.

- 10. CHERYL PIERCE has been interviewed and the results of this interview are set forth in Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68.
- ll. Investigation is being conducted at Pasadena, California, to verify SIRHAN's employment at Peak's Hamburger House.
- 12. The PAUL referred to in Item 12 is believed to be identical to an associate of SIRHAN by the name of PAUL KHOURY. The results of interview with KHOURY appear in Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68. KHOURY is being reinterviewed to specifically determine if he studied mysticism with SIRHAN.
- 13. Checks are being conducted in the Los Angeles area through banking channels to determine if SIRHAN had a bank account. Investigation conducted by this office and the Los Angeles Police Department to date fails to reflect the existence of such an account.
- 14. FRANCISCO TAPIA is currently confined to St. Luke's Hospital for surgery, but arrangements are being made for interview of him. Other members of the TAPIA family all have been interviewed and results will be set forth in forthcoming Los Angeles report.

- 15. HENRY RAMISTELLA is identical to FRANK DONNARUMMA (Item 4) and extensive investigation has been conducted throughout the country to locate this individual. Los Angeles airtel to the Bureau dated 8/5/68, reflects additional leads to locate RAMISTELIA.
- 16. DEST ARNAZ was interviewed by the San Diego Office and results of this interview will be in a forthcoming Los Angeles report.
- 17. OMAR RAMZI has moved from the address where he conducted the meeting of the Arab Student Association and extensive investigation has been conducted by the Los Angeles Office to locate RAMZI. Investigation is continuing in this regard.
- 18. All of the teachers listed under Item 18 have been interviewed by the Los Angeles Office.

In connection with referenced Bureau letter dated 7/1/68, the following information is set forth concerning the investigative points enumerated in that letter.

- 1. Leads are currently outstanding to locate and interview Mr. and Mrs. BENJAMIN EVRA in Lynwood, California.
- 2. Mr. FALLAH BEN-JABR will be reinterviewed and the appropriate photographs will be displayed to him.
- 3. Mrs. MILDRED ALT will be reinterviewed by the Los Angeles Office and appropriate photographs will be displayed to her.
- 4. GEORGE FULTON has been interviewed by the Los Angeles Office and results appear in Los Angeles report dated 6/15/68, on Page 87.
- 5. The Identification Division of the Bureau has been requested by the Los Angeles Office to attempt to determine if EDDIE A. SIRHAN and ADEL A. SIRHAN may be identical. Based on results furnished by the Identification Division, additional investigation will be conducted regarding the location and interview of these individuals.

- 6. Covered in Item 5 above.
- 7. In Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68, Pages 609 to 669, deals with investigation conducted by this office concerning the original information furnished by W. J. WOOD. Based on this investigation, it is not contemplated at the present time to have WOOD listen to available recordings of SIRHANAS voice.
- 8. JUNE ISACKSON was interviewed by the Los Angeles Office and results appear in Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68, Page 658.
- 9. Investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office to display photographs to DAVID PHILLIPPS and LEONORA HOSTETTER and to conduct neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of Dave's Coffee Shop.
 - 10. See Item 9 above.
- 11. All of the guards mentioned under Item 11 have been interviewed with the exception of JACK GRUGAN and JAMES (Last Name Illegible). Investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office to interview GRUGAN and to identify JAMES.
- 12. An investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office to interview FRANCES EVANS who resides in Cerritos, California.
- 13. JOSEPH GABELLO has been interviewed by the Los Angeles Office and results are set forth in Los Angeles report dated 6/15/68, Page 308.
- 14. A complete review of all Los Angeles reports is being made to establish a complete schedule of SIRHAN's whereabouts prior to 6/5/68. This information will be furnished to the Bureau in accordance with instructions with referenced Bureau letter of 7/26/68, concerning the schedule of the subject's life in the United States since his arrival from Jordan.
- 15. Investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office to locate and interview JOSEPH E. JACOBS of Altadena, California.

- 16. The individual introduced to ANWAR MUSA SAYEGH at Bob's Restaurant is identical to GAYMOURD MISTRI. Results of interview with MISTRI were set forth in Los Angeles report dated 6/9/68, on Page 869.
- 17. IVAN (LNU) is identical to IVAN GARCIA and results of his interview are set forth in Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68.
- 18. JOE (LNU) is identical to JOE MARCOVECCHI and investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office to locate and interview this individual.
- 19. SPEAR SAYEGH, employee of GPS Pharmacy, Las Tunas, has been interviewed by the Los Angeles Office.
- 20. All of the individuals named by WILLIAM EVENSON have been interviewed by the Los Angeles Office.
- 21. Investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office to locate HAFEZ ARAFAT at Canoga Park, California, and to interview him concerning SIRHAN.
- 22. KHAIBER KHAN has been interviewed by the Los Angeles Office and results of this interview are set forth in Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68.
- 23. Information from EDWARD VAN ANTWERP concerning the fact that SIRHAN lived with him for five months will be coordinated into the schedule of SIRHAN's activities and whereabouts being prepared by the Los Angeles Office.
- 24. Investigation is being conducted by the Los Angeles Office at the Syrian Orthodox Church for information concerning SIRHAN.

> We previously requested State Department to contact officials of the Iraq and Czechoslovakian Governmen to determine whether there was any validity to reports that Prague, Czechoslovakia, radio on 5/15/68 and Baghdad. Iraq. radio on 5/17/68 prematurely reported that the late Senator Kennedy had been shot. Kennedy was critically wounded on 6/5/68.

> On 8/9/68 Mr. L. Gruza, Office of Security, State, advised Liaison Agents that State was having difficulty, particularly in Iraq where the United States had limited representation, in resolving this matter. Gruza said that efforts are being made to expedite this matter, however, he pointed out that there was some pessimism as to whether any tangible results can be obtained as a result of State's inquiries.
