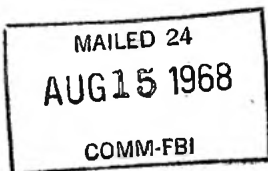

On 8/12/68, the records of the Credit Bureau of Greater Miami were reviewed by IC CLIFFORD M. WERNER with regard to HENRY R. RAMISTELLA, aka Frank Donnarumma. The Credit Bureau records contained no positive information concerning either name.

The Miami Beach Police Department records further indicated that ROSE RAMISTELLA, aka Ronnie, white female, born 11/27/32, at Providence, Rhode Island, was arrested on 6/14/62, for obtaining drugs by fraud. Her occupation was listed as a waitress and her husband's name was listed HENRY RAMISTELLA. Her local address was carried as 2835 NW 3rd Avenue, Miami. The records indicate further that she received a 60-day suspended sentence for the above charge.

On the same date IC WERNER reviewed the records of the Dade County Department of Public Safety with regard to HENRY RONALD RAMISTELLA. These records indicate that on 9/23/63, RAMISTELLA was arrested for petty larceny. His FBI Number was carried as 365 697-C. He listed a local address at 464 NE 31st Street, Miami. RAMISTELLA never appeared in court to answer these charges.

Dade County Department of Public Safety records further indicated that on 9/9/63, RAMISTELLA was arrested for careless driving, causing an accident while driving intoxicated and resisting arrest with violence. His local address was listed as 464 NE 2nd Avenue, Miami.

No disposition was listed as a result of these arrests.

On the same date IC WERNER reviewed the records of the Miami Police Department which records indicate that HENRY RAMISTELLA was arrested on 12/31/59, for investigation regarding heroin addiction. This case was turned over to the Florida State Narcotics Bureau.

The records of the Miami Municipal Court indicate that HENRY R. RAMISTELLA received a seven-day suspended sentence for drunkenness on 8/26/63. These records further indicate that on 8/25/63, ROSE RAMISTELLA received a seven-day suspended sentence for drunkenness. ROSE RAMISTELLA was also charged with disorderly conduct for a suicide attempt which charges were dismissed on 8/28/63.

The records of the Florida State Racing Commission were reviewed with regard to HENRY R. RAMISTELLA, aka Frank Donnarumma on 8/12/68, by SA ELMER C. MULLEN and produced no positive information.

Neighborhood checks were conducted in the vicinity of all local Miami addresses for RAMISTELLA contained in police department files and produced no positive information concerning the current whereabouts of either RAMISTELLA or his wife.

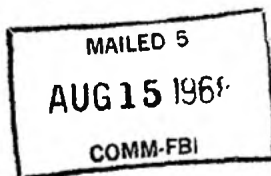

Re Houston airtel 8/8/68, wherein it was indicated Luke positively identified Sirhan's photograph as being identical to the individual in his restaurant, 5/23/68, who stated an intent to kill a senator in California.

This aspect of our investigation into the assassination of the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy must be fully resolved. Houston advise the circumstances surrounding the identification of Sirhan by Luke. Conduct all other logical investigation in order to determine if Luke's story can be corroborated or refuted.

Los Angeles conduct that necessary investigation to definitely account for Sirhan's activities on or about 5/23/68.

Keep Bureau advised.

Luke is an owner of a restaurant at Raywood, Texas, who alleged to Houston Agents that Sirhan was in his establishment on May 23. He has positively identified Sirhan's photograph. While it is almost inconceivable that Sirhan could have been there, it being noted Los Angeles has fairly well established he did not leave the Los Angeles area, it is imperative that we run this thing out in order to answer any future questions that may arise.

Arab Students on American College Campuses are engaging in a vicious campaign of defamation against American Citizens and are casting aspersions on their loyalty ,integrity and devotions to the ideals of America.

The recent assasination of Senator Robert Kennedy can be blamed on these Arab Students due to their inflammatory, irrational and brazen hate activities.

We urge you to request Attorney General Ramsey Clark to undertake an intensive investigation of the nature of the Arab propaganda and action on the campuses and to suppress any manifestations,illegality, abuse and violencewhich are being indulged in by these Arab studentx organizations.

We must not permit these students to castigate the American Government which is extending to them extraordinary opportunities for study,learning and travel. They ARE ABUSING THE HOSPITALITY AND GENEROSITY OF THE AMERICAN TAXPAYER WHO IS DEFRAYING THE COSTS OF THEIR LENGTHY STAY IN THE UNITED STATES. Failure to stem this type of Arab campus involvment will inevitably result in other homicidal tragedies.

OUR GOVERNMENT MUST ADOPT DRASTIC MEANS TO CURB THIS WELL FINANCED ARAB MACHINE .

This is in further reference to our letter of August 9, 1968, relative to the efforts of the Los Angeles Police Department in connection with the proposed interview of Mrs. Ethel Kennedy.

According to information furnished by our Los Angeles Office, Detective Chief Robert Houghten of the Los Angeles Police Department advised his office had been in telephonic contact with Stephen Smith, brother-in-law of the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy, concerning the possibility of arranging an interview with Mrs. Kennedy.

Smith, according to Chief Houghten, advised Mrs. Kennedy would not submit to an interview by either Special Agents of the FBI or officers of the Los Angeles Police Department. It was Smith's opinion that Mrs. Kennedy could contribute very little, if anything, of significance concerning the shooting. He agreed, however, according to Chief Houghten, to contact Mrs. Kennedy in behalf of the Los Angeles Police Department providing that agency would submit a list of questions they desired her to answer. Upon the submission of such a list, Smith stated he would discuss the situation with Mrs. Kennedy and thereafter furnish the results to the Los Angeles Police Department.

The above is being furnished for your information, and as previously indicated, no action is being taken by this Bureau in view of your prior advice.

In connection with the review by the Bureau of Los Angeles reports dated 6/9/68, 6/15/68, and 7/1/68. The following reflects the status of investigation by the Los Angeles Office:

LOCK, STOCK AND BARREL GUN SHOP

1. The family of SIRHAN is being interviewed re his ownership of a pair of white duck pants.
2. In connection with LARRY ARNOT and DONNNA HERRICK the Los Angeles Police Department afforded a polygraph examination to them on 8/5/68 and 8/6/68 respectively. Copies of the complete results of these examinations will be included in a forth coming Los Angeles report.

During the course of investigation tracings at points where crucial questions were asked suggested that ARNOT was being untruthful concerning seeing anyone with SIRHAN at the gun shop on 6/1/68. It was the conclusion of the examiner that ARNOT did not, in fact, remember SIRHAN or the transaction of 6/1/68.

ARNOT stated he confused the sale of the ammunition to three other individuals and could not truthfully recall SIRHAN being in the store on 6/1/68. He knows he made the sale due to the receipt, but cannot recall SIRHAN or the sale.

He stated he was mislead by DONNA HERRICK, who told him that SIRHAN and two other men had been in the store on 6/1/68.

During the course of the polygraph examination of DONNA HERRICK tracings at points where crucial questions were asked indicate strongly that Mrs. HERRICK was being untruthful.

Upon conclusion of examination Mrs. HERRICK was advised that she was either mistaken or deliberately untruthful, but she could not honestly say that she remembered seeing SIRHAN or talking to him in person. Mrs. HERRICK admitted she was confused, but she did believe SIRHAN had been at her store. She was advised that the results of the polygraph did not show this.

3. In accordance with Bureau instructions, investigation of this phase is being pursued so that this area may be completely resolved.

AREA OF SHOOTING

4. Investigation is being coordinated between information by BIDSTRUP and a Los Angeles Fireman to resolve whether or not the unknown male was ~~SIRHAN~~ BISHARA SIRHAN.

5. It is the belief of the Los Angeles Office that the Los Angeles Fireman is identical to HAROLD L. BURBA. Results of interview with BURBA in Los Angeles are in report dated 6/15/68, page 79. Further coordination will be made to determine if this is the true identity.

6. Investigation is being conducted into WILLIAM F. GARDNER to determine the source of the pamphlet, which bore the caption, "Kill Kennedy".

7. WILLIAM F. GARDNER, Chief Security Agent, Ambassador Hotel advised that many of the employees used on the night of 6/4/68 were hired on a temporary basis for these nomination events. The matter of the employees will be pursued by this office.
8. Los Angeles report dated 6/9/68 reflects that the automobile belonging to SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was located on June 5, 1968, in the 3200 block of New Hampshire Avenue, which is close to the Ambassador Hotel. This information appears on page 266 of the designated report.
9. The Jordanian couple referred to by GERALD PARMENTER is identical to MAWAD MOHAMMED SABHA and his wife, SIGRID SABHA of Alhambra, California. Results of interviews with these individuals appear in Los Angeles report dated 7/1/68, pages 671 and 673.
10. Information was developed by the Los Angeles Office that newspaper men ran through the hotel grounds at approximately 12:15 a.m. in the morning of 6/5/68. Additional research will be conducted to resolve this point.
11. It is believed by the Los Angeles Office that the individual referred to by JOHN SHAMEL is identical to MICHAEL WAYNE, who ran through the hotel lobby and was arrested by a security guard. Results of interview with WAYNE appear in Los Angeles report dated 8/7/68 on page 550.

KENNEDY was returning to Los Angeles on a charter plane from San Francisco which stopped several places in Central California. The arrival time was around mid-day or early afternoon. He did not recall the name of the air line or the terminal where Senator KENNEDY came in. KENNEDY usually chartered through American Airlines. There was a large group of fans who met KENNEDY at the time. If an organized group was present SCHAPIRO did not recall any names. The young man in question who is pictured about to attempt to shake hands with Senator KENNEDY was not known to SCHAPIRO and in the opinion of SCHAPIRO, based on study of photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN, was definitely not SIRHAN SIRHAN.

WILLIAM BARRY, KENNEDY Party aid was the only person recognized in the photograph besides KENNEDY. SCHAPIRO said he expected to be in Los Angeles about a week and while here could be contacted through SALLY POWERS, 1221 North Genesee Avenue, Number 654-2883 or at her employment Screen Gems Inc. where she heads the new talent department phone HO 6-3141.

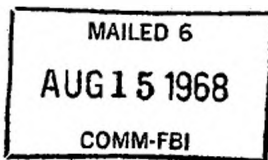

In addition to the name appearing in SIRHAN's notebook, information was received from the Detroit Office that TERRY WELCH, who had been employed with SIRHAN at a ranch in Norco, California, advised that SIRHAN was friendly with a FRANK DONNARUMMA who was employed as a trainer at the Granja Vista Del Rio Farms.

BERT ALTFILLISCH, manager of the farm where SIRHAN was employed, advised that DONNARUMMA and his wife, whose name he did not know, were both alcoholics. ALTFILLISCH stated that about three months ago he received a long distance call from DONNARUMMA and that DONNARUMMA had indicated he was presently living and working in either Newark or West New York, New Jersey. at that time that he was working at a tire manufacturing company. ALTFILLISCH said that DONNARUMMA was hopelessly in debt when he had left Riverside, California; and is probably in the same situation in the Newark area.

The Newark Office conducted investigation in that area but was unable to locate any address for FRANK DONNARUMMA. Records of the New Jersey State Police concerning horse track employees, trainers and owners reflected a SALVATORE DONNARUMMA of Brooklyn, New York, and a SEBASTIAN F. DONNARUMMA of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, who were connected in an owner and trainer capacity at the Freehold Raceway. Both of these individuals were interviewed but claimed not to be related to or to have any knowledge of FRANK DONNARUMMA.

The records of the Riverside Sheriff's Office in Riverside, California, where DONNARUMMA was arrested as HENRY DONALD RAMISTELLA on 7/4/67, were reviewed, but no information was developed that would indicate the present location for DONNARUMMA.

Information was also received concerning DONNARUMMA from the New York Office based on information received from SPENCER DRAYTON, Executive Vice President, Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau (TRPB). DRAYTON was contacted by representatives of "Life" magazine concerning the fact that DONNARUMMA had been a friend of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN. DRAYTON stated that according to their records this individual was HENRY RONALD RAMISTELLA, also known as Frank Donnarumma, whose date of birth was 3/25/32 or 3/25/34. His Social Security No. was [REDACTED] and his FBI No. was 365 697-C. TRPB records contain information concerning reported violations in connection with horse racing on the part of RAMISTELLA up until 1956 when the stewards at the New York tracks barred RAMISTELLA from employment, however, no formal ruling to that effect was issued.

In January 1966, RAMISTELLA was fingerprinted at Santa Anita Racetrack under the name of FRANK DONNARUMMA. TRPB records contain no information which would indicate the current whereabouts of DONNARUMMA. Set forth below is identification record of RAMISTELLA under FBI No. 365 697-C.

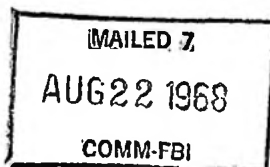

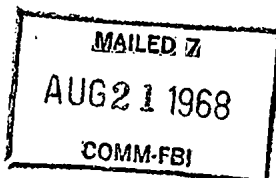
