On July 31, 1968, Omar Z. Ghobashy, an attorney, 15 Park Row, New York, New York, advised that he was the Information Officer for the Egyptian Consulate in New York City, New York, in 1955. In 1962, he was the Chief of Research of the Arab League. He added that the Arab Information Center is under the egis of the Arab League. He stated that pamphlets are available at the Arab Information Center to anyone desiring them. He stated that there is no need to pay for these pamphlets even though a price is published on each pamphlet. He added that the subject or anyone else could walk into the Arab Information Center and get any number of pamphlets he wants, take them out and sell them. He said that the price is published on the pamphlet in order to lend it some respectability inasmuch as it would be degrading if it were given out free of cost. Ghobashy stated that he was in telephonic contact with the subject and stated that the subject appears to him to be unstable mentally. The subject insisted upon using Ghobashy's name in connection with his "Organizing Committee for Clemency for Sirhan," but Ghobashy adamantly refused to grant him permission to use his name.

On August 21, 1968, Omar Ghobashy stated that he had been in telephonic contact with the subject on two occasions with the hope of learning more about the above Committee for Sirhan. He stated that the subject was "close-mouthed" concerning details of this committee and declined to furnish any specific information of Ghobashy.

On August 14, 1968, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past and who has knowledge of certain phases of Arab activities in the New York City area, advised that he is not acquainted with the subject or with the above Committee for Sirhan.

On July 31, 1968, a second confidential source, with whom insufficient contact has been had to determine his reliability, advised that the subject is not associated with the Arab Information Center. He stated that several months ago, the subject visited the Arab Information Center and purchased a quantity of publications. He returned on one other occasion and obtained additional pamphlets for which he did not pay. He was probably charged for these but payment is not pressed by the Center. The main desire of the Center is to disseminate this material and, if payment is not made to them, it is not of any great consequence. He added that single copies of pamphlets are free but a charge is made for large quantities.

On 8/22/68, Lieutenant CHARLES HIGBIE, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) currently assigned to a special unit investigating the KENNEDY assassination, telephonically advised SA R. J. LA JEUNESSE, JR. as follows:

Information has come to the attention of the LAPD that former FBI Special Agent WILLIAM TURNER has been in contact with Attorney GEORGE DAVIS of San Francisco, California. DAVIS has been representing JERRY OLIVER OWEN, about whom previous information has been furnished in connection with this communication. The Bureau will recall that OWEN alleges to be a minister and stated he had been in contact with individual he believes to be SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN during the afternoon of 6/4/68 at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles, California.

According to HIGBIE, DAVIS has taped interviews of OWENS that he is making available to practically any interested party. It has come to the attention of the LAPD that former Special Agent WILLIAM TURNER has been in contact with DAVIS attempting to obtain from DAVIS all information concerning the OWEN aspect of this investigation.

Lieutenant HIGBIE desired to obtain from the FBI background information concerning TURNER including information of a personal nature regarding his former employment with

Special Branch Officers, New Scotland Yard, assigned to London Airport, interviewed United Arab Airline Captain FALAH OMAR on 8/21/68 on his arrival at London Airport from the Middle East. OMAR stated this is his first trip into London for about two months but that he had heard from his crew scheduling department that someone wanted to see him on his next trip into London.

Detective Inspector JACK MORRIS, Special Branch, stated OMAR was friendly and spoke quite openly, but emphatically denied having asked anyone about an assassination attempt on Senator Kennedy. He did state he remembered two U. S. pilots on a flight to Cairo as this does not occur frequently. OMAR advised that he spoke with the two U. S. pilots during the flight but only in general conversation, and again denied asking them about what they knew of an attempted assassination of Robert Kennedy.

The record discloses RAMISTELLA was arrested July 12, 1957, for the theft of food stuffs valued at \$7.00 and October 1, 1956, on a charge of possession of marijuana. On the petit larceny charge, July 12, 1957, he was found not guilty and dismissed; on the narcotics violation he pleaded guilty and received a sixty day sentence which was suspended.

On 9/3/68, HERBERT MC ROY, Administrative Deputy Coroner, Los Angeles County Coroner's Office, 104 Hall of Justice, Los Angeles, California, telephone MA 9-2451 (extension 82480), was telephonically contacted for the purpose of making arrangements to obtain a copy of the autopsy report based on the autopsy of the late Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

MC ROY advised he had previously discussed this with Chief Medical Examiner THOMAS T. NOGUCHI, M.D. On 9/3/68, MC ROY again discussed this matter with NOGUCHI, at which time he was unable to obtain from NOGUCHI an opinion as to whether or not a copy of the autopsy report would be made available to any agency prior to the commencement of the SIRHAN trial. MC ROY further explained that NOGUCHI is well aware that the previously imposed court instructions with respect to release of information in this investigation does not apply to the FBI.

MC ROY stated he would again contact NOGUCHI and attempt to obtain from him a decision with respect to furnishing a copy of the autopsy report, as well as photographs taken at the time of the autopsy.

On 9/3/68, Deputy Los Angeles County District Attorney DAVID FITTS advised his office has not yet received a copy of the autopsy report on KENNEDY and does not expect that it will be released by Dr. NOGUCHI until the trial commences.

Los Angeles will continue to follow this matter and keep the Bureau appropriately advised.

For the information of the Bureau, Governor RONALD REAGAN of California on 9/3/68 vetoed a bill passed by the 1968 Legislature which had been co-authored by Assembly Speaker JESSE M. UNRUH (Democrat, Inglewood), which bill would have required persons wanting to make use of the official autopsy pictures of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY to obtain a court order. The "Los Angeles Times" of 9/4/68 advised that the restriction had originally been requested by District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER of Los Angeles County, who feared there would be a wide demand for KENNEDY photographs by exploiters and the morbidly curious. The article reflected a statement by the Governor that he vetoed the bill because it is "so badly worded that it would have the unintended effect of impeding the legitimate use of autopsy photographs in medical education and research." The Governor also advised that medical researchers and forensic pathologists had complained that the bill would have had a detrimental effect on scientific advancement.

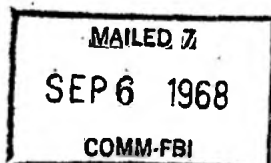

Enclosed for the Bureau are six copies of a LHM reflecting investigation conducted in Raywood, Texas on 8/23/68. Enclosed for Los Angeles are two copies of LHM.

On 6/24/68, Postmaster FRED CONNELL, U.S. Post Office, Raywood, Texas advised J.W. "PAPPY" LUKE is not, in his opinion, senile in any way and does not let his imagination run away from him. LUKE is hard of hearing, does misunderstand people, and could hear part of a story and fill in the remainder in such a way as to change the story. CONNELL advised LUKE speaks loudly and likes to gripe about all sorts of things. LUKE may have appeared sympathetic to someone who opened up and disclosed to LUKE that person's true beliefs. CONNELL restated the fact that LUKE is hard of hearing and may have simply misconstrued what someone said. CONNELL did not observe the man described by LUKE or any vehicle similar to that driven by the man. CONNELL had no idea who the man may have been that LUKE described. CONNELL viewed a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and advised he had never seen anyone similar to this person in Raywood.
