RE: REBECCA FOGEL

Mr. Derick Chase, Radio Station CFRA, Ottawa, Canada, on 10/14/68 advised that the captioned individual. a retired United States Post Office amployee, has alleged that she has been denied proper hospital treatment while in Canada because of undue influence and pressure from American authorities.

According to Mr. Chase, Mrs. Fogel states that although she has been admitted to Canadian hospitals for medical treatment which she desperately needs she is very soon forced from those hospitals because of United States pressure possibly from the FBI. CIA or other such agency. Mrs. Fogel apparently claims she has vital information concerning certain investigations of criminal activity in the United States including the case of Sirhan Sirhan, the alleged murderer of Robert F. Kennedy, and that she is being denied proper treatment in order to keep her quiet concerning such matters.

Mr. Chase was advised that certainly the FBI was not involved in any investigative activity in Canada and would certainly not deprive a person from proper hospital care He stated that he fully understood that this would be true. Bureau files show that Mrs. Fogel is an obvious mental case, a self-admitted homosexual, has claimed to have applied for and been refused political asylum in Israel, Canada, and Australia and has made numerous unfounded allegations against various Government agencies and individuals. 

Los Angeles authorities have provided our Los Angeles Office with the photographs of the autopsy of the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy as well as the neuropathology report pertaining to the post-mortem examination. This material has been forwarded the Bureau. See LA aintel 10/1/168. (2-587-989)

Legislation is currently pending in the State of California which would restrict this material from the general public.

ACTION:

In view of the sensitive nature of this material it is recommended that it should be maintained in the Special File Room of the Records Branch and should be charged out only upon the special authority of the Assistant Director, General Investigative Division. Los Angeles has a set of these photographs and report which they are affording top security. conclusion of Sirhan's trial set for 12/9/68, at which time it would appear Los Angeles would have no need for such material, all photographs and related material will be forwarded to the Bureau for safe keeping.

ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY JUNE 5, 1968

B. APPROX 1951

MISS

On October 10, 1968, a young female telephonically contacted the Jackson Office of the FBI and identified herself as Miss Subrina Duble, white female, age 17. She refused to give her home address or telephone number but stated the nature of her call was to furnish the FBI with important information concerning the assassination of Robert F. Kennedy. Miss Duble related a very rambling episode of how she had met an individual in California whom she had cause to believe was involved in the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. She stated she has had knowledge of this since May, 1968, but declined to report this information due to threatening phone calls and letters warning her to keep anything she might know to herself.

She stated she is a resident of Alabama but did not wish to be contacted at home due to her father's condition, as she is afraid that any upsetting incident might cause him to have another stroke. She did state, however, that she could be reached at telephone number 762-9920, a pay phone in Pascagoula, Mississippi, anytime between 9:00 and 11:00 p.m. any night.

During this call she seemed very emotional and upset over something that had happened just prior to the call and she seemed an out of breath and either crying or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY JUNE 5, 1968

Attempts were made to recontact her on the night of October 11 and 13, 1968, with negative results.

On October 14, 1968, investigation revealed that telephone number 762-9920 is located in an outdoor telephone booth on the premises of Larry's Standard Service Station located at Market Street and Highway U. S. 90 in Pascagoula. The proprietor of this station advised that the name Subrina Duble is unknown to him and that he closes at 8:00 p.m. Inquiry among people who live in the immediate vicinity of this telephone revealed that this is a Negro community and the name Subrina Duble is not known there. A review of Pascagoula City Directory and telephone directory revealed no listing for anyone named Duble.

G. R. Thompson, Identification Officer, Pascagoula, Mississippi Police Department, advised on October 14, 1968, that he has no record of anyone named Duble.

On October 16, 1968, this individual again called the Jackson Office and was connected with an Agent in Biloxi, Mississippi. She stated she had called to say that she wanted to drop the matter and did not want to meet with an Agent. She persistently declined to further identify herself or to agree to meet the Agent. She finally did agree to call him again after she had spoken to her father. Throughout the conversation with her, her conversation appeared to be rambing and disconnected.

On October 19, 1968, she telephonically contacted an Agent of the FBI at Biloxi, Mississippi, and at that time

agreed to meet him in the lobby of the LaFont Inn, a motel on Highway U. S. 90 in Pascagoula at 9:00 on the evening of October 20, 1968. She again refused to further identify herself except to say that she is tall, has white blonde hair and a mole on her face.

On the evening of October 20, 1968, an Agent of the FBI remained in the vicinity of the lobby of the LaFont Inn from 9:00 p.m., until after 10:00 p.m., but Miss Duble did not appear.

On 10/28/68, representatives of Secret Service Headquarters furnished a copy of a communication addressed to Richard Nixon and Hubert Humphrey, National Headquarters, Willard Hotel, Washington, D. C. This communication was allegedly signed by Sharif Bishara Sirhan and was postmarked Pasadena, California, October 22, 1968. The return address was given as Sharif B. Sirhan, 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California, and the envelope was addressed to Nixon.

Copies of the attached are forwarded for the information and assistance of Los Angeles. An effort is being made through Bureau liaison to obtain the original or a more detailed copy. The Laboratory is conducting examination of the signature in order to determine if it was, in fact, that of Sharif Bishara Sirhan.

Inasmuch as the communication may constitute a possible violation of the Extortion Statute Los Angeles should initiate immediate investigation in order to determine whether it was in fact prepared by Sharif Sirhan. Consideration should be given to conducting an immediate interview of the suspect.

Expedite and advise Bureau of results.



The questioned communication allegedly signed by Sirhan Sirhan's brother is extremely pro-Arab and anti-Semetic in nature and is generally critical of positions allegedly taken by Nixon and Humphrey in support of Palestine. The writer pleads "do not force us to belizve in political assassination which is against our heritage and culture unless we are pressed from you." The letter contains implied threats to destroy every American politician who supports or negotiates any kind of help to the Zionist State. Of even more significance is the fact that the writer's strong language would seem to imply at least endorsement and possible complicity in the assassination of the late Senator Kennedy. Accordingly, it is necessary that we obtain full details.

ATTENTION FBI LABORATORY:

Attempt through known specimens of Sharif Bishara Shirhan's handwriting to determine whether he did in fact prepare this communication. Bureau liaison is attempting to obtain either the original or more clearly defined copies.

SUBJECT:

Enclosed herewith are six negatives obtained from JOHN V. KENNY, a Providence College student, who was in the Embassy Room of the Ambassador Hotel at Los Angeles, California, and who was in his own words approximately twenty-five feet from the location where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was shot on 6/4/68.

Mr. KENNY advised that he had in his possession a camera which he held over his head and continued to snap pictures of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY as he passed through the kitchen corridor immediately prior to the shooting.

Mr. KENNY stated that the pictures taken in the corridor apparently were not clear enough to be developed, but he did have them in his possession when interviewed on October 17, 1968.

Mr. KENNY stated that he belived that the negatives number 18A through 20A were the shots taken by him immediately prior to the shooting of Senator KENNEDY.

- 1. An official Spanish service informed this office in a report dated 24 September 1968 that it had taken a statement from Spanish national Agustin CORREA Rafael, DPOB: 2 August 1947, Herrera de Alcantara (Caceres), Spain, after he had been arrested on 20 June 1968 by the Civil Guard for driving without a license. He had been arrested twice before for having crossed international borders (not further identified) clandestinely.
- 2. CORREA stated that he had become involved in smuggling activities in Portuguese territory about three years ago through a Portuguese count (not further identified). The count is about 45 years old, owns a castle inCastel de Vide, Portugal, which is about eight kilometers from the Spanish Portuguese border, and has ten children.
- 3. The above-mentioned count is in contact with a United States national whose name is believed to be Jose CAR(R) from Dallas, Texas. CAR owns twelve launches on which he transports merchandise, liquor, and tobacco to different places on the Portuguese coast mostly in the Lisbon and southern areas. CAR comes to Portugal about every 20 days and stays at an unidentified hotel in Lisbon. The count is always informed of CAR's arrival in Portugal.
- 4: On 12 June 1968, CORREA overheard a conversation between CAR and an unidentified person during which CAR said, "We have already, taken care of Robert Kennedy, his brother will fall soon." The conversation took place on the launch "Fatima".


