SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN

On June 5, 1968, at 12:15 A.M., Senator Robert F. Kennedy, United States Senate, was at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, celebrating his victory in the primary elections for the selection of a Presidential candidate for the Democratic Party for the forthcoming elections in November 1968. At that time Senator Kennedy was shot and killed, and the assassin was taken into custody. The assassin was identified as Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, and he is presently awaiting prosecution in the custody of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office, Los Angeles, California.

The Los Angeles Police Department, Los Angeles, California, was furnished a letter addressed to John Weidner, 1380 North Lake Street, Pasadena, California, from one Mr. Esbes, Poste Restante Utrecht, Bernardplain, Utrecht, Holland, which is believed possibly to have been intended for Sirhan Bishara Sirhan. A copy of the letter, envelope, and a copy of a letter sent by the Los Angeles Police Department to the Hoofdbureau, Gemente Politie, Utrecht, The Netherlands, are attached.

The Los Angeles Police Department are most interested in making a determination as to:

1. The identity and background of Mr. Esbes.
2. The identity of the person for whom the letter was intended.
3. If the letter was intended for Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, all information that might be in the possession of Mr. Esbes concerning this individual.

Enclosed is a copy of a letter which was received by an ex-employer of Sirhan B. Sirhan.

Sirhan B. Sirhan, is in custody of the Los Angeles Sheriffs Office for the alleged assassination of United States Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

We are attempting to determine the authenticity of this letter and also the date it was sent from Holland to the United States. Our crime lab interpreted the post mark as being 21 VI 10, 1968. A clarification of this date is requested.

It is further requested that Mr. Eshes, be interviewed and that all information possible with respect to the writer of this letter and his alleged acquaintance with Sirhan be forwarded to this department.

At present there is serious doubt that said writer knew Sirhan. Investigation thus far indicates this letter is a hoax. Please be assured of our cooperation in all matters of mutual interest.

be sorry for later and please give me finally your real
adress. I even believe that this adress is not complete
without the name of the street I thought Los Angeles was
so big that this could hardly be enough

Why don't you get married right away than you can
have your own adress. Moving from one to the other is not
good at all.

My daughter is growing up fine. She will be 9 years
old at the [REDACTED] Send her a nice card will you?"

Well Sir I am going to bed now because it

Cooper may be indicted since investigation has indicated he and others had access to grand jury transcripts prior to their release.

interviewed by this office with the exception of MURIEL LEE, who did not actually observe the shooting of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY nor did she observe SIRHAN prior to the shooting. Interview of MURIEL LEE will be conducted by the Los Angeles Office and the results set forth in a forthcoming Los Angeles report.

It is noted that this list of witnesses does not include any technical or medical witnesses. The names of such witnesses to be used have not as yet been furnished by the Los Angeles County District Attorney's office.

For the information of the Bureau, as of approximately noon, 12/4/68, the Pasadena Police Department, who have had a fixed observation post on the SIRHAN residence in Pasadena, advised that this was now being given up. The Pasadena Police Department advises that the security measures in effect will be (1) frequent pass-bys by a police cruiser and a stop by a police cruiser at the residence at least once a day, (2) the installation of a "hot telephone" at the SIRHAN home so that anyone at the residence wishing to contact the Pasadena Police Department may do so by merely lifting the receiver.

Attorney Grant B. Cooper made motion to be included as an attorney of record to represent Sirhan Bishara Sirhan and was granted a postponement of trial from 12/9/68 to 1/7/69. Attorney Emile Zola Berman is also to assist in defense of Sirhan. Postponement based on previous commitments of these attorneys. Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge ruled closed circuit TV coverage of trial would be used to accommodate large number of press who made application to attend. Judge said the jury would be sequestered during trial.

You were previously advised that Attorney Cooper served on Los Angeles County District Attorney Staff. He has represented a teamster, an individual who appeared before the House on Un-American Activities in 1956, a well-known Chinese espionage subject, individuals of the criminal element, and is rated as a very prominent capable criminal attorney by news sources.

Emile Zola Berman is the newest addition to Sirhan's defense staff. He has never been the subject of FBI investigation. His rise to prominence occurred in 1956 when he successfully defended the Marine Drill Sergeant charged with the murder of six recruits who drowned in a South Carolina swamp during training. In 1939 he was an active member of the National Lawyers Guild (NLG), cited as a communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, and last paid his dues on 12/1/39. "The New York Times" of 11/14/49 reported Berman was scheduled to present a mock trial at a meeting of NLG in November, 1949. Berman was born 11/3/02, in New York City. He received Bachelor and Law Degrees from New York University in 1923 and 1924 respectively. He has practiced law in New York City since he was admitted to the bar in 1925. Berman was an Air Force intelligence officer in the China-Burma-India Theater during World War II.

[REDACTED], interviewed at his home, [REDACTED], at first denied and then in the presence of his mother admitted that he made several telephone calls to the Jackson Office of the FBI in which he identified himself as a seventeen-year-old white female named SUBRINA DUBLE and that in these calls he stated he had pertinent information regarding the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

He stated he has no information whatsoever regarding the KENNEDY assassination except what he has heard and read in the newspapers. He said that he does not know what motivated him to make these telephone calls.

Throughout the interview, [REDACTED] was uncommunicative and stared at the floor.

The Directie Politie furnished the following information which it said had been developed by the police of Utrecht:

The postmark on the envelope of the letter to the subject shows the posting date to be June 21, 1968. The letter was without doubt posted in Utrecht on that date and canceled at the Main Post Office in Utrecht between 10:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. The stamps on the envelope are of a special series which were issued in the Netherlands only between May 1, and May 28, 1968. The postage was insufficient since the charge for a letter directed to the United States, not exceeding twenty grams in weight, is 45 cents.

The name ESBES was searched through the records of the Register Office in Utrecht, and the Central Civil Registry in The Hague, with negative results. It can be said, therefore, that no person utilizing this name is registered as living in the Netherlands.

The address 51 Prins Bernhardplein, Utrecht, is occupied by a branch post office. The manager of this branch stated that it is unusual for letters to be directed to General Delivery (Poste Restante) at this branch post office. During the past year not a single letter addressed in this manner has been handled by this branch. Inquiries at the Main Post Office in Utrecht revealed that there was no information of any mail being handled through General Delivery there for a Mr. ESBES.

Mention is made in the letter of a daughter of the sender who was born on [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Efforts to identify the writer through this indicated birth of his daughter proved to be negative.

It has not been possible for the police in Utrecht to identify the writer of the letter to the subject. The Utrecht Police believe it to be a hoax letter and the name ESBES to be fictitious. They suggest the possibility that the name may have been devised from the initials of the subject, S.B.S., which phonetically might be written as es-b-es.

The Directie Politie said that a man named Alwin Edgar Philip Wolfgang, born August 9, 1922, in Paramaribo,

and now living in Amsterdam, Netherlands, is known to them through its records. A few years ago, Wolfgang, who is regarded as probably mentally disturbed, wrote letters to persons who were involved in sensational cases. One such letter was addressed to Mrs. J. D. Tippit, widow of the police officer who was shot and killed during the investigation immediately following the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. In view of this, the police in Amsterdam were asked to make inquiries to determine whether Wolfgang could have written the letter addressed to the subject. The Directie Politie furnished an English-language translation of the report of the Amsterdam Police reflecting the results of those inquiries. A copy of that report is incorporated as Pages 7 and 8 of this memorandum.

With reference to letter dated 3 September 1968, Reference 7.219/218 - 7.313/1418, received from the Head of the National Central Bureau of Interpol in The Hague, asking for enquiries to be made respecting a letter written to Sirhan B. Sirhan, now in custody for the alleged assassination of United States Senator Robert F. Kennedy, I, Detective-Constable 1st Class Dirk PEERBOOM of the Amsterdam Municipal Police, have to report that I have made enquiries as requested.

Records of the Register Office in Amsterdam show that at the address 1st Floor 142, Admiralengracht, Amsterdam is living: Alwin Edgar Philip WOLFGANG, born 9th August, 1922, at Paramaribo.

This person was married at Utrecht on the 13th September, 1950 to Celia JACOBS, born 23rd October, 1932, at Utrecht. There are two children by this marriage, namely [REDACTED], a girl, born [REDACTED] at Utrecht and [REDACTED], a boy, born [REDACTED] at Amsterdam. The girl [REDACTED] lives at [REDACTED], where she has lived since July, 1967.

In order to have it ascertained by the police scientist Mr. D. Eskes of Amsterdam Police Headquarters whether or not the letter sent to Sirhan B. Sirhan has been written by the said A.E.Ph. Wolfgang, I, the reporting officer, handed the said police scientist a copy of the said letter to Sirhan B. Sirhan, received from the Head of the N.C.B. of Interpol in The Hague and also a letter dated 12th February, 1968 written by A.E.Ph. Wolfgang to his employer, which had been lent to me by his employer for investigation purposes.

After comparison of the handwritings of the said two letters Mr. Eskes stated that he was of opinion that the handwritings were not alike. He said that he had not been able to find clear points of similarity in the handwritings of the two letters, on the ground of which it would have been possible for him to identify A.E.Ph. Wolfgang as the writer of the letter addressed to Sirhan B. Sirhan. Mr. Eskes, who also said that he was not convinced that A.E.Ph. Wolfgang had not written the letter to Sirhan B. Sirhan, said afterwards that he was all the same inclined to believe that Wolfgang was not the writer of the letter in question.

Further it should be mentioned that the writer of the letter in question says in his letter that his old boss came to him to ask him back to work on 1st June, 1968 and that his daughter, who is growing up fine, will be nine years old on the [REDACTED]

Enquiries have however shown that Wolfgang has not changed em-
ment and that his one and only daughter, who was born on [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] reached the age of seventeen on [REDACTED]

A.E.Ph. Wolfgang is not recorded in the criminal files of the
Amsterdam Police, but records of Amsterdam Police Headquarters do
show that in 1964 he was the subject of enquiries concerning letters
written by him to Mrs. Tippit, the widow of an American police offi-
cer and to Mr. Alfred Krupp of Düsseldorf.

The results of these enquiries were reported in the usual manner
to the relevant authorities.

A request for information about A.E.Ph. Wolfgang was also made
in 1966 by the Special Agent of the Treasury Department of the United
States Secret Service in Paris.

In connection with the above matter I, the reporting officer,
saw the said A.E.Ph. Wolfgang at Amsterdam Police Headquarters on 14th
October, 1968. He then stated to me for sure that he had not written
the letter dated 5th May, 1968 and addressed to Sirhan B. Sirhan. He
had no idea who might have written that letter. On being asked he said
that he only knew Sirhan B. Sirhan from newspapers.

Finally I, the reporting officer, wish to state:-

1. that I have not been able to identify the writer of the letter
dated 5th May, 1968 and addressed to Sirhan B. Sirhan;
2. that the enquiries into the matter have been made in cooperation
with a colleague of the Special Branch of the Amsterdam Municipal
Police;
3. that a copy of the letter dated 12th February, 1968 referred to
hereinabove - this letter was returned to Wolfgang's employer on
15th October, 1968 - is attached hereto.

It is noted that the Mr. AOYAMA interviewed sub-

AOYAMA was unable to provide any information regarding the assassination of Senator KENNEDY. AOYAMA denied that he had ever seen SIRHAN and said he knew nothing about him. AOYAMA advised that Mr. HIRANO recently had an eye operation and was recovering in the Hagiwara Hospital, Tokyo, Japan.

The source advised that on October 14, 1968, HIROSHI HIRANO, Vice President, Nisshin Hodo KK, was interviewed and related substantially the same information as that provided by AOYAMA. HIRANO said he did not know SIRHAN and denied that he had ever seen him. He was unable to provide any information pertinent to the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

The source advised that on October 24, 1968, TAMETAKA MORINAGA, Chief, President's Office Staff, Nisshin-seito KK, was interviewed and related substantially the same information as that provided by AOYAMA and HIRANO. He said that he did not know SIRHAN and denied that he had ever seen him. MORINAGA was unable to provide any information pertinent to the assassination of Senator Kennedy.

DETAILS:

1. This investigation was opened at the direction of the Commander, OSI District 46, on 10 October 1962, predicated on a letter from the Legal Attache, American Embassy, Tokyo, Japan requesting that three persons in Japan be interviewed to ascertain whether they possess any information relative to the assassination of United States Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California on 5 June 1968.

2. On 1 October 1968 RODERICK V. PRECHTL, JR., Legal Attache, American Embassy, Tokyo, Japan, provided a copy of a memorandum from the FBI Field Office, Los Angeles, California, dated 17 Sep 68, subject: Assassination of United States Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, 5 Jun 68. That memo reflects that SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, Born: 19 Mar 44 in Jerusalem, was observed to shoot and kill U. S. Senator Kennedy in the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, at approximately 0015 hours, 5 June 1968, and that he was subsequently taken into custody by the Los Angeles Police Department. The memo further reflected that on 7 Jun 68 SIRHAN was indicted by the Grand Jury, Los Angeles County for murder and was awaiting trial. The memo reflected that the below listed persons were guests of the Ambassador Hotel and that the Los Angeles Police Department requested assistance in locating and interviewing those persons to determine if they are in possession of any information regarding the assassination of Senator Kennedy or knowledge of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN:

3. On 7 October 1968 a representative of Ace International Tool Co, was contacted with the assistance of KUWABARA Shigeo, Investigative Technician, this district. That person advised that none of the three aforementioned persons were actually employed by Ace International. She said that Mr. AOYAMA and Mr. HIRANO could be contacted at the Nisshin Road Construction Company, #3, 2-chome, Nihonbashi, Kaomi-cho, Chuo-ku, Tokyo, Japan. She also advised that Mr. HIRANO could be contacted at telephone (Tokyo) 666-6361.

✓ 4. On 10 October 1968 AOYAMA Akira, Chief, Planning Division, Nisshin Hodo KK, #3, 2-chome, Nihonbashi-Kaomi-cho, Chuo-ku, Tokyo, Japan, was interviewed at his office with the assistance of KUWABARA. AOYAMA stated substantially as follows:

He, along with MORINAGA and HIRANO arrived at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, at approximately 2340 hours, 4 Jun 68. They checked in at the front desk and went directly to their separate rooms. He (AOYAMA) stayed

in his room for only a few minutes and went to HIRANO'S room where the three (HIRANO, MORINAGA, and AOYAMA) met to discuss their plans for the following day. After that discussion, interviewee returned to his room where he stayed for a few minutes, then went downstairs to the lobby. There he found everything in a state of confusion. He did not understand what was taking place because he did not understand English. The next day Mr. MORINAGA, who understands English, told him what had happened, and said that he (MORINAGA) had watched television in his room after the aforementioned meeting had been completed and the others had departed. AOYAMA was unable to provide any information regarding the assassination of Senator KENNEDY. AOYAMA denied that he had ever seen SIRHAN and said he knew nothing about him. AOYAMA advised that Mr. HIRANO recently had an eye operation and was recovering in the Hagiwara Hospital, #30-13, 1-chome, Hongo, Bunkyo-ku, Tokyo, Japan. He cautioned that AOYAMA was in serious condition and was not allowed visitors.

5. On 11 October 1968, attempt to contact Mr. MORINAGA with the assistance of KUWABARA met with negative results. A representative of Nisshin-seito Company, #3, 2-chome, Nihonbashi, Chuo-ku, Tokyo, of which he is Chief, President's Office Staff, advised that he was out of town on a business trip and was not expected to return until about 15 October 1968.

6. On 14 October 1968 a representative of the Hagiwara Hospital was contacted with the assistance of KUWABARA. After consultation with Mr. HIRANO she advised that Mr. HIRANO could be interviewed.

7. On 14 October 1968 HIRANO Hiroshi, Vice President, Nisshin Hodo KK, was interviewed with the assistance of KUWABARA. HIRANO related substantially the same information as that provided by AOYAMA. HIRANO said he did not know SIRHAN and denied that he had ever seen him. He was unable to provide any information pertinent to the assassination of Senator KENNEDY.

8. On 16 and 21 October 1968 a representative of Nisshin-Seito KK advised that MORINAGA had returned from his business trip, but was suffering from influenza, and was not in his office.

9. On 24 October 1968 MORINAGA Tametaka, Chief, President's Office Staff, Nisshin-seito KK, was interviewed with the assistance of KUWABARA. He related substantially the same information as that provided by AOYAMA and HIRANO. He said that he did not know SIRHAN and denied that he had ever seen him. MORINAGA was unable to provide any information pertinent to the assassination of Senator KENNEDY.

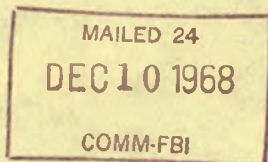

The Paris city directory lists a C. CLEVA at 10 avenue Georges Mandel, Paris 16, France, telephone number 704-5770. Repeated telephone calls to the above residence during the month of November 1968 determined that no one was answering the telephone.

On 11/25/68, the manager of the building at 10 avenue Georges Mandel, Paris 16, advised that Mrs. C. CLEVA was presently abroad and not expected to return until after 12/20/68. Her exact present whereabouts was not known. The manager further advised that no one by the name of Mr. or Mrs. P. A. CLEVA resided at this address. The manager did state, however, that P. A. CLEVA may possibly be Mrs. C. CLEVA's son, ALEXANDER CLEVA, whose address was not known to the manager.

Paris will attempt to locate Mrs. C. CLEVA sometime after 12/20/68 in an effort to determine the present whereabouts of Mr. and Mrs. P. A. CLEVA in order that they may be interviewed in accordance with the request contained in referenced Bureau letter.
