News Article on Forged Check Re:

An article appeared in the local press under dateline Corona, California, reflecting that the Corona, California, Police Chief advised that a forged check stolen from a construction company was cashed in a grocery store in Corona in November 1966, by a man believed to have been SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN.

This alleged forgery in the amount of \$81.57 was unnoticed by the store owner until contacted by the State Department of Justice. The check in question was made out in the name of SIRHAN and was endorsed in his name. gation by police in 1966 showed that nine blank checks had been stolen from the Altfillisch Construction Company. SIRHAN's name was typed on one of the checks and the amount filled in by a mechanical device.

On 12/9/68, BEN BIGGERS, Assistant Chief of Police, advised that the police report on this matter reflects that this concerned a forgery of the endorsement indicating that the check was actually made out to SIRHAN by the company but was stolen from him and cashed by an unknown person.

Re: News Article re Cost of Trial

Local press carried article that Los Angeles County Supervisor KENNETH HAHN suggested that Congress reimburse the County of Los Angeles for the cost associated with the trial of SIRHAN SIRHAN. He estimates the cost will exceed one million dollars.

His suggestion was contained in a letter to Senator GEORGE MURPHY, Senator-elect ALAN CRANSTON, and each member of Congress from Los Angeles County.

HAHN pointed out that Senator ROBERT KENNEDY was a Federal official running for a Federal office and the matter was of national and international concern.

Supervisor HAHN felt it unfair for the tax payer of Los Angeles County to bear this excessive cost.

District Attorney EVELLE J. YOUNGER announced in the local press that his office will discontinue further legal testing of a court order forbidding persons connected with the SIRHAN case from discussing evidence outside of court.

This statement was made after the U. S Supreme Court left standing the ban placed by Los Angeles Superior Court Judge ARTHUR L. ALACORN.

The higher court declined to hear YOUNGER's appeal of a lower court ruling sustaining Judge ALACORN's order.

POTENTIAL WITNESS IN THE
ASSASSINATION OF SENATOR ROBERT F. KENNEDY

On June 5, 1968, at 12:15 A.M., Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, at the conclusion of an election victory rally held by the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy (Democrat, New York), shot and killed Senator Kennedy while in a kitchen area leading off the Embassy Room at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California. Sirhan utilized a .22 caliber revolver in committing this act. Sirhan is being held to answer, his trial being set for January 5, 1969, in the Los Angeles County Superior Court at Los Angeles, California.

Among the persons interviewed who were present in the Embassy Room at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, in the early morning hours of June 5, 1968, was Ceci Doucet, 1802 S. W. 10th Avenue, Portland, Oregon. She said on December 4, 1968, that Stus Pruszynski, of 2190 Crescent, Apartment 4, Montreal, Canada, or care of Cicero, 1248 West 24th Street, Los Angeles, California, had been present in the Embassy Room at the time of the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

Mrs. Yolanda Chaney, 17563 Rinaldi Street, Granada Hills, California, advised on December 12, 1968, that she is the daughter of Rose Cicero, now in Spain, who owns the apartment property at 1248 West 12th Street, Los Angeles, California, where Stus Pruszynski was a former tenant in Apartment 4. She described Pruszynski as a free lance reporter and writer who did work for the Canadian newspapers "The Gazette" in Montreal and "The Star" in Toronto.

According to Mrs. Chaney, Pruszynski claimed that he was at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, and about fifteen feet behind Senator Robert Kennedy when Senator Kennedy was shot. Mrs. Chaney further advised that Pruszynski had claimed that he had made a tape recording during the time he was at the Ambassador Hotel. No further details were known

to Mrs. Chaney, who said that she herself was not present at the Ambassador Hotel when Senator Kennedy was shot.

It is desired that Mr. Pruszynski be located and interviewed as to any factual data he may have in his possession relating to the events at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, on the evening of June 4, 1968, and early morning hours of June 5, 1968.

Rost in the Crowd-Is It

JUST ANOTHER FACE in the crowd . . . or? Herald-Examiner photographer Bob Shultz in reviewing the pictures he took on the night the late Sen. Robert Kennedy was assassinated was suddenly struck by a face in the crowd, the crowd that had gathered at the Ambassador Hotel in victory celebration following the election victory in California of Senator Kennedy. To Schultz and others who studied the picture and the enlargement, the face had the characteristics of accused assassin Sirhan B. Sirhan. But two other factors intrigued those who studied the pictures. One was that the "face in the crowd" was stationed to the right of the speaker's stand near the exits that Senator Kennedy later took toward the kitchen and his death. The other was the "polka-dot"-like coat of the woman who was standing near the "face" in question. Investigators from the Los Angeles Police Department were presented with the pictures. They have refused to make any positive identification, ruling out any other connection between the "face" and the assassination. They do point out that the hand raised near the "face" apparently belonged to someone else in the crowd. Official Los Angeles Police Department photos as displayed after the assassination by Mayor Sam Yorty and Police Chief Tom Reddin are shown for comparison with the new pictures of "the face in the crowd" the night Senator Kennedy was shot.

Arrow in top photo boints to man bearing resemblance to accused assassin of Senator Robert Kennedy. Picture was made at Kennedy victory celebration moments before the Senator was slain. Details of man's appearance are enlarged in blowup at left. Comparison of the unidentified person and Sirhan can be made by the photos of Kennedy suspect displayed by Police Chief Thomas Reddin, right.


