This is in reply to your inquiry received January 25, 1971. captioned "Freedom of Information Act," which concerns a request by one Michael James Clark for access to certain reports regarding Sirhan B. Sirhan. In his letter to the Department, Clark bases his request on the fact that he alleges FBI reports had been made available to Robert Blair Kaiser, the author of the recently published book, "RFK Must Die."

As was indicated in my letter of November 18, 1970, captioned as above, FBI reports were furnished the Los Angeles County, California, District Attorney's Office with the request they not be disseminated outside that office. Neither the FBI nor the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office furnished copies of FBI reports to the defense.

Defense counsel through the court demanded production of the Los Angeles, California, Police Department and FBI interviews of pertinent individuals in connection with the investigation. Review of these interviews was made by the prosecution and copies of requested interviews made. This material was then taken to the court and, upon proper order, turned over to the defense by the court. No restrictions were imposed concerning the use which could be made of this material.

This Bureau did not make copies of FBI reports available to Robert Blair Kaiser. Accordingly, it is recommended Clark's request be denied since the information requested by him is contained in investigatory files compiled for law enforcement purposes.

NOTE: This is another in a series of requests which have been received by the Department under the Freedom of Information Act for FBI reports in the Robert F. Kennedy assassination investigation. Bureau files show the correspondent, Michael James Clark, may be identical with an individual who supported an anti-Vietnam advertisement in a Reading, Pennsylvania, newspaper 1-8-67.

Robert Blair Kaiser is a former staff writer and photographer for "Time" and "Life" magazines who was appointed a member of the Sirhan defense team and participated in his defense under the guise of investigator. A review of his book has found it to be replete with inaccuracies and outright lies.

Our position in this reply to the Deputy Attorney General is consistent with our previous position when the Department has requested our views relative to making FBI files available to individuals requesting same under the Freedom of Information Act.

MIRON BUTARIU (Bufile 105-116797) was interviewed on 1/19/71, by SA CRONIN.

The confidential source in the LHM is MARIN DATCU, who furnished the information on 1/7/71, to SAS CRONIN and SUGHRUE.

GUGU furnished the information on 12/7/70, 12/29/70, and 1/18/71, to SA CRONIN.

KORNEA furnished the information to SAS CRONIN and SUGHRUE on 1/21/71. Information from KORNEA's son was received

by SA CRONIN by telephone on 2/4/71.

The NYO feels that BUZDUGAN does not possess the capabilities to be engaged in intelligence activities. The NYO is conducting no additional investigation and is placing their case concerning BUZDUGAN in a closed status.

George F.A. Boian, 300 East 91st Street, New York City, an individual who has furnished reliable and unreliable information in the past, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on February 24, 1970, that he learned from Gheorghe Buzdugan on February 23, 1970, that Buzdugan was imprisoned from 1945 to 1964, inasmuch as he was the son of Gordis (Phonetic), a Romanian Government leader in 1918. Buzdugan also claimed that he was imprisoned in the Soviet Union for five years.

Buzdugan advised that he had received a \$10,000 check from the late New York Senator, Robert F. Kennedy, a short time before his death, for documents he made available to Kennedy. The day following Kennedy's death, Buzdugan attempted to cash Kennedy's check in Paris, France, but the banks refused to honor the check. He visited with Ambassador Sargent Shriver, American Ambassador to France, and he was told to wait until Kennedy's affairs were put in order in Washington, D.C.

Buzdugan advised that on December 7, 1969, his property, which consisted of the \$10,000 check, a suit, watch, and presents for the Kennedys' children, disappeared at the Port Authority, New York City. He reported the loss to the Port Authority Police.

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In addition, Buzdugan stated that he knows the conspirators in Europe who planned the assassination of Robert F. Kennedy.

Captain Joseph W. Caron, Port of New York Authority Police Department, 111 8th Avenue, New York City, advised on March 2, 1970, that their records contain no theft or loss report at the Port Authority under the name of Buzdugan for Dacember 7, 1969.

Gheorghe Buzdugan, while visiting a Petry Kornea, 363 Palmetto Street, Brooklyn, New York, was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on January 7, 1971, and he furnished the following information:

He stated that he was born May 4, 1923, in Arad, Romania. He gave his residence as Antony 92 Route De Versailles, Paris, France. He had in his possession a B-2 visa. In Paris, he is employed as a guardian of the Federation Des Eglises Evangeliques Baptistee De France (a Protestant Baptist Church in Paris, France).

He advised that he is married to Elisabeta Buzdugan, nee Fatusan, whom he claimed he has not seen since 1955. He was a former secretary of the National Peasant Party (MPP) of Romania in Arad, Romania, and because of his political activities he was imprisoned from 1945 to 1964. Part of his imprisonment, 1955 to 1960, was spent in the Soviet Union. He advised that he departed Romania on August 18, 1964, and he eventually settled in Paris, France.

He advised that he was not acquainted with the late Senator Kennedy, nor does he have any knowledge regarding his death. He admitted that he has had numerous conversations concerning Kennedy, but all of his conversations pertained to the effects of Kennedy's death on American history.

Miron Butariu, a member of the Assembly of Captive European Nations, 29 West 57th Street, New York City, was interviewed on January 19, 1971, by a Special Agent of the FBI, and he advised that he met Buzdugan approximately two years ago. Butariu advised that he, Butariu, is from the Arad region of Romania, and that Buzdugan claims that he was acquainted with him in Arad. Buzdugan related that he was employed as a clerk in 1945 and 1946 in the office of Alexa Botioc, whom Butariu stated was the Mayor of Arad, a leader of the NPP, and a lawyer. Butariu was well-acquainted with Botioc, and he does not recall ever meeting Buzdugan. Buzdugan also claimed to be an adopted son of Vasile Goldis, a well-known member of the NPP in Arad.

Butariu believed that Buzdugan told him that he had spent a total of 12 years in Moscow and Czechoslovak prisons. Butariu has observed Buzdugan wearing Kennedy rings and bracelets, and Buzdugan has told him that he was offered \$10,000 by Robert Kennedy to write a book.

In Butariu's opinion, Buzdugan is mentally disturbed. He keeps telling Butariu how he has made hundreds of thousands of dollars, butwas forced to borrow \$30 from Butariu. Each time they meet Buzdugan tells him a different story about his business ventures. During one of his last meetings with Buzdugan, Buzdugan claimed that he was being followed.

Butariu stated that Buzdugan and Petru Kornea, 368 Palmetto Street, Brooklyn, New York, have formed an approved New York State corporation known as "Banatul", whose primary business is to sell Swiss watches. Buzdugan and Kornea opened a bank account for "Banatul" at the First National City (FNC) Bank of New York located at 56th Street and Broadway, New York City. Butariu accompanied them to the bank and it was upon his recommendation that the manager of the bank permitted the opening of an account. The manager was reluctant inasmuch as only \$50 was deposited into the account.

Butariu advised that apparently Buzdugan departed the United States sometime during January, 1971, inasmuch as he received a letter from Doctor Stefan Weininger, Bettinastrasse 21, 6 Frankfurt Am Main 1, Germany, a lawyer friend of his, who was recently visited by Buzdugan. Buzdugan had told Weininger that he had received \$200,000 of credit from the FNC Bank of New York for the purpose of buying and later selling 200,000 Swiss watches. Weininger told Butariu that he immediately sent a communication to FNC asking for confirmation. The bank, without undue delay, advised Weininger that there was no truth to Buzdugan's claim. Butariu advised that Weininger and the bank manager wanted to know why Butariu recommended such a man. Butariu explained that he felt sorry for Buzdugan and that on one occasion Buzdugan broke down and cried in his office.

Butariu was unable to give any justifiable reason for helping Buzdugan especially when he feels that he is mentally disturbed. Butariu was just sympathetic and felt impelled to help him.

A confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past learned on January 6, 1971, that Gheorghe Buzdugan, a visitor to the United States from France, and Petru Kornea, 368 Palmetto Street, Brooklyn, New York, had inquired of Marin Datcu, who has a business office at 43-45 44th Street, Queens, New York, if he had any office space available for their use. According to source, Buzdugan and Kornea plan to sell Swiss watches in the United States.

Floran Gugu, 62-95 60th Street, Queens, New York, furnished the following information to a Special Agent of the FBI on December 7, 1970, December 29, 1970, and January 18, 1971:

Gugu is a Romanian writer and a former member of the NPP of Romania. He entered the United States in January, 1969, and has requested political asylum.

Gugu advised that in the Spring of 1970, he met a Gheorghe Boldici, whom he knew in Romania, at the home of George F.A. Boian, 300 East 91st Street, New York, New York. At that time, Boldici related some story concerning the Kennedys, but Gugu paid no attention to what Boldici was saying.

Gugu again met Boldici on December 5, 1970, in Brooklyn, New York, in the company of an unidentified male. Gugu did not recognize the name Gheorghe Buzdugan, but he advised that the man he knows as Boldici furnished him his address as Route De Versailles, Antony 92, Paris, France. (When Buzdugan was interviewed by the FBI, he denied ever knowing Gugu in Romania, but recalled meeting him recently in the United States).

Gugu advised that Boldici was an elementary school teacher in the village of Covasani in the city of Minis, which is approximately seven miles from Arad, Romania. Gugu stated that from 1945 to 1948, Boldici assisted people in escaping from Romania.

Gugu first met Boldici when they were both in a security jail in Bucharest, Romania, in 1948. A month later, Boldici was assigned to the same military prison as Gugu, which was located on Uranus Street in Bucharest. Mihai Horezu and Dumitru Apostoliu, NPP members, were also in this prison.

Gugu related that arrangements were made in prison for Boldici to help Apostoliu depart Romania. In August, 1948, both Apostoliu and Gugu were free, and Apostoliu paid approximately \$275 for a lawyer to defend Boldici. Boldici was freed in October, 1948.

Arrangements were made by Boldici to effect Apostoliu's escape, but due to the fact that Apostoliu had very important NPP documents, he was forced to cancel the arrangements made by Boldici. Apostoliu, after he gave documents to another individual, made new plans with Boldici. Apostoliu was suppose to meet

Boldici in Arad and eventually make his way to Vienna, Austria. Boldici never met with Apostoliu, and Apostoliu later learned from Petre Ionescu, a tax collector from Minis, near Arad, that Boldici had left for Vienna. Tonescu was used to relay letters sent between Boldici and Apostoliu while they were effecting the final plans for Apostoliu's escape.

Petru Kornea, 368 Palmetto Street, Brooklyn, New York, advised on January 21, 1971, that Buzdugan departed the United States shortly after his interview by the FBI. On February 4, 1971, Petru Kornea's son advised that they had received word from Buzdugan that his request for a re-entry permit to return to the United States was denied. He wanted the Kornea family to obtain some assistance to have his request for re-entry approved.

The following is a description of Buzdugan, as obtained through interview and observations of Special Agents of the FBI:

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

Call from Pete Noyes.

On November 17, 1970, I received a call from an individual who identified himself as Pete Noyes, who said he was associated with Station KNXT, a CBS-owned television station in Ios Angeles. He stated that he had been referred to me by Bob Brosio, Chief Assistant in Ios Angeles, and that he wanted to talk about the relationship between Al Fatah and Sirhan Sirhan. I advised him that I could not talk to him about any investigation and that he should contact our Public Information Office. He wished to know if I hadm heard of a gentleman by the name of Braden and whether any investigation was currently being conducted on Braden. He stated that Braden was one of the incorporators of the development at Ia Costa and that this had several organized crime-connections. I again advised him that I could not discuss whether we were or were not involved in any pending investigations. He said he understood but that he would like to give me some information which he had also turned over to an "intelligence group" in California, and which he expected would be filtered up to us.

He stated that there was a cell of Al Fatah on the campus at Berkeley. (I believe he mentioned Berkeley, but it's possible he mentioned some other college. He certainly didn't mention Pasadena.) He pointed out that the man who was killed in the attempted highjack of the Israeli jet to Iondon was formerly a student who was recouited off-campus by the Al Fatah cell. He then mentioned several other names that he said were associated with Al Fatah, and said they had connections with the Black Panthers. not able to get all the names, but one of them was Walter Crowe. He stated that he had turned over to the Los Angeles Police Department his information relating to the Black Panthers' connections with Al Fatah on California campuses. Mr. Noyes is apparently Joing some sort of story on Al Fatah, the Black Panthers, Sirhan Sirhan, and -- although he didn't say it -- I would assume the Robert F. Kennedy assassination. He stated that, while we couldn't give him any information, he would be happy to talk to us. I told him it sounded more like an internal security matter rather than organized crime, and informed him that I would pass this information along.

Mr. HANNON was advised by SA LA JEUNESSE that he had no such knowledge and, in fact, was advised that Mr. KAISER had made a previously written request of the Bureau for such information and was subsequently advised by the Bureau that information he was seeking would not be made available to him (see enclosed letters).

Mr. HANNON requested that SA LA JEUNESSE prepare the enclosed affidavit and that also copies of correspondence from KAISER to the Director, and from the Director to KAISER be likewise be made available to him. Copies of these letters are being made available to the Bureau in the event it is deemed desireable to furnish them to Mr. HANNON.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

I am a former Time and Life correspondent, the author of a book on Pope John, and a free lance writer currently engaged in writing a book on the assassination of Robert Kennedy.

I have reason to believe that I am writing the book on the assassination because, to get the facts I needed, I managed to attain a unique position: I became an investigator for the defense.

In that role, it became necessary for me to engage in long interviews with Sirhan, to work in close cooperation with the psychologists and psychiatrists in the case, and, of course, with the lawyers. None of these people, I am happy to say, tried to "concoct" a defense; they probably prejudged the case a little bit, as most of the nation did, with the preliminary notion that Sirhan had to be nutty to kill a Kennedy in cold blood in the middle of a crowded hotel pantry and leave a notebook behind saying he intended to do it. The lawyers and the doctors were interested in getting to that portion of the truth they could use in the defense of Sirhan and then in presenting that truth fairly before judge and jury. I was happy to help them in that because at the same time I was helping myself gather material for my book.

On order to write the best possible book, however, I feel I should get other points of view. I would like the FBI to consider helping me with information and some evaluation.

- l) <u>Information</u>: I'd like to know how the FBI went into action, who got the word first, where you were when the news came, what orders you gave, who carried them out and how. It is a part of the story which I imagine the F.B.I. would not want me to overlook.
- 2) Evaluation: I wonder what your investigators think about certain clues which point toward a conspiracy. I am not entirely convinced that Sirhan wasn't pue up to this by someone else and I have a few good reasons why I think so. Since I have talked to Sirhan and your people haven't, I assume my reasons might bear some examination. Maybe the FBI has checked out certain areas. If so, fine. I'd like to know, if not for publication, at least for background, so I do not make imply that there is a need for "further investigation" into what has already been well investigated.

ROGER J. LA JEUNESSE, JR., being duly sworn, deposes and says I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Los Angeles, California. Following the shooting of the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy on June 5, 1968, in Los Angeles, California, I was assigned liaison responsibility between the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the prosecutive agencies responsible for the prosecution of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, who was charged with the murder of Senator Kennedy.

That, in connection with those liaison responsibilities, Reports and Letterhead Memoranda were prepared and were disseminated to the United States Attorney at Los Angeles, and the District Attorney's Office for the County of Los Angeles, State of California, the latter being the prosecuting authority for this case.

That, during the investigation of the murder of Senator Kennedy, I had contact with personnel of the prosecuting agencies from June 5, 1968, through the termination of the guilt phase of the trial in April 1969. Between March 3, 1969 and April 4, 1969, I had no contact with any members of the prosecution or Defense Team owing to having been off duty following surgery during the above period of time. In addition, various members of the Defense Team representing Sirhan were continually present in court during the trial, one of whom was Robert Blair Kaiser, who had been included as an "investigator" member of the Defense Team.

In his capacity as an "investigator" for the Defense Team, it would appear that Kaiser might have had access to

any records and or files made available to the Defense by Court order.

On May 1, 1969, following completion of the guilt phase of the trial, Mr. Kaiser telephonically advised me that he was in the process of putting together a book concerning the assassination of Senator Kennedy. In connection therewith, he stated he had previously directed a letter to J. Edgar Hoover, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D. C., requesting to know specifically "how the FBI went into action" in connection with the assassination. He stated that he had advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation that as a member of the Defense Team, he had already had access to part of the investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Mr. Kaiser further explained that he had received a letter from Mr. Hoover advising him that the information contained in the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation is confidential.

Furthermore, on May 1, 1969, I had no personal know-ledge of any alleged correspondence between Kaiser and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I had a subsequent telephone conversation with Mr. Kaiser at which time I made reference to a letter addressed to him from Mr. Hoover, dated April 29, 1969, in which Mr. Kaiser was advised of the confidential nature of Federal Bureau Investigation files and telling him it would not be possible to furnish information to him regarding Sirhan Bishara Sirhan.

That, at no time was any dissemination made by me to Robert Blair Kaiser of any written matter, nor was there any oral dissemination made to Mr. Kaiser.
