

ROY DONALD MERRAY, Route 1, Box 3, Earlimart, California, was shown a statement of his rights which he read but declined to sign. He them furnished the following information:

He recalled making a statement about six weeks ago to the effect he had pledged two thousand dollars towards a total of 500 to 750 thousand dellars which was to be utilized to pay off a "contract" to kill Memotor ModeRT KEMMEDY in the event it appeared he could receive the Democratic momination for the Presidency of the United States, He stated he had no factual basis for this statement or for saying that La Cose Mostra was behind this "contract",

He added he was actually serry he had uttered this. He described Senator KENNEDY as a brilliant young men, and added although he disagreed with Senator KENNEDY's policy in the Delano, California, area growers versus the Mexicam farming laborers dispute and Senator KENNEDY's repeated endersement of CESAR CHAVEZ, the head of the Mexicam Farm Workers Association, he certainly had no desire to see Senator KENNEDY harmed.

California State Senator ALTHONY C. BEILENSON, 4551 Parkridge Road, advised that he arrived at the Hotel Ambassador, los Angeles, California, on June 5, 1968, shortly before the end of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY's speech after being the apparent winner of the California Democratic Presidential Primary.

Senator BEILENSON advised that he and his wife remained only a short period of time in the ballroom where Senator LENNEDY was speaking inasmuch as they found it too crowded, hot and uncomfortable. They returned to the kitchen passageway, positioned themselves in such a position as to be able to see Senator KENNEDY and his party as they came out of the hall. Senator BEILENSON stated that after seeing Senator KENNEDY walk by he turned his head in the opposite direction to see if he could see some of his friends. He heard popping noises but assumed that these were balloons popping. He never saw Senator KENNEDY or the assailant and was unable to furnish any information concerning anyone else he might have noted in that area.

Mrs. DOLORES BEILENSON, 4551 Parkridge Road, advised that on June 5, 1968, she and her husband, State Senator ANTHONY C. BEILENSON, arrived at the Hotel Ambassador, Los Angeles, California, where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was making a speech after being the apparent winner in the California Democratic Presidential Primary. They arrived shortly before the termination of Senator RENNEDY's speech and went to the ballroom where he was speaking. It was too crowded, however, and they left after remaining there only a short period of time and returned to the kitchen passageway. They positioned themselves in the passageway so as to be able to see the Senator and be able to greet friends as they came out.

Mrs. BEILENSON stated that after Senator KENNEDY passed her she turned her head back to see if she would be able to see Mrs. ETHEL KENNEDY. She did not see Mrs. KENNEDY and turned her head back in a direction where Senator KENNEDY would have reached at that time. At the same instant she turned her head, she did not observe Senator KENNEDY but instantaneously observed three flashes emanating from a gun which appeared to be held at waist level by a man she described as being of short stature, slim, 25 to 30 years of age, dark coloring, appearing to be of Wexican American extraction. At this point she also heard three popping noises. She does not recall the arm being extended. She stated that she was approximately 20 feet away from the man holding the gun and that she could see the man from his mid-thigh up. She could not recall what obscured her vision of the rest of the man. She added that there was no one in the immediate vicinity of the man. She could not see Senator KELMEDY at this point. Upon hearing additional shots, she immediately left the area.

Due to the fact that her observation of the gunman was momentarily, she does not believe she could positively identify him. She does not recall seeing anyone else in particular outside the uniformed kitchen help, KENNEDY's staff and friends.

Mrs. PENNA ESHOO, 405 North Palm, Turlock, California, interviewed at the residence of, and in the presence of Mrs. SAVANNAH STONER, 330 North Palm, Turlock, furnished the following information:

On the date that the KENNEDY Election Special Train arrived at the Southern Pacific Railroad Station in Turlock, California, recalled by Mrs. ESHOO as a Sunday, date unknown, she went to the station with ELISHA (phonetic) MOOSHEY and his wife, MARTHA MOOSHEY, 315 Hollywood Way, Burbank, California. It is noted that the train actually was in Turlock on Memorial Day, May 30, 1968. They arrived at the station prior to the publicized time of arrival, at about 2:30 PM. Mr. MOOSHEY obtained a seat in a patio area away from the station platform and Mrs. ESHOO and Mrs. MOOSHEY went to the concrete platform area, between the station and the railroad tracks. There were one or two small children playing on the tracks, and no adults in the platform area. Shortly thereafter two men, who appeared to be together, appeared on the platform. Mrs. ESHOO described them as follows:

1) Male adult, nationality unknown, one or two inches shorter than Mrs. ESHOO who is 5'3", weight 120 to 125 pounds, with small build, age 20-21, hair "pitch" black and wavy, very heavy and shiny with oil with loose locks of hair hanging over part of forehead; eyebrows and eyelashes prominent and very black; noticeable pimples on face which appeared discolored, or with multiple colored patches which gave a scarred appearance, as from acne or bad facial condition. Eyes dark or black with noticeable puffiness or circles under them; nose broad and flat, face round. This person was wearing "all dark clothing", exact color unknown. He wore canvas "gym shoes", color unknown; a heavy dark jacket with buttons, apparently of wool, similar to the type worn in the Navy. She does not know if there were one or two rows of buttons

on the jacket. One front side of the jacket was lapped over the other. His hands were in his trouser pockets which raised the front of the coat slightly, but the coat came to about midthigh. She cannot describe the trousers except that they were dark. He wore no glasses or hat. Mrs. ESHOO saw no jewelry of any kind.

2) White male adult at least 6'1" in height (one foot taller than No. 1), age 20-21, weight 140-145 pounds, slender build, hair "the color of a brown paper bag", complexion light or fair, wearing a white long sleeved shirt, open at the neck, suntan pants, shoes unknown, no glasses or hat, and no jewelry seen. This man also kept his hands in his pockets.

Mrs. MOOSHEY said to Mrs. ESHOO that the man wearing the coat "looks awfully suspicious" and Mrs. ESHOO replied that he certainly did since he was wearing such a heavy coat in the very hot weather. Thereafter, Mrs. MOOSHEY departed to sit with her husband. Mrs. ESHOO stayed on the platform within five or six feet of the two men. Thereafter a girl appeared on the platform. Mrs. ESHOO described her as follows:

White female adult, young, age unknown, 5'6", 170 pounds, heavy build, bushy curly hair, unkempt, cut short at nape of neck, big head and face, light complexion, wearing white blouse with long sleeves, a straight blue skirt and gym shoes, color unknown. She was carrying a brown leather handbag with an overlapping cover, which was fringed or cut along the edges and which she described as the "cowboy type". She had some large round KENNEDY buttons about three or four inches in diameter which she was selling for 50¢ each. She thinks the girl had four of these in her handbag.

Mrs. ESHOO overheard this girl talking to the tall blond man in a language she did not recognize. Mrs. ESHOO understands, but does not speak Portuguese and Arabic and speaks SC 62-76 (3)

Turkish, Russian, and Assyrian, her native tongue; it was none of these languages. The girl had come from inside the train station and was overheard to comment to others in the crowd that had gathered, that the train would be late. Later, at about 3:30 PM, Mrs. ESHOO, who became "suspicious" of the girl, because she was talking to the two men, followed her in and out of the train station. The girl asked an older man behind the counter in the station when the train would arrive and he advised her it would be another hour and forty minutes. Mrs. ESHOO followed the girl outside and the girl again spoke to the tall blond man, advising him in English of this fact. The short dark man then skuffed his right foot back and forth on the ground and said in English "Lets go" and the two men walked away to the north. She did not see them again although she later looked for them in the crowd that had gathered. observed the girl talking to a small, dark girl thereafter. She cannot further describe this girl, but believes they were also talking in the language she did not recognize. The two men were at the station from about 2:45 PM to 3:30 PM.

Previously, at about 3:20 PM, she had heard the taller blond man say "Here it comes" when a freight train went through the station.

After the KENNEDY train arrived at about 4:50 PM or thereafter, Mrs. ESHOO and the MOOSHEYs returned to Mrs. ESHOO's home.

Mrs. MOOSHEY again stated that the short dark man looked awfully suspicious and Mr. MOOSHEY stated "OK honey, you are FBI".

When Mrs. ESHOO observed the television pictures of the shooting, she saw a full face picture of the arrested suspect. She immediately yelled to her children that this man had been at the Turlock railroad station.

Photographs of FLORENCIO L. MATIONG, California A 37614; HAROLD OTTO MONTOYA, California A 52037, and ALFRED ARTHUR MONTOYA, California A 51909, were individually exhibited to her. She emphatically stated that none of these individuals were the person she saw. Xerox copy of California driver's license M238847, issued to SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN in 1964 was exhibited to her with only the face of the driver shown. She immediately positively identified this person as the shorter of the two men she saw. She stated emphatically that there can be no question; that this is the photograph of the person observed by her. She stated she is confident he would recognize her also since they frequently were face to face, within five or six feet of each other during the period of time she was at the station.

Mrs. ESHOO, who speaks rapid but broken English, advised she entered the United States as an immigrant from Persia, now Iran, in the early 1930's and is a naturalized citizen.

Referenced teletype advised that JaMES MC EVOY, III, Ph.D., Department of Sociology, University of California at Davis, California, had stated that a person resembling the photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN had been ordered away from the hallway near stage where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was to speak.

Professor MC EVOY stated this occurred in the hall-way of Freeborn Hall, University of California at Davis, California, on 5/16/68, where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY spoke. Professor MC EVOY stated that the individual had been ordered out of the hallway by University policeman JOSEPH GALLARDO and the incident had been observed by Professor KENNETH HAUF.

On 6/6/68, inquiry at the University of California Police Department revealed that the officer who had ordered the individual out of the hallway was Patrolman JOHN ADAMS REINWAND of the University Police Department. REINWAND stated that the individual whom he ordered out of the hallway definitely was not SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN although there were some similar features. He stated that he had seen photographs of SIRHAN and was certain of this.

Professor KENNETH HANF, Political Science Department, University of California at Davis, California, stated he was the person who had observed the above incident. He stated his recollection was that although this individual appeared to be of Middle East extraction and had features similar to that of SIRHAND, he did not believe that they were identical. He stated that his wife, who was in the hallway at the time, might recall the individual.

On 6/6/68, Mrs. HEIDI BUSSE HANE, 1925 East Eighth Street, Davis, California, advised that she recalled the individual who had been requested to leave the hallway behind the stage where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was to speak. She stated that while there was a definite resemblance between this individual and SIRHAN, she did not believe they were identical. She stated that a friend, Mrs. KIRSTE STEINMO, a teaching assistant at the University, was also there at the time and might recall the incident.

On 6/8/68, Mrs. KIRSTE STEINMO, 5344 McMillan Drive, Fair Oaks, California, advised that she did recall the individual who had been requested to leave from behind the stage at Freeborn Hall, University of California at Davis, California, when Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY spoke. She stated that the individual who was what she considers to be the Mediterranean type which includes Arabs, had features which she believes were similar to that of SIRHAN; however, she has seen photographs of SIRHAN and this individual definitely is not identical with SIRHAN. She added that she was able to see this individual from about seven feet away and for several minutes.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted by the Sacramento Division in the above incident.

BORCHER that he had received a phone call from an unknown person who would identify himself only as "a brother Moose" and the person stated that he had been approched by a person who intended to go to Los Angeles, California with others and "get that Jew" who shot ROBERT KENNEDY. GILLICK advised he had been unable to obtain additional information from the man regarding their mission or others involved.

GILLICK advised he discounted the information but had telephonically advised the Intelligence Unit of the Los Angeles County SO of the matter.

On 6/10/68 GEORGE MEDINA, Owner and Operator, Geno's Cafe, 146 Broadway advised his was the only restrurant in that immediated area which was one block week of Main St on Second St.

He advised he had heard no "loose" talk about anyone soliciting persons to shoot ROBERT KENNEDY or anyone else. He advised he was unable to identify a woman who would be known at that cafe noting a large number of business and professional women working at the college and law offices in the area utilize his cafe.

On 6/10/68 FLORENCE COLLIER, Waitress and Assistant Manager, Geno (s Cafe advised she has heard no one discuss in any way soliciting to have anyone shoot ROBERT KENNEDY. She was unable to identify a woman known in that cafe who discussed having her brother approched to shoot KENNEDY.

On 6/5/68, at 12:15 a.m., SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, a Jordanian, born 3/19/44, Jerusalem, black hair, brown eyes, 5/2" tall, 115 pounds, shot Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY at the Hotel Ambassador, Los Angeles, California, following KENNEDY's victory speech in the main ballroom of the hotel. Senator KENNEDY died as a result of these wounds.

Also being sought in connection with this shooting is an Unsub female who was observed running away from the scene. A witness reported the female to have shouted "We shot KENNEDY." Unsub is described as Caucasian, 23-27 years old, 5'6" tall, wearing a white voile dress, 3/4" sleeves, with small black polka dots, dark shoes, bouffant hairdo.

All Agents are requested to contact their informants, PCIs and PSIs relative to above matter and to route any positive information to SA NORMAN P. LeCLAIR.

Mrs. EMMA BANKS, 405 North Palm, Turlock, California, was interviewed in front of her residence. Mrs. BANKS, who is the daughter of Mrs. PENNA ESHOO of the same address, had been told to leave the house by Mrs. ESHOO upon the arrival of SA DONALD H. MOE. Mrs. BANKS stopped SA MOE on the street by stating, "don't believe anything she says."

Mrs. BANKS advised that her mother is in her late 60's, and has no knowledge of her actual age. She stated that her mother is totally uneducated and absorbs her time with television. In the words of Mrs. BANKS, Mrs. ESHOO was a "fanatic" in her devotion to Senator ROBERT KENNEDY, was thrilled to see him, and was very bothered by his death. Mrs. BANKS stated that her mother is "old for her age," and, in the opinion of Mrs. BANKS, may be slightly mentally unbalanced. Mrs. BANKS states that she exaggerates considerably and apparently believed what she says.

Mrs. BANKS advised that she is absolutely positive that Mrs. ESHOO did not see SIRHAN SIRHAN at the Turlock Railroad Station on the date that Senator KENNEDY was in Turlock. She stated that Mrs. ESHOO did talk with Mrs. MARTHA MOOSHEY after returning from the railroad station about a "suspicious" person, but that from the conversation it was obvious that their suspicions were very vague. She advised that she heard Mrs. MOOSHEY state that the suspicious person said, "I can get a good shot from here," but that the conversation was to obviously exaggerated that she ceased listening to it. She discounted the story then, and discounts it now.

Mrs. BANKS advised that no credence whatsoever can be placed in anything that her mother says when describing any occurrence.

Mrs. SAVANNAH STONER, 330 North Palm, Turlock, California, furnished information as follows:

She initially call the FBI relative to information furnished by Mrs. PENNA ESHOO since Mrs. ESHOO indicated to her that her children had told her not to tell anyone about it and Mrs. ESHOO had indicated that she was so concerned that she had gone to the Turlock Police Department and no one there would listen to her. She stated that Mrs. ESHOO, who is totally uneducated, cannot read nor write and speaks very broken English, is excitable and prone to exaggerate. She stated that she tried to convince Mrs. ESHOO to tell no one other than law enforcement authorities to prevent the spread of rumor and gossip. She advised that she herself is unable to determine if Mrs. ESHOO is telling the truth and felt that the FBI should be notified in the event that there was a possibility that the matter was not exaggerated. She advised that Mrs, ESHOO had indicated to her that her daughter would "beat her" if she found out that Mrs. ESHOO had furnished information to the FBI.

Mrs. STONER stated that after the initial interview, and at no time did Mrs. ESHOO mention to her any contact by the "suspicious" person, that Mrs. ESHOO has indicated was SIRHAN SIRHAN, with any musician or orchestra leader. She stated that contrary to what Mrs. ESHOO has said, she advised Mrs. ESHOO to furnish every bit of information in her possession to the FBI.

Mrs. PENNA ESHOO, 405 North Palm, Turlock, California, was interviewed at her residence, furnishing information as follows:

Mrs. ESHOO advised that information given in prior interview was factual; however, Mrs. MARTHA MOOSHEY did not indicate that the person she saw at the train station in Turlock, California, "looked suspicious" until after the MOOSHEY's returned to the home of Mrs. ESHOO with Mrs. ESHOO. Mrs. MOOSHEY told Mrs. ESHOO in reference to the person that "looked suspicious" that she would "recognize him anywhere."

Mrs. ESHOO advises that this definitely was the person that she identified as SIRHAN SIRHAN from photograph, since both she and Mrs. MOOSHEY felt that he looked suspicious because of the heavy coat that he was wearing, and for no other reason. Mrs. ESHOO advised that she is absolutely certain that the person she saw was SIRHAN SIRHAN and no other person. Mrs. ESHOO advised that in addition, to the "tall boy" that she previously described as being with the person she believes was SIRHAN SIRHAN, she saw the person she believes was SIRHAN SIRHAN also speak to the leader of a small musical group that was at the station, saying to him also "let's go," just prior to departing the train station. She advised that this person was playing a "bugle" and that there was also a guitar player and a drummer. She stated that these persons had been heard by her to say that they were having trouble with the electricity and would not be able to play. She said that they also departed prior to the time the train arrived and did not play at the station. She said that she "suspicioned" these persons also and does not believe that anything was wrong with their electricity. She stated that she did not previously furnish this information since she was "nervous" from the questions and that thereafter, she told Mrs. SAVANNAH STONER about this and was told by her not to tell this to the FBI.
