Remarks:

On 12/17/62, Detective DONOHUE telephonically advised that he and Detective SAM WALLACE, Precinct #9, had picked up ROBERT STANLEY FANTROY, Negro male, 26 or 27, who first identified himself as BOBBY LAYNE, when they observed him walking in the street carrying a typewriter. Upon bringing him to Precinct #9 to question him concerning the typewriter they ascertained that he had a \$300 check in his possession which was made out to R.F. KENNEDY by the New York "Times" on the Chemical Bank of New York. The check bore the following endorsement: "Pay to the order of Arthur Capper Recreation Center. ROBERT F. KENNEDY." FANTROY subsequently advised that the Attorney General gave the above-mentioned check to him on the previous Saturday evening, 12/15/62, when the Attorney General was at the Arthur Capper Recreation Center awarding trophies to the D.C. football teams. FANTROY advised that he was a volunteer helper and assisted in coaching the winning football team and it was in this capacity that he received the check. Det. DONOHUE advised that the Arthur Capper Recreation Center was known to Detectives at Precinct #9 and is located at 5th and "K" Streets, S.E. Inquiry had been made at this center and a woman at the center advised that FANTROY was a volunteer helper, the Attorney General had been at the Arthur Capper Recreation Center.

Saturday awarding trophies and had given FANTROY a check to buy uniforms for the winning team. Detective DONOHUE advised that the PD was unable to locate a stolen report on the above-mentioned typewriter.

The above was telephonically advised to Bureau Supervisor THOMAS MC ANDREWS. MC ANDREWS telephonically advised the writer subsequently that Attorney General KENNEDY had been in Washington, D.C., until the early evening of Saturday, 12/15/62, at which time he left for South America.

The fact of the Attorney General's departure to South America early Saturday evening was furnished Detective DONOHUE who advised that they had released FANTROY.

Facts of complaint
Complainant, who does not want his name used or to get involved, stated he was phoning from a booth in a bar, the Headquarters, on Mt. Pleasant St. at the place where the bus makes a loop for return trip. (Phone book lists Headquarters, Inc., 1660 Lamont St., N. W.) Complainant sounded sober; said he had had 3 beers.

Complainant said unsub, who was still in the bar, on a stool, was intoxicated and was talking about various matters. When the subject of "justice" came up, unsub reportedly said, concerning Attorney General ROBERT KENNEDY, that ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ "The only justice he deserves is what his brother got." Segregation and other matters were discussed, and unsub also reportedly said that if any kind of crisis ever happens, he (speaking of Chief Justice EARL WARREN) would be the first man he (unsub) would go down and shoot. Complainant said unsub spoke of what a good man he considered Gov. WALLACE, of Alabama, to be, and referred to former President EISENHOWER as a (S.O.B.). Unsub also reportedly said that President LYNDON JOHNSON is no good; however, he was not heard to elaborate on this point.

During interview of complainant, at 12:45 p.m., he said the unsub was leaving the bar; unsub walked out and disappeared; complainant could not see which direction he went.

Complainant did not know this man's name, where he worked, or anything by way of identification except that he said he was from West Virginia. The man spoke with the bartender, who appeared to be the owner of the place, and the owner remarked that the unsub "would talk your arm off." However, complainant does not know if the bartender knows identity of unsub.

Complainant does not frequent this bar; this is 2nd time he has been there. He was requested to call WFO if he ever encounters this unknown subject again. Complainant works for E. J. Korvette Co. at Bailey's Crossroads.

Action Recommended

Interview bartender-owner; make appropriate prompt dissemination. Tollef Jacobson, Jr.

**UNKNOWN SUBJECT; Threats Against

TERRENCE JOHN HAYES - COMPLAINANT**

On May 14, 1964, Terrence Hayes, 3448 Brown Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., telephonically contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and advised as follows:

On that date he had been drinking a couple of beers at the Headquarters Bar, Mount Pleasant Section, Washington, D. C. He stated that an unknown white male on a bar stool near him and he became involved in a conversation. During the conversation the unknown white male stated in relation to Attorney General Robert Kennedy that "the only justice he deserves is what his brother got." In conversation concerning segregation, unknown white male stated that in the event a crisis ever happened, Chief Justice Earl Warren would be the first person he would go down and shoot. Unknown white male made derogatory remark concerning former President Eisenhower. He made statement that President Lyndon Johnson was no good but did not elaborate on this point. Hayes advised that he does not know this individual and has never seen him before.

Hayes described unknown white male as six feet, about 180 pounds, approximately 60 years of age, gray hair, balding on top, rugged outdoor face, wearing a black sweater with short sleeves and dark pants.

On May 14, 1964, William Stark, Bartender, Headquarters Bar, 1660 Lamont Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., advised Special Agents of the FBI that he had observed a person similar to the unknown white male described above in the bar this morning. He advised that this white male was drinking with a younger person approximately 45 years of age. He stated that he never heard the unknown white male say anything of a derogatory nature and that all he heard the white male say was that he, the bartender, was making a mistake if he voted for President Johnson.

TERRENCE JOHN HAYES - COMPLAINANT**

On May 14, 1964, Maggie Smith, 1708 Lamont Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., who advised that she was in the Headquarters Bar on that date and Margo Burke, a part owner, Headquarters Bar, advised Special Agents of the FBI that they observed the same individuals as had been described by Mr. Stark. They stated they heard nothing unusual said by the unknown white male. Mrs. Burke added that the unknown white male appeared to her to have been drinking quite heavily.

On March 11, 1962, Terrence John Hayes telephonically contacted the Washington Field Office (WFO) of the FBI. He was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on March 13, 1962, at which time he furnished no specific information and indicated he was unable to recall calling the WFO of the FBI on March 11, 1962. Hayes stated he had been extremely intoxicated on March 11, 1962, as well as previous days and was unable to recall what he had done during that period of time.

On December 13, 1963, Hayes again called the WFO of the FBI. He admitted he had been drinking and a female voice in the background advised Hayes to go to bed and not cause her mother any further trouble. Attempts were made by a Special Agent of the FBI to contact Hayes. Mrs. Hayes contacted the WFO of the FBI, and advised her husband was unemployed, consumed a considerable amount of alcohol and from time to time was somewhat incoherent. She said he was having some trouble with Immigration and Naturalization Service - would not elaborate.

Interview with Hayes on March 13, 1962, reflected he was born August 21, 1920 in Canada. Hayes is 5' 10" tall, weighs 160 pounds, has brown receding hair, brown eyes and wears glasses.

Attached hereto are the original and four copies of a LHM for the Bureau's consideration for dissemination to appropriate agencies.

At 12:37 p.m. on 5/14/64, TERRANCE HAYES, 3448 Brown Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., telephonically contacted the Washington Field Office and furnished info contained in enclosed LHM.

On same date WILLIAM STARK, Bartender, Headquarters Bar, 1660 Lamont Street, N. W., Washington, D.C., MARGO BURKE, part-owner of Headquarters Bar, and MAGGIE SMITH, 1708 Lamont Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., advised that they did observe two individuals at the bar who, according to descriptions are the descriptions of unsub and complainant. All advised they saw nothing out of the ordinary in the conversation of the unsub. STARK advised that although he had never seen the unsub before, he felt the unsub may have come from the Soldiers Home.

Inquiry at Soldiers Home reflected that they have 2,900 people there who can leave the grounds at any time without signing a book or checking out.

Info from WFO files concerning HAYES is listed
below:

TERRENCE JOHN HAYES, 1341 Otis Place, N. W.,
Washington, D. C., on 7/7/55, contacted WFO
concerning obscene matters. Investigation reflected all
people involved were employees of the Embassy of India
and thus no investigation was conducted (Bufile 145-324).

On 12/13/63, TERRENCE JOHN HAYES, 3448 Brown
Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., was rather uncooperative
and furnished, in general, the same info as was furnished
on 7/7/55. During this telephone call, HAYES admitted he
has been drinking and was twice interrupted by a female
who advised him to go to bed and stop causing her mother
more trouble. Attempts were made by SA MICHAEL J. McARDLE
to contact HAYES with negative results. Mrs. HAYES contacted
WFO and advised she has had difficulty with her husband inas-
much as he was unemployed and they have a number of children
which necessitates Mrs. HAYES' employment. She stated her
husband consumes a considerable amount of alcohol and is
from time to time somewhat incoherent. She advised her
husband was having some trouble with INS but refused to
describe the nature of the problem.

On 8/26/53, TERRENCE JOHN HAYES telephoned WFO and advised he was on leave from his job and was quitting since he felt the Indian Embassy was engaged in Communist activity. He requested to be contacted by an agent away from his residence. He was contacted by SAs RICHARD E. POTOCKI and EDWARD T. FAZZI on 8/28/53, and furnished no specific info. He only stated he had heard PRITHI SINGH, Second Secretary at the Indian Embassy, make remarks which were critical of the United States. HAYES did not elaborate concerning the remarks.

HAYES called WFO on 3/11/62, and advised he was having trouble with INS and that his wife and six children were United States citizens. He rambled in his conversation and gave the impression he had been drinking. HAYES was interviewed by SAs CALVIN R. FORD and JOSEPH E. DOWLING of WFO on 3/13/62, HAYES indicated he could not recall calling WFO on 3/11/62, and stated on 3/11/62, as well as previous days he was extremely intoxicated and could not recall what he had done. He sincerely apologized and said he had no intention of calling the FBI.

HAYES was born in Canada on 8/21/20. HAYES is 5' 10" tall, weighs 160 lbs., brown hair, receding, brown eyes and wears glasses.

Bufile 134-2368, in WFO letter of 10/29/54, Page 129, captioned "Potential Security Informants, Embassy of India, Washington, D. C., Indian Delegation to the United Nations, New York City, contains background info concerning HAYES.
