CHRISTOPHER S. RUBEL, 250 North Live Oak Avenue, Glendora, California, telephone (818) 335-6085; business: 219 North Indian Hill Boulevard, Suite 205, Claremont, California, telephone (714) 624-4727, after being advised of the identity of the interviewing agent and the nature of the interview advised and provided the following:

He met CLOYDA MANGRUM through MARIANNA and JOE WILLIS who were his former neighbors. MARIANNA WILLIS is a sister of MANGRUM. He recently assisted the WILLISES in securing MANGRUM's property from MANGRUM's property, because MANGRUM was being committed to a convalescent home. While removing MANGRUM's belongings, the WILLISES discovered enumerated documents which ostensibly is the property of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Most of these documents are stamped confidential and are dated around 1966 - 1967.

The WILLISES are an elderly couple and were greatly concerned that MANGRUM may have violated federal law by possessing the aforementioned documents, although MANGRUM is a former FBI employee, MANGRUM was a secretary to Legat Paris prior to her retirement. RUBEL volunteered to contact the FBI regarding the documents and deliver the documents to the FBI. The WILLISES agreed; they were surprised to have discovered the documents. (X)

Although RUBEL is a licensed marriage, family, and child therapist, he has never maintained a professional relationship with MANGRUM. In his estimation, MANGRUM is noncomposmentis. MANGRUM was placed in a nursing home in San Dimas, California. MARIANNA and JOE WILLIS reside at 863 East Ledora, Glendora, California, telephone (818) 335-6220.

While reviewing the items that MANGRUM accumulated, the WILLIS' noticed a number of documents that belonged to the FBI and other documents stamped "Confidential." The WILLIS' then contacted their friend, RUBEL, who in turn provided the documents to FBI agents of the West Covina RA.

During the week of 10/1/90, SA Harry BROWN, FBI, Los Angeles, CA, office security officer, reviewed the documents. SA BROWN advised that the documents were sensitive at the time of origination. The documents that were reviewed, currently, presents no immediate threat to national security. The documents may have some historical value, but that is beyond SA BROWN's scope of expertise.

On instant date, Marianna WILLIS was contacted and advised as follows:

MANGRUM is described as being a "pack rat." WILLIS and her husband were going through her personal belongings when they discovered the items belonging to the FBI and contacted their friend, RUBEL who turned to items over to the West Covina RA FBI agents.

WILLIS stated that they had no idea that MANGRUM maintained any documents relating to her work. MANGRUM was very secretive about her work at the FBI and would not discuss anything that she was involved in.

WILLIS stated that MANGRUM is in a retirement home because she has been diagnosed as being senile and noncompos-mentis. MANGRUM recently has been ill and suffers from vertigo. Therefore, MANGRUM needs to be in a place where she can be looked after.

WILLIS concluded the interview by stating that due to MANGRUM's diagnosis, at times, MANGRUM does not know where she is, nor what is real.

For information of Bureau, the following is a list of items recovered from MANGRUM. WILLIS advised that if they come across any other documents pertaining to the FBI or U.S. Government, they will contact the FBI and return the items to the government.

A review of the Lead/case assignment cards as well as interviews from current support employees who knew MANGRUM, determined that MANGRUM was the squad secretary for the "Security" squad. The squad handled 100 matters, mainly domestic security investigations, primarily, groups relating to, the civil unrest situation occurring in the late 1960's, Students for a Democratic Society, the Black Panther organization, etc.

MANGRUM's; DOB is 10/24/13; SSAN is [REDACTED]; EOD is 6/23/41 and FBI retirement date 5/31/72.

In light of the fact that MANGRUM is senile and may have no conception of reality, Los Angeles believes that an interview of MANGRUM is futile. Also, the documents recovered, currently have no potential threat to harm the national security. Los Angeles is placing this case in closed status with no further investigation conducted.

Irving Satz, 8179 Glengarry Green, Buena Park, California, telephone (714) 521-8057, a driver for Sterling Liquor Distributors, 5900 Rodeo Road, Los Angeles, advised at 8:20 PM this date that subject, a proprietor of a liquor store on the east side of Pacific ~~Express~~ Coast Highway between Brookhurst and Superior, Newport Beach, California, made the statement to him today with reference to Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY: "I would love to see him assassinated if he gets the nomination." SATZ said, "No, don't say that," and HALL replied, "Yes. I would. I would."

SATZ, who was delivering liquor, was in the store four or five minutes. HALL had been discussing politics with a customer and then made the above remark to SATZ. SATZ suggested to HALL that if he did not like KENNEDY he did not have to vote for him, and then left. SATZ thinks the name of the liquor store may be "The Mariners." He says he thinks HALL "is a lot of talk" and would not actually do anything but found the remark sufficiently alarming to report it so "you can be alerted that there are such people in this country."

Enclosed herewith to the Laboratory are specimen typewritten samples taken from the below described typewriter.

The FBI Laboratory is requested to make a study of the possible similarities in type appearing in a two page typewritten letter signed in the name of SHARIF B. SIRHAN (a sample copy of this letter is enclosed) with the known typewritten specimens taken from the SIRHAN typewriter. In this connection, it would be advisable to use the Bureau copy of the questioned letter.

On 11/14/68, typewritten specimens were taken from a Royal Standard typewriter, Serial number KH 1737868 which originally was the property of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN and is now in the custody and control of his brother MUNIR SIRHAN. MUNIR SIRHAN made the typewriter available to SA JOSEPH D. POWELL, and SA PHILIP J. REILLY at his home, 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California.

MUNIR SIRHAN stated that the typewriter was used mostly by his brother SIRHAN B. SIRHAN. He doesn't recall ever seeing SHARIF or SAIDALLAH use it and stated that neither of them have been inside the family house in over three months.

Rough Draft Insert 56-156 by Sirhan B. Sirhan

On 12-20-68 Asst. Chief of Police BEN BIGGERS, Corona, California, advised that during the previous week there had been two Los Angeles Police Detectives at that department for about five days. This was Sgt. CHARLES COLLINS and Det. FRANK PATCHETT, phone ext. 2962 LAPD. COLLINS and PATCHETT were conducting investigation regarding SIRHAN SIRHAN using the Corona Police Dept. shooting range three days before he had shot Sen. KENNEDY. BIGGERS advised that the name of SIRHAN appeared on the register of shooters for the day indicated by ~~the~~ COLLINS and PATCHETT. BIGGERS was not sure of the date but knew it was either June 1 or 2, 1968. He advised that there had been about 15 civilian users of the range on that day and COLLINS and PATCHETT were attempting to identify and interview all of these people to see if any remembered SIRHAN or had accompanied him to the range on that date. BIGGERS believes that they were able to locate everyone with the exception of an R. STEWART who had not yet been identified. He advised that the Range Master keeps a register of all outside shooters but this contains only a name and not an address or any other identifying matter.

BIGGERS said that BILL MARKS, the Range Master recalled SIRHAN coming to the range. He believes that ~~the~~ was only there that one day. He did not associate him with the shooting of SEN. KENNEDY until it was pointed out to him that a person of the same name was listed on the register. BIGGERS said that MARKS still associated the name SIRHAN on the register with a man of 6' and 200 lbs. but also said that he recalled SIRHAN and gave an accurate description of him. MARKS just did not believe that SIRHAN had signed the register. MARKS also told BIGGERS that he recalled SIRHAN asking if it was alright for an alien to use the range.

Corona, Calif.

COP JOE GREER advised that he had issued specific orders to everyone on his department to make no mention that SIRHAN's name appeared on the shooting register at their range three days before Sen. KENNEDY was shot. GREER said that LAPD had told him that their LAB had positively identified the handwriting of SIRHAN on the register. GREER said that he had issued the order to his department because of the appearance a short time ago of information regarding a check being cashed by SIRHAN in the local paper. He said that the check was not cashed by SIRHAN but had been stolen from the place where SIRHAN worked and cashed by another party but that the reporter had overheard a States Attorney Investigator commenting on this check. GREER said that either he or BIGGERS would call if any more data such as the check or the shooting register developed in Corona. GREER said that the shooting register had been loaned to the LAPD with understanding that it would be returned when no longer needed.
