Mrs. Oscar Lindamood, Route 1, Chillicothe, Ohio, appeared at the Resident Agency of the FBI, Chillicothe, at 4:55 p.m., July 1, 1964, and advised as follows:

Her daughter, [REDACTED], age 16, left New York June 24, 1964, en route Europe for a tour under the sponsorship of the Junior Classical League.

On June 30, 1964, Mrs. Lindamood received a letter from her daughter [REDACTED] wherein she commented on having seen Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy at the Pan American Airlines Terminal, John F. Kennedy Field, New York, New York, on June 24, 1964. [REDACTED] in her letter commented on having photographed Mr. Kennedy from a balcony in the Air Terminal and upon turning around "bumped right into this big guy with a rifle."....."He turned and ran out the back gate." [REDACTED], who was surprised, recovered too late to do anything. She stated "I couldn't even describe the man except he wore a suit, had a mustache, and was dark complected."

Mrs. Lindamood furnished the following itinerary of the tour with which her daughter is travelling:

July 1, Vaison La Romaine, France, Hotel Theatre, Romain.

July 2, Avignon, France, Hotel Louvre,
22 Rue Street, Agricol.

July 3, Aix En Provence, France, Hotel Relais,

[REDACTED] t L [REDACTED] Route 1 (Egypt Pike), Chillicothe, Ohio, on July 30, 1964, furnished the following information:

FOREIGN

She returned home the previous day, July 29, 1964, from a trip abroad. She had left the United States by air on June 24, 1964, from the Pan American Air Lines Terminal, John F. Kennedy Airport, New York, New York.

On the same evening that she departed from the United States and while at the Pan American Terminal she learned that Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy was there also with Mrs. Kennedy.

Because Mr. Kennedy was the center of interest and because of the crowds [REDACTED] [REDACTED] went upstairs to a balcony on one side of the terminal building so that she could photograph the Attorney General. From a point near the ladies restroom on this balcony and looking down into the terminal she had taken a photograph and turned away from the railing to adjust her camera when she bumped into a man. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who was looking down at her camera, first noticed that this man held a rifle in his right hand holding it close along side his right leg. Masking tape had been wrapped around the stock of this rifle from a point just back of the trigger to the rear end of the stock. Similar tape was wrapped around the forend grip and part of the barrel forward of the rear sight. This rifle of unknown caliber was equipped with opened iron sights.

[REDACTED] who has done considerable shooting with her father, knows the difference between rifles and shotguns and is sure this weapon was a rifle although she cannot describe it further.

The man with this rifle appeared startled as was [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Both stood regarding each other momentarily before he abruptly turned and walked very rapidly toward and through a

gate leading to the boarding area. He continued to hold the rifle close along his right leg and looked back a couple of times at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who just stood there. Neither he nor [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said anything and no one else in the group with which she was traveling saw him.

She never saw this man before or since and has no idea why he happened to be on the balcony at that time with a rifle.

She described the aforementioned man as follows:

On August 24, 1964, Mrs. WILLARD HILL, Democratic Committeewoman, 342 North Newberry Street, York Pa., advised as follows:

On Saturday evening, August 22, 1964, she was with her husband eating at the North York Bar and Grill, 1057 North George Street, York, Pa., at approximately 9:30 p.m. and overheard a political discussion concerning Attorney General ROBERT F. KENNEDY between two unknown individuals. At one point of the conversation, one of these men, later identified as WILLIAM W. STAMBAUGH, stated, "I'm one of JIMMY HOFFA's boys. If they don't have him in the bay before very long I personally will attend to it."

Mrs. HILL frequently eats at this grill on Saturday evenings as they specialize in southern fried chicken at fifty cents, and she did not recognize STAMBAUGH as a regular customer. She stated he was drinking beer at the time and from his actions and speech did not appear to be intoxicated.

MILLER DIEHL, bartender, North York Bar and Grill, advised on August 25, 1964, that she had overheard the above political discussion; however, he was unable to specifically recall any of the remarks which were made.

GLORIA BUCHTER, 1059 North Duke Street, York, Pa., advised on August 31, 1964, that she had overheard the above political discussion and recalled that one of them had made

the remark that what happened to ROBERT KENNEDY's brother should happen to him. Also, that if he, ROBERT KENNEDY, was not dead in four years he would see to it himself.

On September 5, 1964, WILLIAM W. STAMBAUGH furnished the following information:

He owns a tank truck which he uses to deliver products of the Atlantic Refining Company in York, Pa. The last few weeks he has been going to the North York Bar and Grill on Saturday evenings for fried chicken. He was there on August 22, 1964, and may have been discussing politics and it was possible he made some remarks concerning Attorney General KENNEDY. He stated that if he did make any remarks concerning Attorney General KENNEDY they were probably remarks that he had heard some place and was repeating. He stated he had been drinking on August 22, 1964, and was not too certain just what he had said.

Records of the York County Prison reflected the following concerning WILLIAM W. STAMBAUGH:

Committed December 17, 1953, on charge of assault and battery and surety of peace. Discharged December 17, 1953.

Committed November 18, 1954, on charge of assault and battery and surety of peace. Discharged November 18, 1954.

Committed February 2, 1956, on charge of surety of peace. Discharged February 3, 1956.

The complainant in all three cases was his wife, ANNA STAMBAUGH.

On September 8, 1964, Detective Sergeant RICHARD WASSER, York, Pa., Police Department advised that he has been acquainted with WILLIAM W. STAMBAUGH for the last twenty years. He stated he is a hard working individual whose only fault is that he drinks too much. After he has had a few drinks he starts to shoot his mouth off and gets very boastful. To the best of his knowledge the only times he has been arrested have been when he went home after drinking too much and started beating his wife. Then she would have him locked up until he was sober.

On 8/24/64 the facts as originally obtained were furnished to JACK GEISLER, Chief of Police, North York, Pa. On September 5, 1964, the identity of STAMBAUGH was furnished to GEISLER.

On August 24, 1964, the facts as originally obtained were furnished to Inspector LEONARD LANDIS, Detective Bureau, York Police Department. On September 8, 1964, the identity of STAMBAUGH was furnished to Detective Sergeant RICHARD WASSER, York Police Department. On September 21, 1964, Inspector LANDIS advised that he had the facts of the case and the identity of STAMBAUGH in his files.
