NOTICE TO RESPONDENT

THE COPY OF THIS ORDER SERVED UPON YOU IS EVIDENCE OF YOUR ALIEN REGISTRATION WHILE YOU ARE UNDER DEPORTATION PROCEEDINGS. THE LAW REQUIRES THAT IT BE CARRIED WITH YOU AT ALL TIMES

If you so choose, you may be represented in this proceeding, at no expense to the Government, by an attorney or other individual authorized and qualified to represent persons before the Immigration and Naturalization Service. You should bring with you any affidavits or other documents which you desire to have considered in connection with your case. If any document is in a foreign language, you should bring the original and certified translation thereof. If you wish to have the testimony of any witnesses considered, you should arrange to have such witnesses present at the hearing.

When you appear you may, if you wish, admit that the allegations contained in the Order to Show Cause are true and that you are deportable from the United States on the charges set forth therein. Such admission may constitute a waiver of a further hearing as to your deportability. If you do not admit that the allegations and charges are true, you will be given reasonable opportunity to present evidence on your own behalf, to examine the Government's evidence, and to cross-examine any witnesses presented by the Government.

You may apply at the hearing for voluntary departure in lieu of deportation. Moreover, if you appear to be eligible to acquire lawful permanent resident status the special inquiry office will explain this to you at the hearing and give you an opportunity to apply.

You will be asked during the hearing to select a country to which you choose to be deported in the event that your deportation is required by law. The special inquiry officer will also notify you concerning any other country or countries to which your deportation may be directed pursuant to law; and upon receipt of this information, you will have an opportunity to apply during the hearing for temporary withholding of deportation if you believe you would be subject to persecution in any such country on account of race, religion, or political opinion.

Failure to attend the hearing at the time and place designated hereon may result in your arrest and detention by the Immigration and Naturalization Service without further notice, or in a determination being made by the special inquiry officer in your absence.

REQUEST FOR PROMPT HEARING

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

THIS DEFENDANT ARRIVED IN NEW YORK CITY JANUARY 12, 1957 FROM THE ARABIC COUNTRY OF JORDAN, WITH HIS PARENTS. FOUR DAYS LATER HE CAME TO THIS STATE AND COUNTY AND HAS MAINTAINED RESIDENCE HERE SINCE THAT TIME. HE CARRIES ALIEN REGISTRATION CARD [REDACTED] CLASSIFICATION Y-14. HIS FATHER RETURNED TO JORDAN A SHORT TIME LATER AND APPARENTLY HAS NOT RETURNED TO THIS COUNTRY. THE MOTHER, A NURSERY SCHOOL EMPLOYEE, HAS REMAINED HERE AND HAS PROVIDED A HOME FOR THE DEFENDANT. DEFENDANT STATES THAT HE ORIGINALLY HAD TWELVE BROTHERS AND SISTERS BUT THAT ALL ARE NOW DECEASED EXCEPT DEFENDANT AND FOUR BROTHERS, ALL OF WHOM RESIDE IN PASADENA.

1 AS FAR AS IS KNOWN, THE ONLY OTHER MEMBER OF THE
2 FAMILY TO BE INVOLVED IN DIFFICULTY IS THE DEFENDANT'S 33-YEAR-OLD
3 BROTHER, SHARIS, WHO WAS ARRESTED DECEMBER 18, 1963 FOR ATTEMPTED
4 MURDER. AS A RESULT OF INVESTIGATION THE ~~DEFENDANT~~^{BROTHER} WAS FINALLY

1 BUT ADMITS OCCASIONAL DRINKING.

2 ARREST RECORD:

3 A CHECK WITH THE LOCAL IDENTIFICATION BUREAUS AND
4 THE CII DID NOT SHOW ANY PRIOR ARRESTS.

5 PRESENT OFFENSE:

6 DEFENDANT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY ABOUT 7:30 P. M.
7 ON THE NIGHT OF JUNE 10, 1966 BY STATE NARCOTIC OFFICERS AND THE
8 PASADENA POLICE DEPARTMENT. HE WAS BOOKED FOR INVESTIGATION OF
9 11530 AND 11531 HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE, BUT APPARENTLY POSTED BAIL
10 AFTER THREE DAYS IN CUSTODY. HE WAS CHARGED IN THE INFORMATION AS
11 SET FORTH ON PAGE ONE OF THIS REPORT. COUNT I ALLEGES THAT ON OR
12 ABOUT JUNE 10TH THE DEFENDANT VIOLATED SECTION 11530 HEALTH AND
13 SAFETY CODE BY BEING IN POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA. COUNT II ALLEGES
14 THAT ON THE SAME DATE THE DEFENDANT VIOLATED SECTION 11531 HEALTH
15 AND SAFETY CODE BY OFFERING TO SELL MARIJUANA. DEFENDANT PLEADED
16 NOT GUILTY. THE JURY WAS WAIVED AND MATTER SUBMITTED ON THE
17 PRELIMINARY TRANSCRIPT, AND ON OCTOBER 13, 1966 IN NORTHEAST B
18 SUPERIOR COURT BEFORE JUDGE WILLIAM FOX, HE WAS FOUND GUILTY AS
19 CHARGED ON BOTH COUNTS, MATTER BEING CONTINUED TO 2:00 P. M. ON
20 NOVEMBER 17, 1966 FOR PROBATION AND SENTENCE HEARING, DEFENDANT
21 PERMITTED TO REMAIN ON BAIL.

22 INASMUCH AS THERE HAS BEEN A TRAIL IN THIS MATTER,
23 THE COURT IS FAMILIAR WITH THE DETAILS. HOWEVER, FOR THE RECORD,
24 IT APPEARS THAT THE FOLLOWING IS SUBSTANTIALLY WHAT TOOK PLACE:
25 STATE NARCOTIC OFFICER, WILLIAM MILLER, WAS INTRODUCED TO THE
26 DEFENDANT BY INFORMANTS. THE DEFENDANT WAS TOLD THAT MILLER
27 WANTED TO BUY A CAN OF MARIJUANA, AND MILLER ASKED THE DEFENDANT
28 IF HE COULD "DO BETTER ON A CAN," AS THE PRICE WAS TOO HIGH.
29 DEFENDANT ALLEGEDLY STATED THAT "15 A CAN IS THE BEST I CAN DO."

1 THEN THE DEFENDANT WAS ASKED IF HE COULD DO BETTER ON QUANTITY,
2 THE DEFENDANT ALSO ALLEGEDLY STATED, "15 IS ALL I CAN DO." MILLER
3 THEN ASKED THE DEFENDANT ABOUT BUYING A KILO OF MARIJUANA, AT
4 WHICH THE DEFENDANT ALLEGEDLY STATED, "LEAF WEIGHT OR SEED WEIGHT?"
5 MILLER THEN ALLEGEDLY STATED, "LEAF WEIGHT," AND THE DEFENDANT
6 ALLEGEDLY STATED THAT HE WOULD SEE WHAT HE COULD DO. THE
7 DEFENDANT WAS THEN HANDED \$20 IN MARKED FUNDS FOR THE TWO CANS OF
8 MARIJUANA (A TEN DOLLAR BILL AND TWO FIVE DOLLAR BILLS), AND THE
9 DEFENDANT AT THIS POINT STATED THAT HE WOULD SEE HIS CONNECTION
10 AND DIRECTED MILLER AND THE OTHERS TO LAKE AND WALNUT TO WAIT FOR
11 HIM. THE GROUP DID THEN GO TO LAKE AND WALNUT DURING THE
12 DEFENDANT'S ABSENCE AND MILLER CONTACTED COVERING OFFICERS
13 ADVISING THEM OF WHAT HAD HAPPENED. AFTER MILLER RETURNED TO THE
14 CAR THE DEFENDANT AND ANOTHER PERSON, CARLOS ARTURO GONZALES-DEL
15 VALLE APPROACHED THE CAR. SIRHAN AND ANOTHER MAN THEN LEFT IN THE
16 CAR, SOON RETURNING AND THE CONVERSATION REGARDING THE PURCHASE OF
17 THE KILO OF MARIJUANA WAS RESUMED. (A KILO IS 2.2 POUNDS) THE
18 DEFENDANT THEN ASKED IF MILLER WERE STILL INTERESTED IN PURCHASING
19 A KILO, AND MILLER STATED THAT HE WAS. THE DEFENDANT ASKED WHAT
20 MILLER WAS WILLING TO PAY FOR IT, AT WHICH MILLER RESPONDED, "NAME
21 A PRICE." THE DEFENDANT STATED, "YOU NAME A PRICE." MILLER THEN
22 STATED, "HOW ABOUT A BILL?" (A BILL MEANS \$100 IN NARCOTIC JARGON.)
23 TO THIS THE DEFENDANT ALLEGEDLY STATED, "OH MAN, YOU'RE KIDDING."
24 OTHER OFFICERS THEN ARRIVED AND THE DEFENDANT WAS SEARCHED, AT
25 WHICH TIME HE WAS FOUND TO BE IN POSSESSION OF A QUANTITY OF LOOSE
26 MARIJUANA AND WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. HE WAS ALSO FOUND TO BE IN
27 POSSESSION OF SOME OF THE REGISTERED CURRENCY.

28 DEFENDANT'S STATEMENT:

29 THE DEFENDANT'S WRITTEN STATEMENT HAS NOT BEEN

1 RECEIVED AS OF DICTATION. VERBALLY, HE ADMITS THAT HE HAD TWO
2 MEETINGS WITH UNDERCOVER OFFICERS (THEIR IDENTITY UNKNOWN TO HIM
3 AT THE TIME), AND ALSO ADMITS DISCUSSING PRICE FOR "A CAN OF
4 SOMETHING." DEFENDANT STATES HE DOES NOT REALLY KNOW WHAT THE
5 SUBSTANCE WAS THAT HE WAS BARGAINING ABOUT. HE ALSO STATES THAT HE
6 WAS DOING THIS AS A FAVOR FOR A FRIEND AND DID NOT KNOW THAT HE
7 WAS BARGAINING TO DELIVER MARIJUANA. HE ADMITS THAT HE HAD
8 SEVERAL BAGS OF SOMETHING IN HIS POSSESSION BUT DID NOT KNOW THIS
9 WAS MARIJUANA. HE THEN STATES: " ABOUT JUNE 6, 1966 JOHN OHANIA,
10 "ROD", AND "JERRY" APPROACHED ME. I HAVE BEEN ACQUAINTED WITH
11 THEM FOR YEARS BUT HAVE HAD NO DEALINGS OF ANY KIND WITH THEM.
12 JOHN SAID, "I WANT YOU TO GET ME SOME MARIJUANA." HE SAID THERE
13 SHOULD BE SOME MONEY IN IT FOR ME. I NEEDED MONEY AT THAT TIME.
14 JOHN SAID THAT JERRY NEEDED SOME MARIJUANA, BUT I DECLINED TO GO
15 ALONG WITH THIS. BUT JOHN SAID ANYWAY, "YOU GO TO CARLOS AND GET
16 SOMETHING THAT LOOKS LIKE MARIJUANA. I SAID I NEEDED \$15, BUT
17 I DON'T KNOW WHY THEY DIDN'T JUST GET THE MARIJUANA THEMSELVES
18 WITHOUT ME GETTING INTO THE PICTURE. BUT I DID AGREE TO GET THIS
19 STUFF FOR THEM. I MET JOHN TWICE AND HE GAVE ME \$10 TO HELP OUT
20 A FRIEND OF MINE. JOHN SAID TO MEET HIM A FEW NIGHTS LATER. I DID
21 HAVE A MEETING THEN WITH THIS MAN MILLER AND THE OTHERS. MILLER
22 SAID, "HOW MUCH A CAN?" I SAID \$15." THIS WAS FOR SOMETHING WHICH
23 "LOOKED LIKE MARIJUANA." JOHN SAID THE PRICE WAS \$20 AND MILLER
24 GAVE ME \$20 AND I AGREED TO MEET THEM LATER THAT SAME NIGHT. THEN
25 I WENT AND MET CARLOS LIKE JOHN TOLD ME TO. I GAVE CARLOS \$15 AT
26 A POOL HALL AND THEN CARLOS AND I WENT TO LAKE AND WALNUT AND MET
27 THE OTHER GUYS. THEN CARLOS AND JOHN AND I DROVE TO ANOTHER PLACE
28 AND CARLOS GOT OUT AND RETURNED WITH SOMETHING UNDER HIS SHIRT.
29 JOHN SAID, "HAVE YOU GOT IT?" CARLOS SAID "YES." THEN HE DROVE TO

1 ANOTHER LOCATION WHERE CARLOS AND I GOT OUT AND CARLOS GAVE ME
2 THREE BAGS. HE TOLD ME TO PUT THEM UNDER MY SHIRT AND I DID.
3 THEN THE THREE OF US LEFT. JOHN LET CARLOS OFF AT THE POOL HALL
4 AND WE RETURNED TO THE OTHER GUYS, AND THEN THE OFFICERS CAME UP
5 WITH GUNS AND HELD US UP AND SEARCHED ME AND FOUND THE BAGS. BUT
6 THEY ONLY ARRESTED ME. LATER CHRIS AND CARLOS WERE ARRESTED BUT
7 THEY WEREN'T PROSECUTED. IF I AM GUILTY, I AM SORRY, AND I HOPE
8 I NEVER GET INTO THIS SORT OF THING AGAIN. BUT I DIDN'T REALLY
9 KNOW THIS WAS MARIJUANA. THIS WAS THE FIRST TIME. I'VE NEVER DONE
10 THIS BEFORE OR SINCE. MY FAMILY IS DISGUSTED WITH ME."

11 INTERESTED PARTIES:

12 PASADENA POLICE DEPARTMENT DETECTIVE VAN DOWNIE
13 REPORTS, IN EFFECT: "THIS PRESENT CONVICTION CONCERNS A "BUY" OF
14 TWO CANS OF MARIJUANA. BUT WE KNOW OF ANOTHER CASE WHERE SIRHAN
15 PREVIOUSLY SOLD THREE CANS OF MARIJUANA FOR \$45. BUT THE WITNESS
16 WAS AFRAID TO TESTIFY IN THE MATTER SO WE HAD TO DROP IT. THIS
17 MAN IS NO GOOD. HE IS DEALING IN BULK QUANTITIES. EACH CAN OF
18 MARIJUANA WILL PRODUCE 25 TO 30 CIGARETTES. THERE MAY BE OTHERS
19 INVOLVED IN THIS OPERATION TOO, BUT THERE HAS NOT BEEN ENOUGH
20 EVIDENCE TO PROSECUTE ANY OF THE OTHERS YET. BUT SIRHAN IS STILL
21 ASSOCIATING WITH THESE UNDESIRABLE CHARACTERS. SIRHAN IS A SELLER.
22 HE KNOWS WHERE TO GET THE STUFF AND THEN SELLS IT. WE BELIEVE THAT
23 THE POSSIBILITY OF DEPORTATION FOR THIS FELLOW BACK TO JORDAN
24 SHOULD BE INVESTIGATED."

25 MR. LINDSEY OF THE FEDERAL IMMIGRATION BUREAU IN
26 LOS ANGELES HAS BEEN CONTACTED AND ADVISED CONCERNING THE MATTER.
27 HE VERIFIES THE DEFENDANT'S ALIEN REGISTRATION NUMBER AND THE DATE
28 OF HIS ADMISSION TO THIS COUNTRY AND HIS BIRTH IN JERUSALEM, JORDAN.
29 MR. LINDSEY FURTHER STATES, IN EFFECT: " HIS PRESENT CONVICTIONS DO

CONSTITUTE DEPORTABLE OFFENSES. WE WILL CONTACT SIRHAN AND PREPARE OUR DOCUMENTS TOWARD A POSSIBLE HEARING TOWARD DEPORTATION. HE MAY OR MAY NOT BE DEPORTED. THIS IS UP TO THE HEARING OFFICER. WE WOULD GO AHEAD AND PROCESS THE CASE WHETHER HE IS COMMITTED TO STATE PRISON OR NOT."

A LENGTHY TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WAS HAD WITH THE DEFENDANT'S MOTHER, WHO IS QUITE PROTECTIVE. SHE DENIES THAT HE IS INVOLVED IN ANYTHING ILLEGAL WHATSOEVER, AND REFUTES THE COURT CONVICTION. SHE STATES IN PART, "THIS WAS ALL FOOLISHNESS ON HIS PART. IT MIGHT HAVE BEEN ASSOCIATIONS HE HAD. THE POLICE ARE LIARS. HE DIDN'T MEAN IT."

EVALUATION:

ACCORDING TO THE POLICE, THE DEFENDANT IS KNOWN TO HAVE MADE A PREVIOUS SALE OF NARCOTICS IN A LARGER QUANTITY THAN THAT INVOLVED IN THE PRESENT OFFENSE. HOWEVER, THEY STATE THAT THE WITNESS WAS AFRAID TO TESTIFY SO THE MATTER HAD TO BE DROPPED. INFORMATION IN THIS CASE INDICATES THAT THE DEFENDANT ^{the} IS ONE WHO DID THE NEGOTIATING, OBTAINED THE NARCOTICS AND PRESENTED SAME FOR SALE. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS IS BEST ABLE TO PROVIDE A PROGRAM FOR HIM, AND IT IS ALSO BELIEVED THAT THE IMMIGRATION OFFICE SHOULD TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION IN THIS CASE. CONSEQUENTLY THE FOLLOWING RECOMMENDATION IS MADE:

RECOMMENDATION:

IT IS, THEREFORE, RESPECTFULLY RECOMMENDED THAT PROBATION BE DENIED.

Dear Congressman Smith:

Mrs. Mary B. Sirhan, who resides in your Congressional District at 696 East Howard Street, Pasadena, California 91104, has asked me to write to you on behalf of her son, Munir B. Sirhan.

Apparently her son, Munir Sirhan, has been convicted of possession of marijuana and is presently serving one year in county jail as a condition of probation. He has been notified that deportation proceedings will be brought against him because of his conviction.

Upon looking into the situation for her, I was unable to find any provision for administrative discretion or waiver of conviction such as would apply to persons convicted of less serious crimes (?) such as bank robbery, rape, etc. It is my understanding that the only recourse to prevent a deportation order is by means of a special bill or a presidential pardon.

In requesting you to sponsor a special bill, she wishes you to consider the following matters:

(1) The members of the family were refugees from Israeli aggression. They fled their native country of TransJordan, and entered the United States under Jordanian passports though they had never lived in Jordan, but had no other country to call home.

(2) When the family entered the United States in 1956, Munir was only eight years old. He has never known any other country as a home, and, indeed, the country of his rightful citizenship no longer exists. If deported he could only be sent to a country foreign to him.

(3) Munir does not speak any language except English, and all of his relatives and friends are in the United States. If he were to be sent to a foreign country, he would be banished in every practical sense just as though he were a native born citizen of the United States.



(4) Munir must pay for his mistake, but without detracting from the seriousness of the offense, it should be noted that circumstances of the offense indicated he was being used as a pawn by other persons. A punishment of one year in jail is severe enough without adding to it exile from the country which is in fact, if not technically, his home.

(5) The judge who sentenced Munir must have felt that he had rehabilitation potential and that he could become a good member of the community -- otherwise he would not have been granted probation.

Mrs. Sirhan would write to you herself, but she is afraid that you might not understand her English well enough to answer her requests and prayers. On behalf of Mrs. Sirhan, I therefore ask you to make this matter one of personal interest and concern.

This refers to your letter of January 27, 1967 concerning the
immigration case of Mr. Muir D. Sirhan to whom our file
relates.

On July 11, 1967 the Special Inquiry Officer entered his
decision finding Mr. Sirhan deportable on the charge contained in
the Order to Show Cause, to-wit:

Section 241(a)(1), Immigration and Nationality Act,
as amended, convicted of violation of law relating;
to illicit possession of marijuana (Section 21530,
Health & Safety Code, State of California).

He further determined that the respondent is ineligible for any form
of discretionary relief from deportation and ordered his deportation
to Jordan.

On July 24, 1967 the Attorney filed a Motion with the Special
Inquiry Officer to vacate the decision and for reconsideration of his
order, based on certain technicalities involving the interpretation
of proceedings in the Superior Court, State of California, relating
to the vacating of a final judgment of conviction more than six
months after the judgment of conviction was entered, with no inter-
vening appeal, writ of Error Coram Nobis, or Motion to set aside the
judgment. The Special Inquiry Officer has not yet acted upon this
motion.

Mr. Sirhan was released from the County Jail on August 2, 1967,
after having completed his period of confinement arising out of the
conviction cited above, and was released by this Service under an
Order of Release on Recognizance, pending final action in the deporta-
tion proceedings. He is required to report to this Service in person
