Dear Sir: This letter of January 27, 1967 concerning the San Francisco case of Mr. Mario E. Siskin to whom was filed AIR MAIL 120.

On July 24, 1967 the Special Inquiry Officer entered his decision finding Mr. Siskin deportable on the charge contained in the order of the Court, namely:

Section 552(b)(1), Deportation and Nationality Act,  
as amended, conviction of violation of law relating  
to the possession of marijuana (Section 11330,  
Health & Safety Code, State of California).

It further provided that the respondent is inadmissible for any form  
of discretionary relief from deportation and ordered his deportation  
to Jordan.

On July 24, 1967 the Attorney filed a Motion with the Special  
Inquiry Officer to vacate the decision and for reconsideration of his  
order, based on certain technicalities involving the interpretation  
of provisions in the Superior Court, State of California, relating  
to the granting of a final judgment of conviction more than six  
months after the judgment of conviction was entered, with no inter-  
vening appeal, writ of error coram nobis, or Motion to set aside the  
judgment. The Special Inquiry Officer has not yet acted upon this  
motion.

Mr. Siskin was released from the County Jail on August 2, 1967,  
after having completed his period of confinement arising out of the  
conviction cited above, and was released by this Service under an  
Order of Release on Recognizance, pending final action in the depor-  
tation proceedings. He is required to report to this Service in person  
each month under the order of recognizance.
