And when he stuck the gun, he looked like 1 he was on his tiptoes because he wasn't that tall. Mr. Wecker is quite huge, and he tried to get Mr. Wecker out of the way, and he shot him. Ą. How close to the Senator were you at the Q 5 time of the first shor? 6 The same amount of distance, five feet. 7 And how many shots were fired? 8 I heard five distinct shots. I could swear 9 to five, but --10 Could there have been more? 11 There could have been. I don't know if the 12 confusion -- I was standing behind there -- the next thing 13 I knew, I had blood all over my face and my glasses. 14 And then the man that got shot in the head 15 fell in my arms. 16 And then the other boy that got shot in the 17 thigh, he fell on top of me, and they pushed me down, they 18 fell on top of me. 19 Did you see what happened to the Senator before 20 you went down? 21 He was on his way, falling -- he was falling 22 down. 23 The first shot, he kind of reared back very, 24 very sharply. 25 Did you see any movement of the Senator's Q 26

arms after the first shot? Both hands went up like that (indicating). 2 He was kind of on an angle. He was just 3 about to shake hands. The Senator was? Q The Senator was. And he got pushed back, and both hands went back like that (indicating). 8 You indicated that both hands ---Went up, they both went up. 10 And is that all that you saw of what had 11 occurred because of the other two people being wounded 12 in your proximity? 13 Yes, sir. 14 You say someone was shot in the head. 15 you know that person by name? 16 No, sir. According to the papers, the 17 first name is Paul. I don't know his last name. 18 You wouldn't know it? Would you describe 19 him by size? Did he appear to be quite large? 20 Yes, sir, he was, and --21 MR. HOWARD: May I approach the witness --22 THE FOREMAN: Go right ahead. 23 MR. HOWARD: -- Mr. Foreman? May we mark, with the 24 Foreman's permission, as Grand Jury Exhibit 9, a photograph of a patient in the hospital? 26
