Two-thirds of Landlocked Hungary lies at an altitude of less than 650 feet. Silty soil has attracted farmers, but the gentle terrain has also lured conquerors to this natural battleground. In A.D. 895 the Magyars came, a band of tough nomads from the Ural

Mountains, who stubbornly held the land against successive waves of later invaders. Since Russian troops arrived in World War II, Commu-



nism has ruled Hungary. The latest invaders are all tourists—six million a year—who sample spas, Gypsy music, fine food, and Tokay wine.


