SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

The vessel which takes the drugs to Bahia Mar is sleek, smooth looking, beige/cream colored and 38-40 feet long. The original pick-up craft was bigger, (longer and wider) more squared off, white with a square covered area in the back "like" (A/S) a porch (ADL BK: Chriscraft). On the final vessel (the Bertram) were two women in bikinis and a man in his mid-forties with thick, sun-bleached blonde hair. He is a wealthy "week-end" boater. This vessel was not gone from its dock for long. The boat returns with the drugs during a very busy time -- early evening on a weekend. There is a lot of boat traffic--mobs of boats heading in. The drugs are concealed in the front of the boat close to the base of the hull. They are under a sheet of something gray in color with rust stains. This fits into place snugly in a down and forward motion. On top of it are smelly, wet gear bags. See sketch page 5.

The boat's assigned/permanent docking space is on the east side of a pier that lies in a direction that is parallel to the main highway in front of Bahia Mar. See sketch page 7. The dock is well set to the back quite a distance from that highway. The name of the ship seems to be in three parts and is written on the back in a rainbow/ arc shape.
