1. (U) Personnel:

- PAG-TA continues to have three civilian vacancies (two long-standing and one resulting from retirement in June 93). Our authorized strength remains at 10 with seven assigned civilian personnel.
- No change in status on our submission for civilian hire to conduct foreign assessments.

2. (U) Administration:

- Game plan update for move to Building 2845. Cost estimates from Fort Meade's Directorate of Public Works forwarded to DAL-2 for action on 30 Nov 93 with info copies to PAG and DAC-2. DIA action on the cost estimate was held up due to recent current Congressional Resolution. With the lifting of the CR, action is now underway for DAL to MIPR funds to Fort Meade's Directorate of Public works to redo the floor in Room 111 and to install the authorized door for SCI storage. DAC-2 will be our focal point for upgrading Room 111 for
